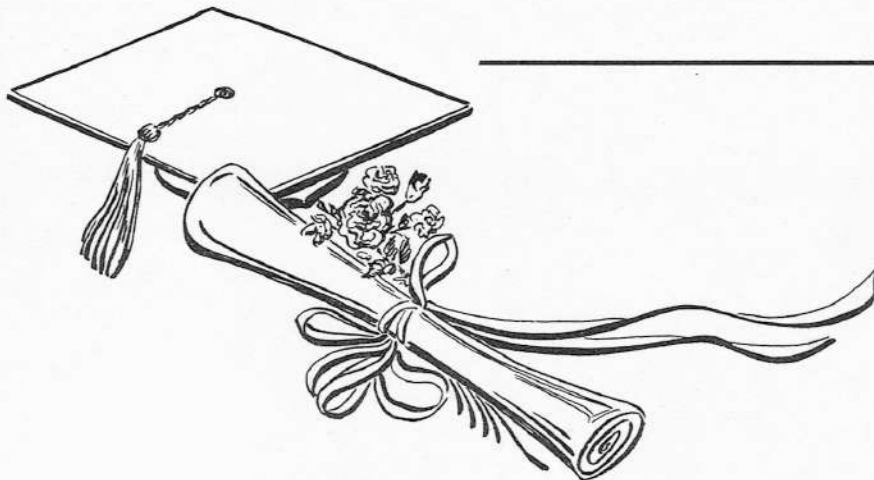
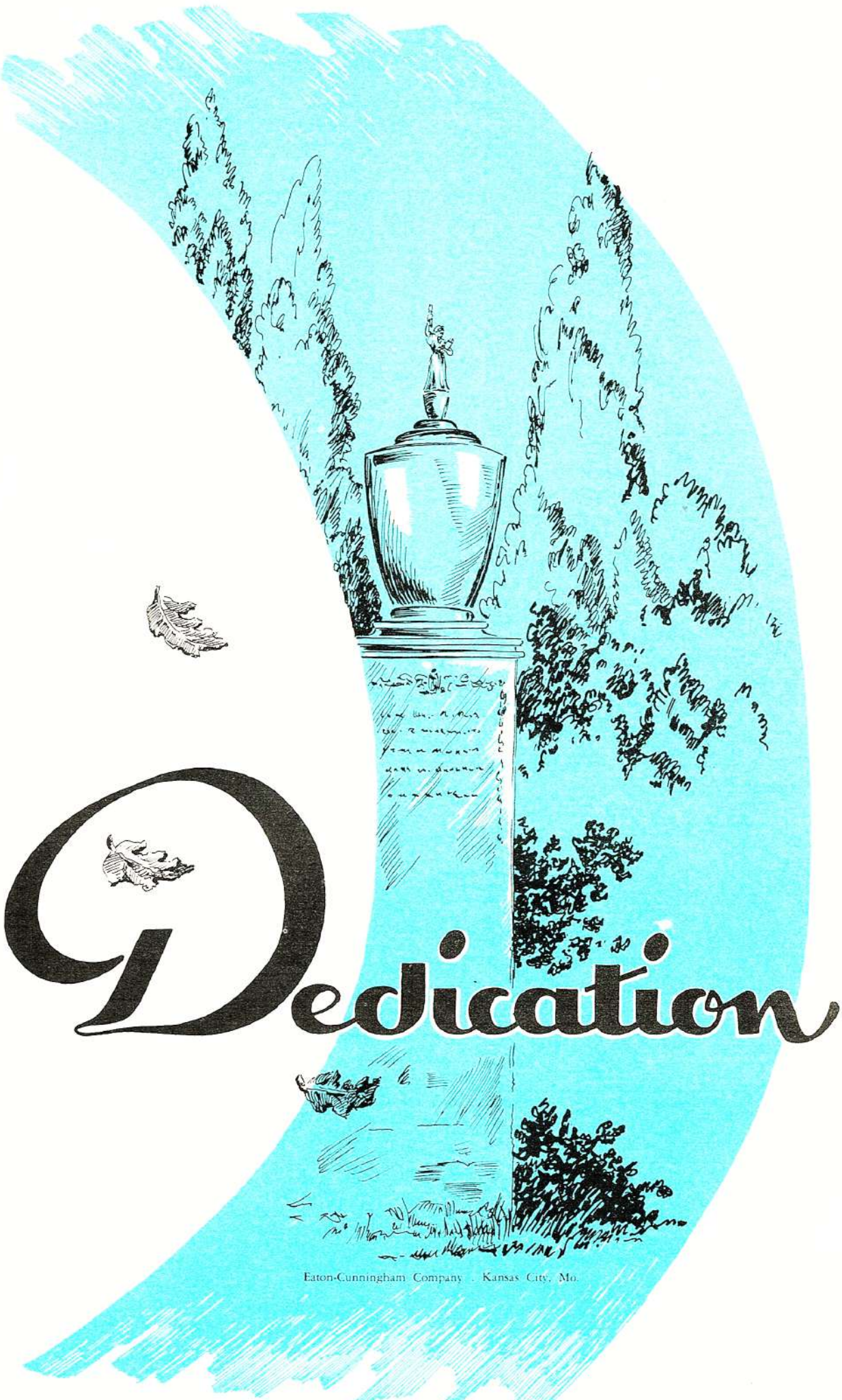

Mrs. Masterson has a Bachelor of Arts Degree from the University of Oregon.

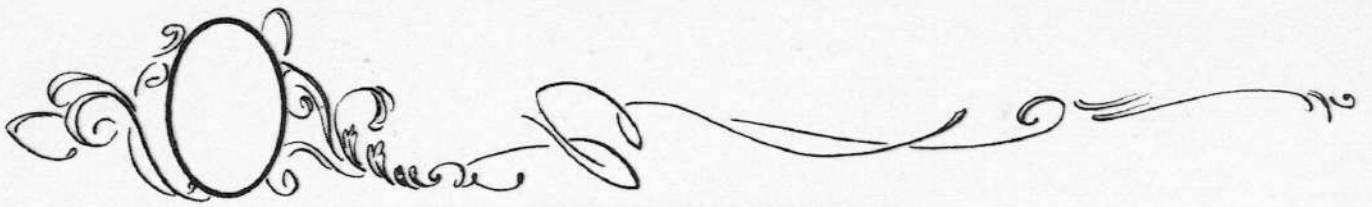
Her subjects this year are: Higher Mathematics, General Math, Algebra I, and English IV.

During the year the sophomores sold pop and candy at several of the basketball games, netting quite a profit.

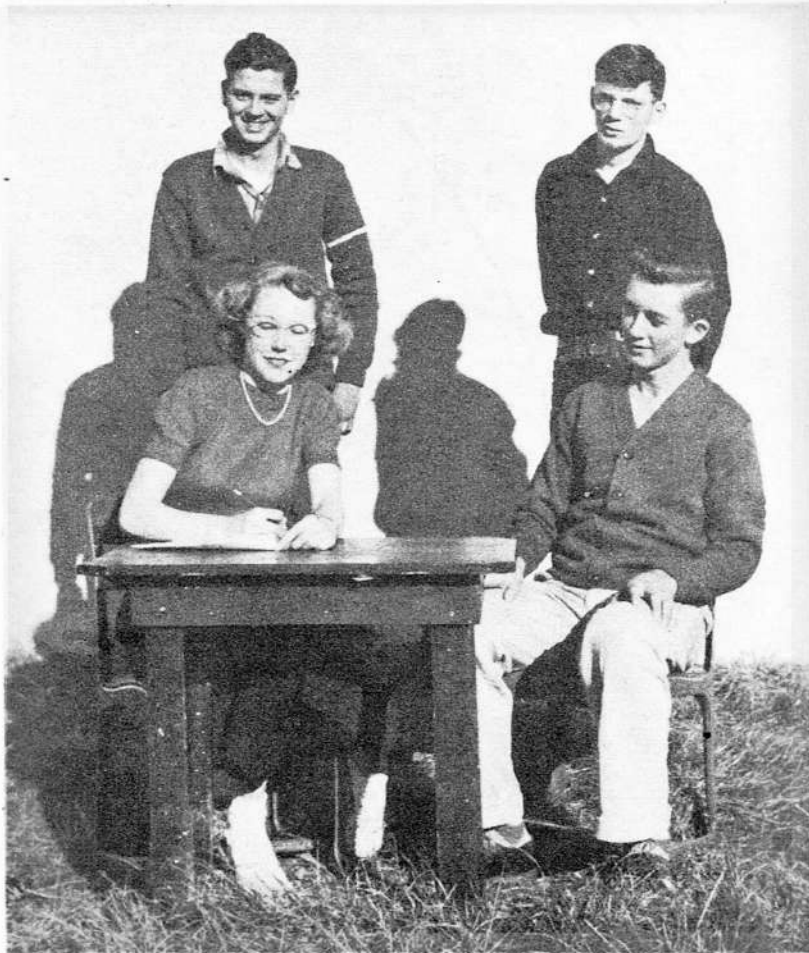
As a whole the sophomore year was a very prosperous one.

## *Freshman Class*

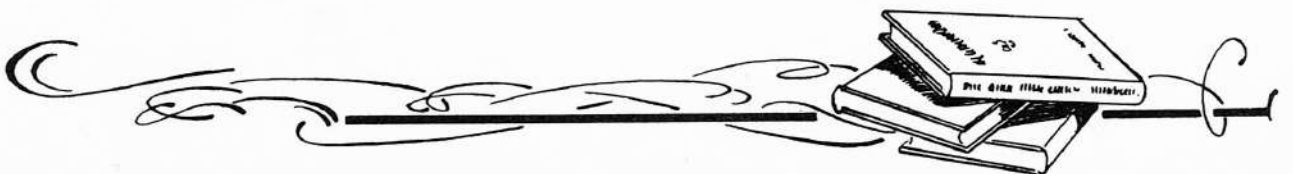
On a warm September day, seventeen scared but proud freshmen wandered into the big building of Port Orford High. At least it looked big to them.

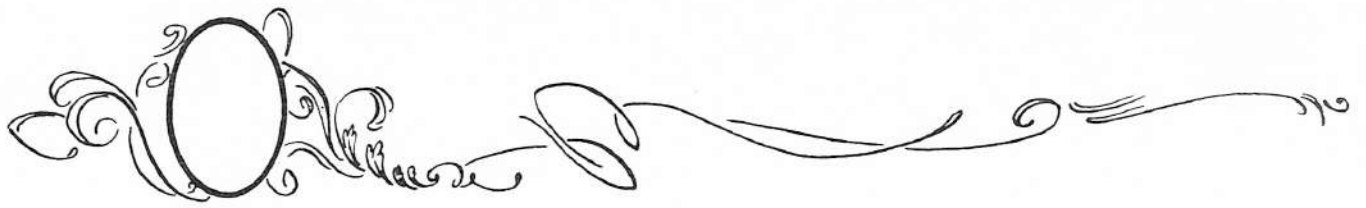

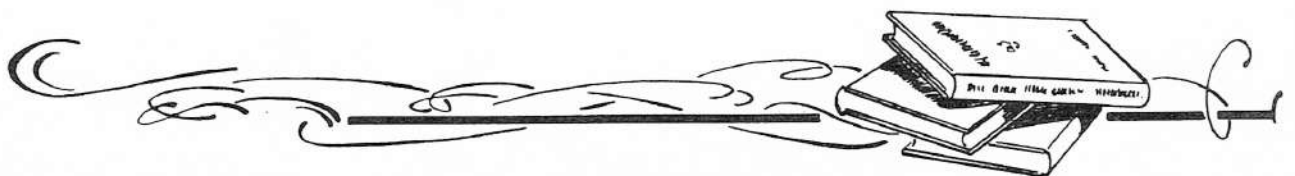

The next project was a vaudeville show in which just about all the students in school took part. The show consisted of musicals, dances, singing, magical tricks, and many other features.

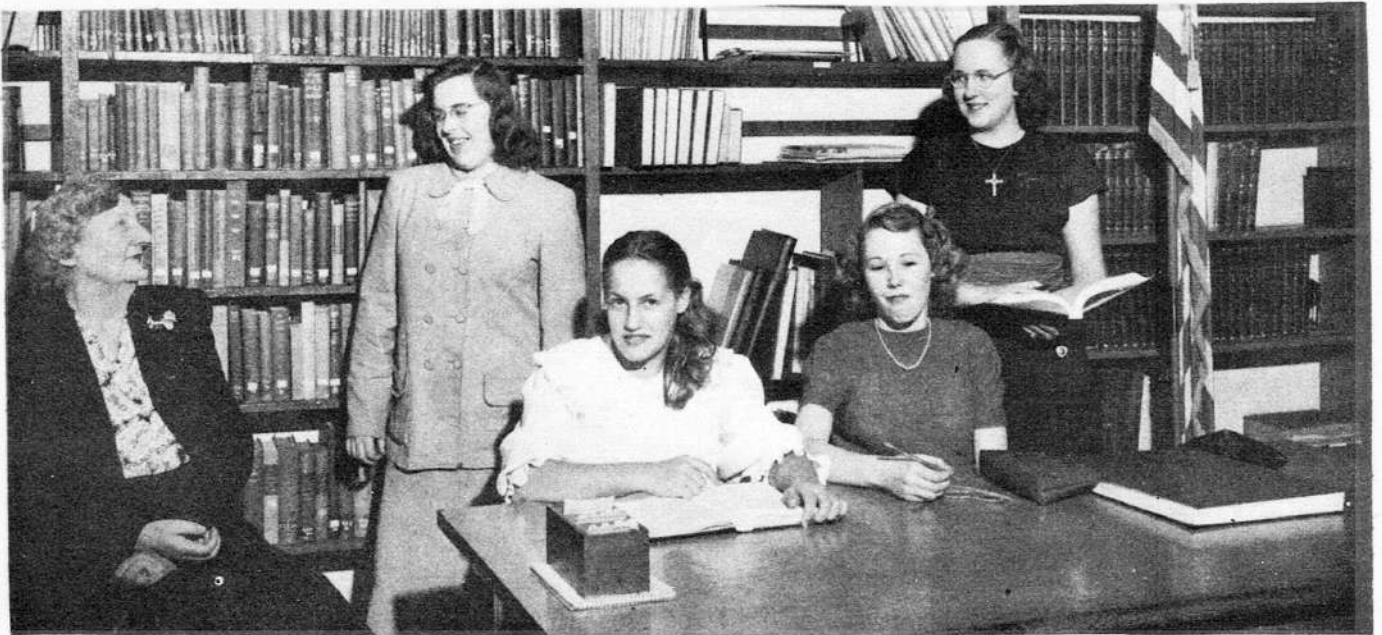
The members of the club feel greatly indebted to Mrs. Knapp for her kind co-operation and knowing supervision.



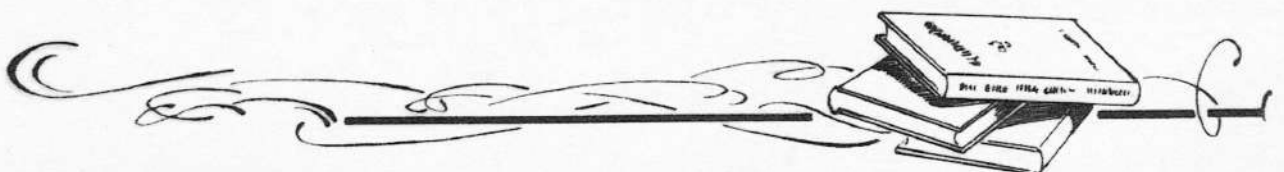

Phil St. George, Pirate Pitcher, led them to second place in the first year of Curry County baseball. With American Legion Baseball experience he got the name of being one of the best pitchers in the league, if not the best. Phil would never blow up in tight games, and if the Pirates faltered, he would be the first one to pep them up. He averages a little over nine strikeouts a game, which is very good for a high school pitcher.

Another Pirate star last year was Tommy Nash, rated as one of the top catchers of the league, who had a large part in the Pirate victories. Tom seldom missed a pitched ball and when he did it would have taken an exceptional catcher to catch it. Tom ended up with a batting average of .318.





# Baseball

Last year baseball entered into the limelight of all the high schools in Curry County. A league was set up and a schedule was drawn. The diamond was leveled, suits were purchased and all Port Orford got the "bug" for the play ball signal.

Although there were only four out of the first nine that knew the fundamentals of the game, that was all Mr. Kampa needed. After holding only four practices, the Pirates, behind the able pitching of Phil St. George, held a more experienced Gold Beach squad to ten innings, then faltered to lose 7 to 6. The next game was a different story as the Pirates swamped Langlois 29 to 4. Port Orford won back the loss that Gold Beach gave them in their first game as they sent the Panthers home with their tails between their legs and their first conference loss on the short end of a 12 to 6 rout. Then, as the Pirates were all tied up in the league with Gold Beach, Brookings handed them their second loss of the season, their first on their home field, As the Bruins upset the Pirates 10 to 8 in a close game. The loss gave Gold Beach the crown of the season and dropped Port Orford to second slot.
