So from our Saltwater Preeminence we greet you and wish you, both now and in the future, all the blessing of our American heritage of independence, initiative, and faith in God and man.



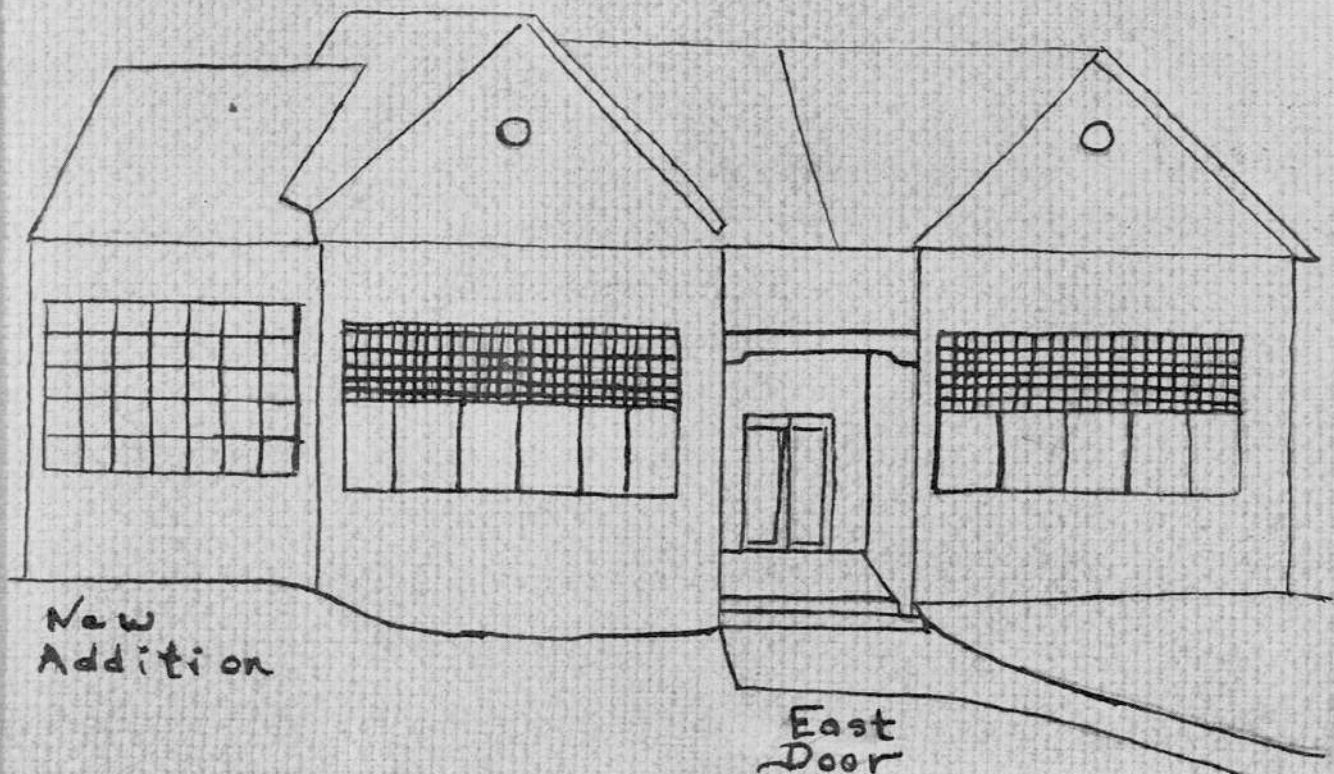

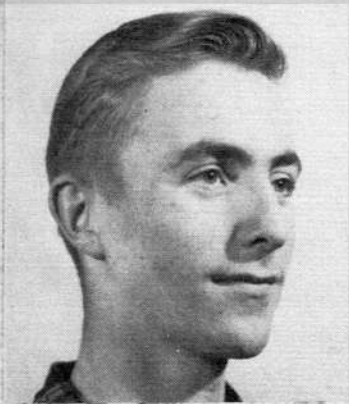
The year was filled with activity for the Juniors including the Junior-Senior Banquet and the Junior Senior Prom.

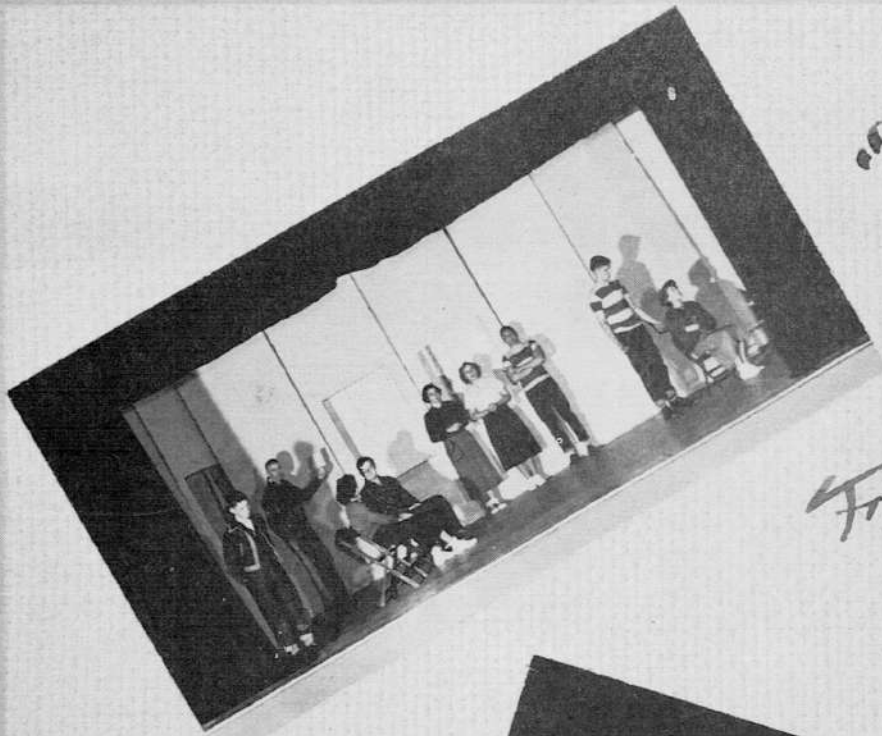
"Uncle Fred Flits By"

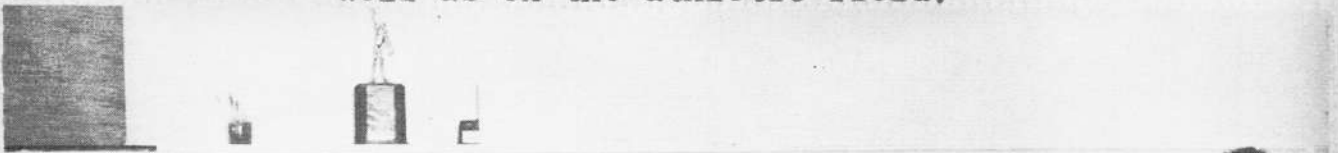

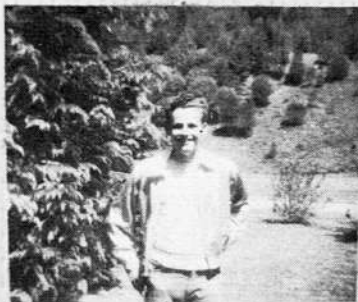
