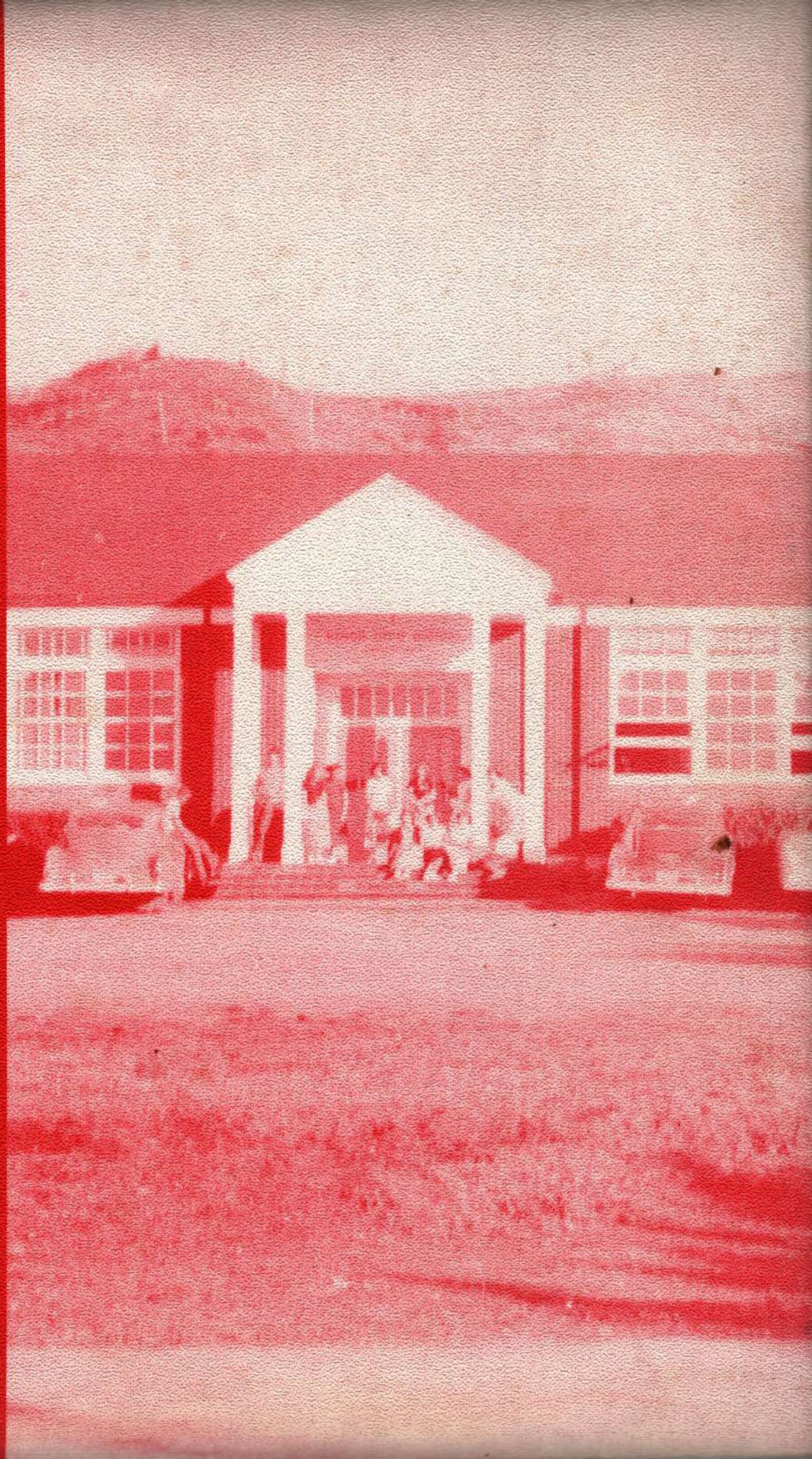
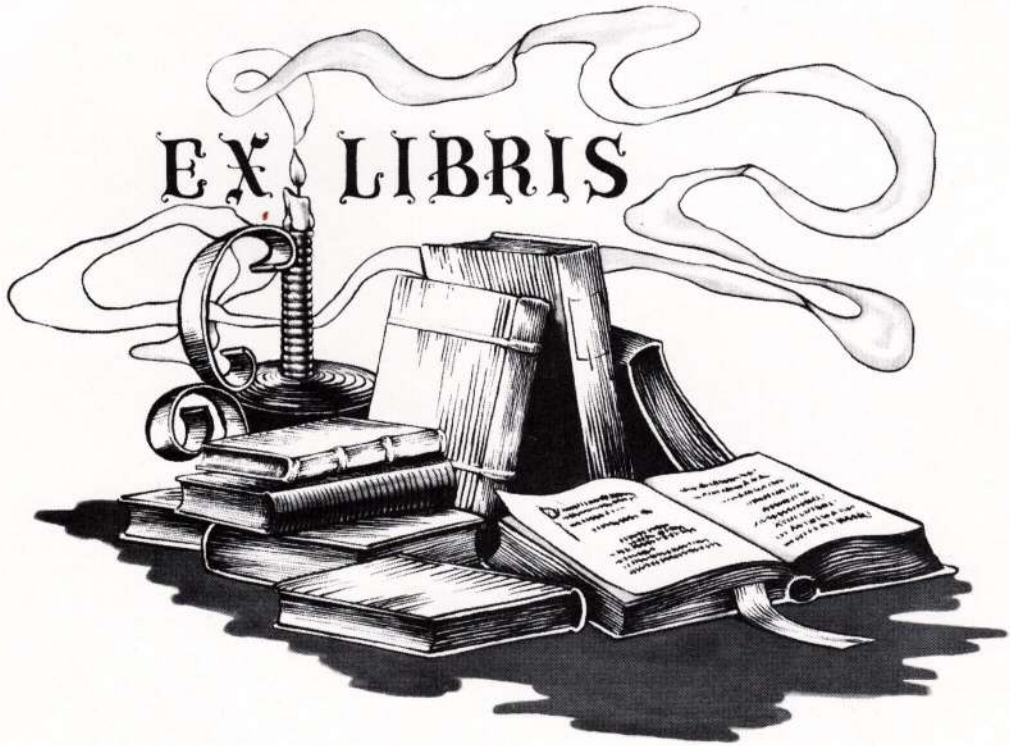


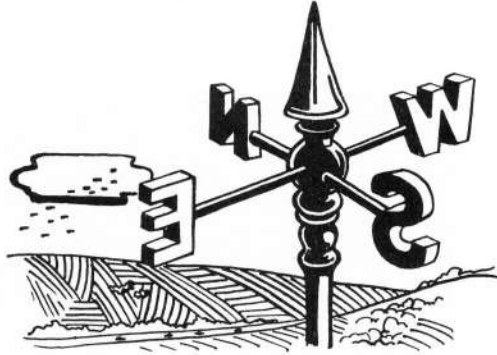

Foreword

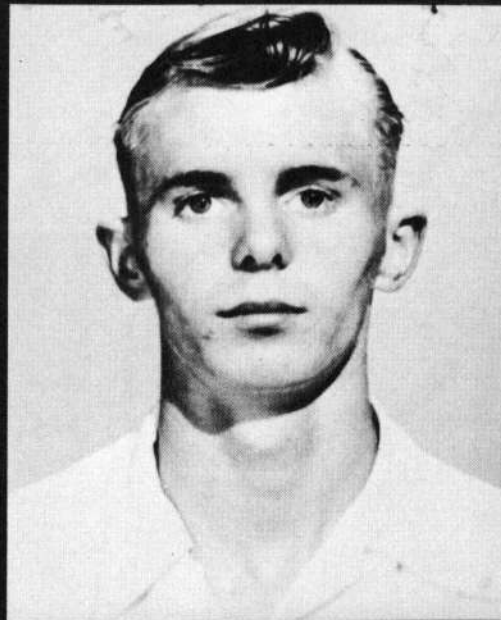
