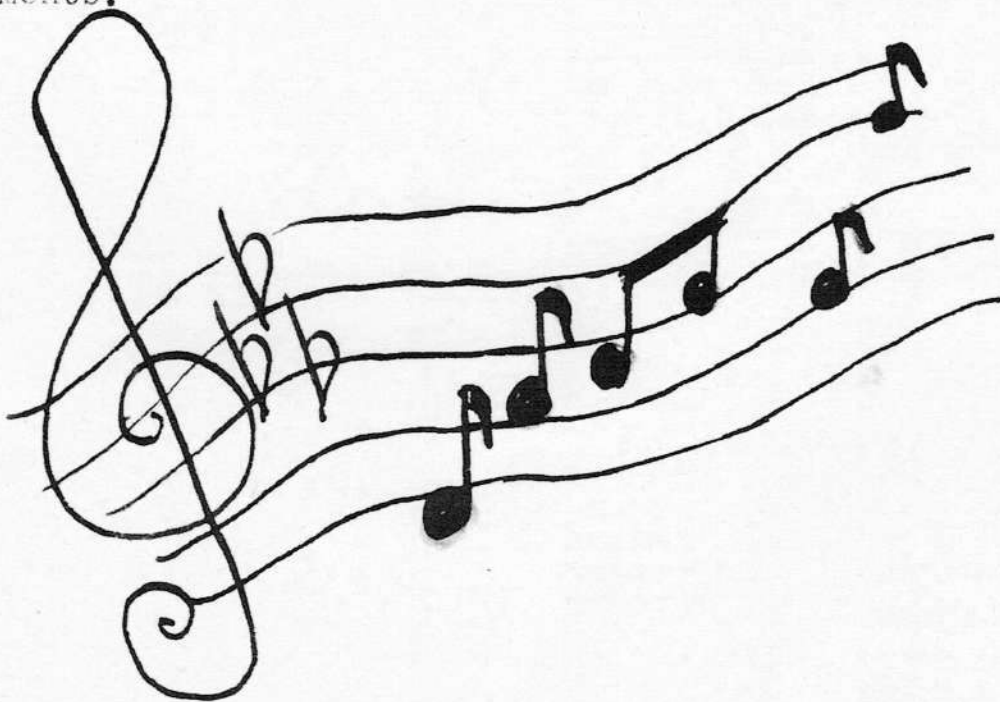


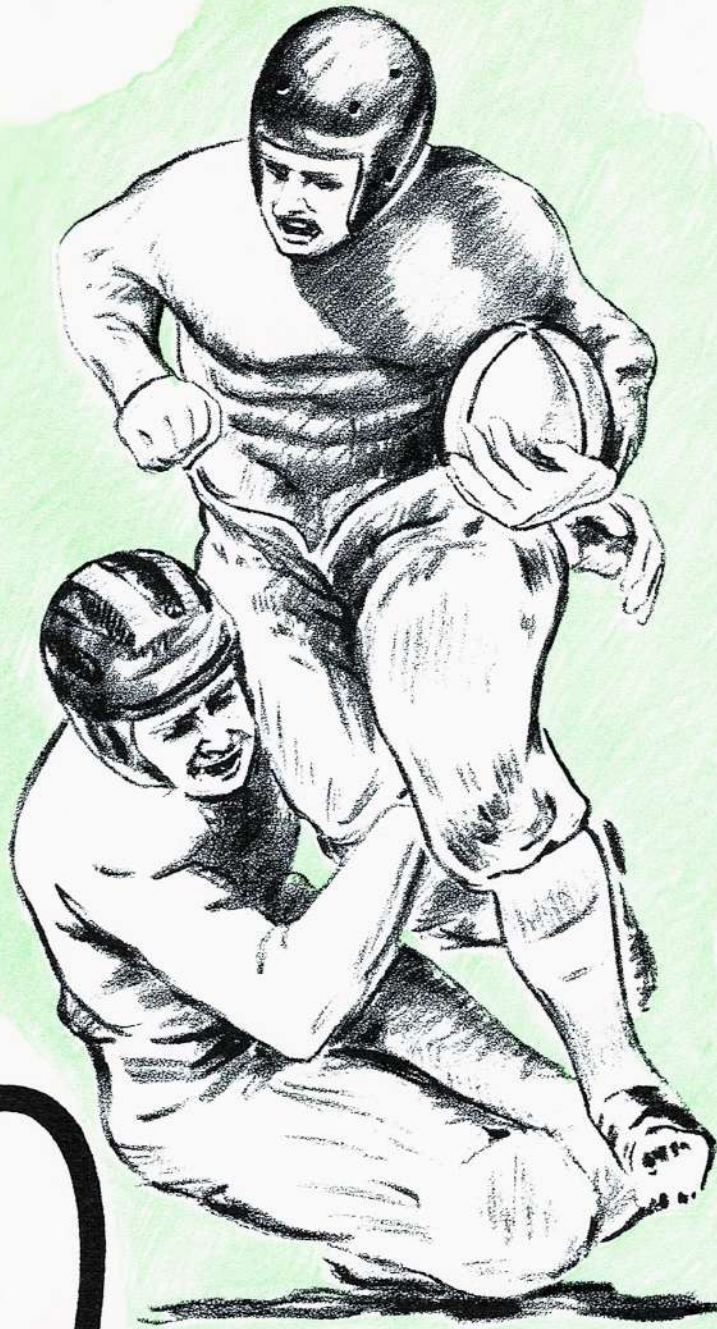
### THE PORT ORFORD SCHOOL BAND

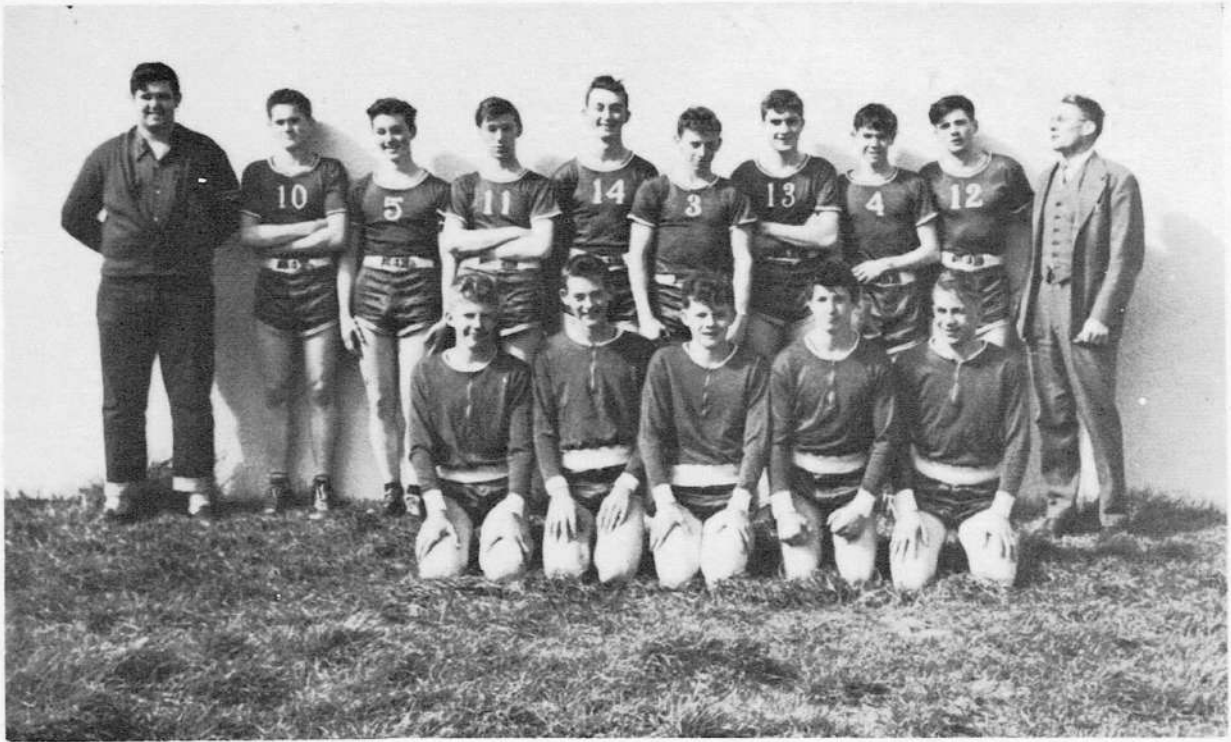
A benefit dance was given for the band to raise funds to enable the students to buy instruments.
