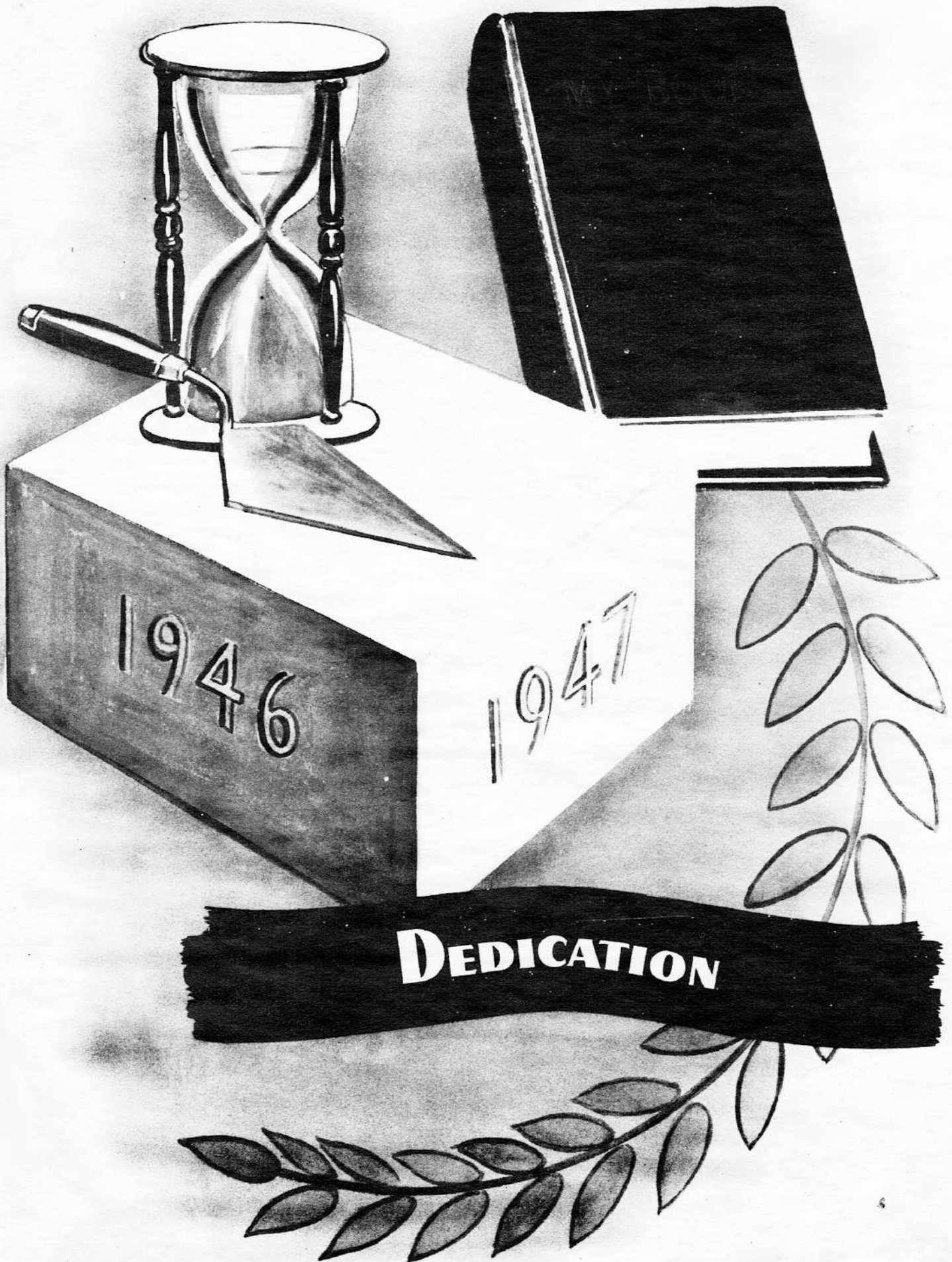

Her subjects this year are: Algebra I., English I, II, and IV., General Math., and Geometry.





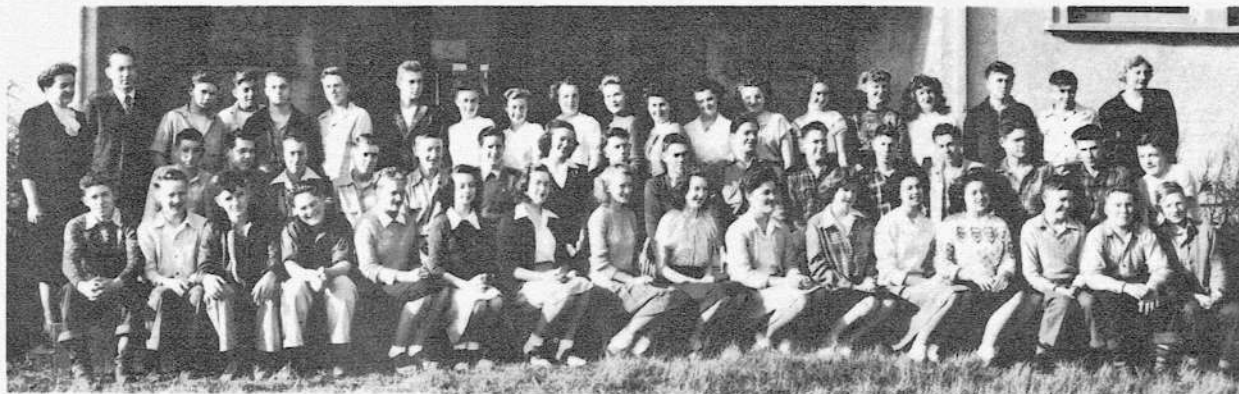

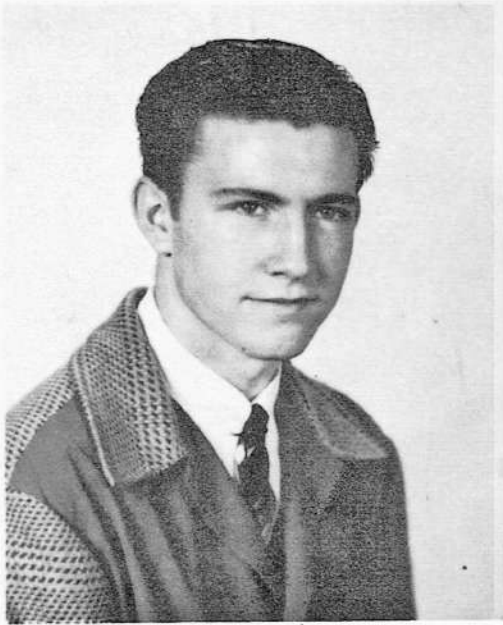
One of the seniors; Marvin Coburn, holds the honored position of STUDENT BODY PRESIDENT.

SOPHOMORE CLASS

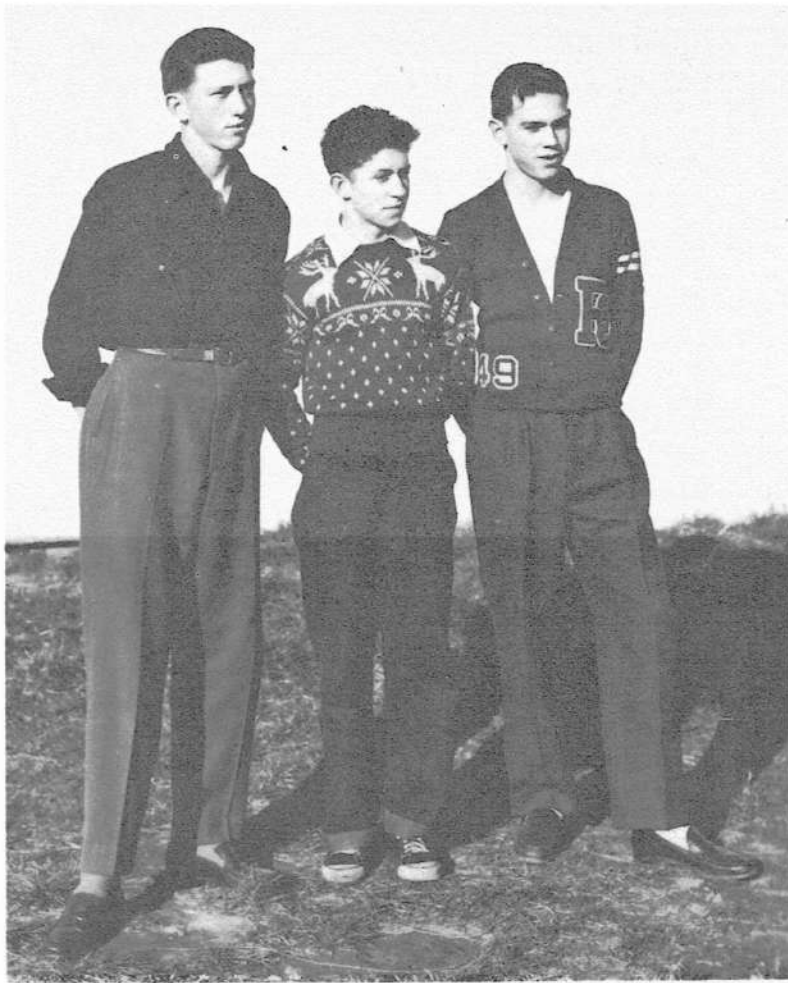

Being one of the largest classes in the school, they have extensive plans for their remaining years in good old Port Orford High.



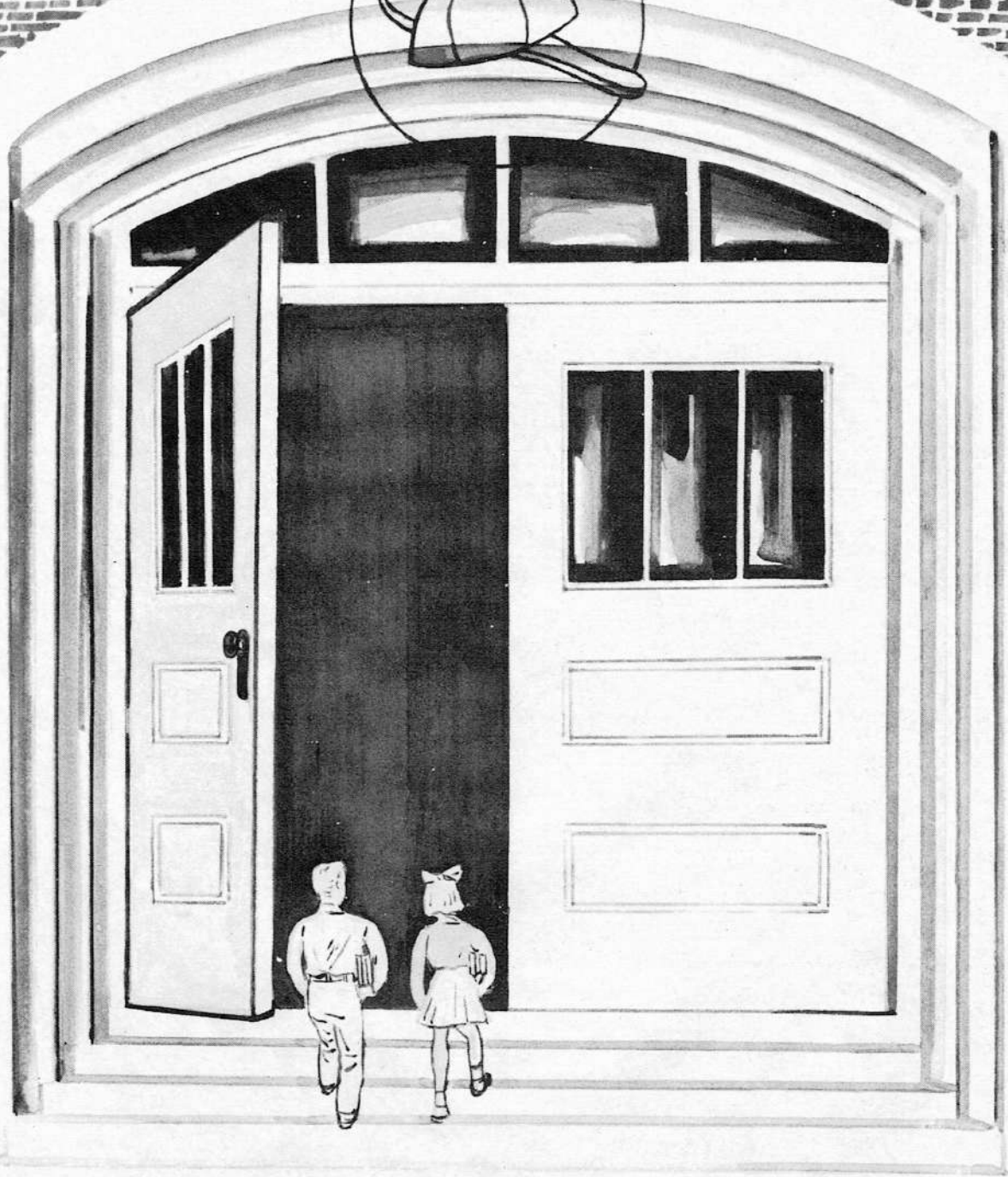
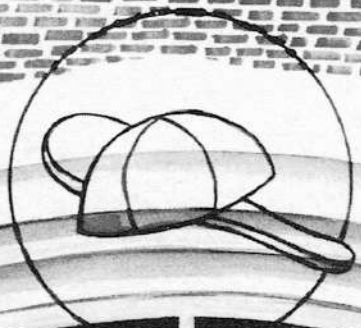

After a joint session of the county coaches, two of the members, Jack Smith and Blaine Marsh, were chosen as forward and guard of the all-tournament team.



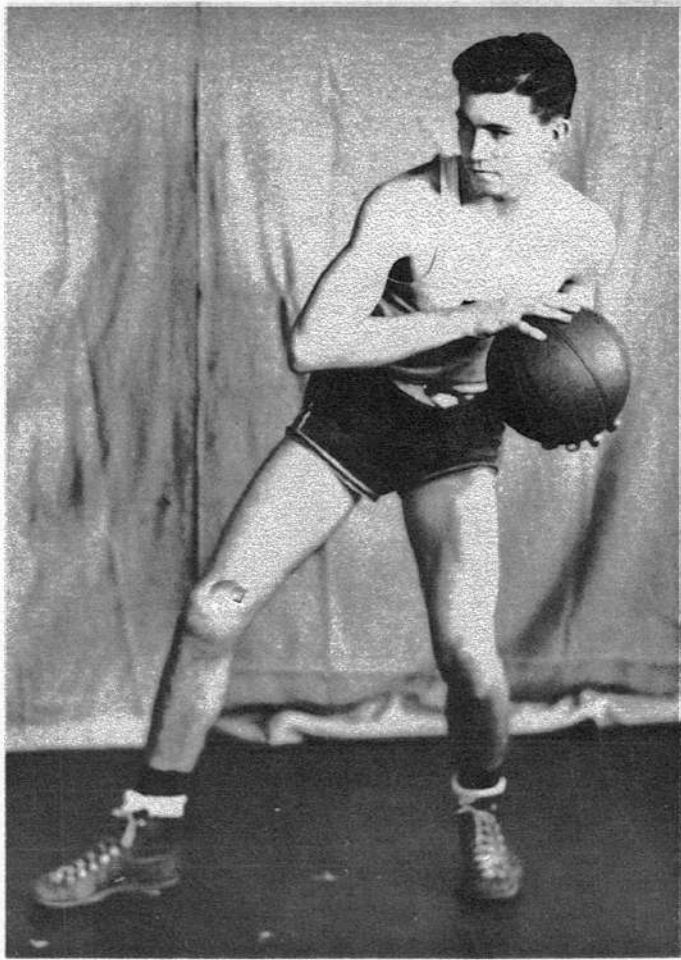
