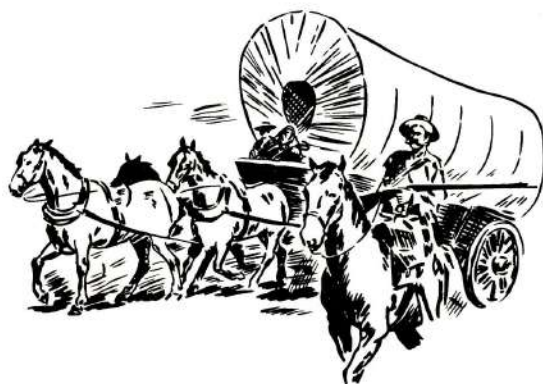

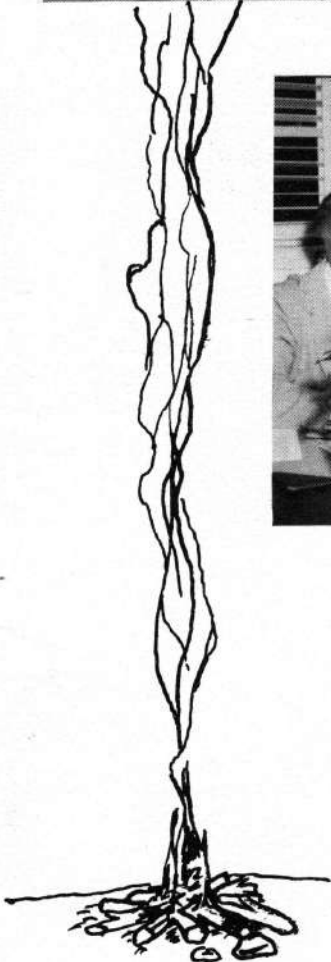
Now that you know to whom this book is dedicated, let me introduce you to the Wagon Boss, Mr. R. L. Thetford.

We hope to have as good a time in the following years as we have had this year.

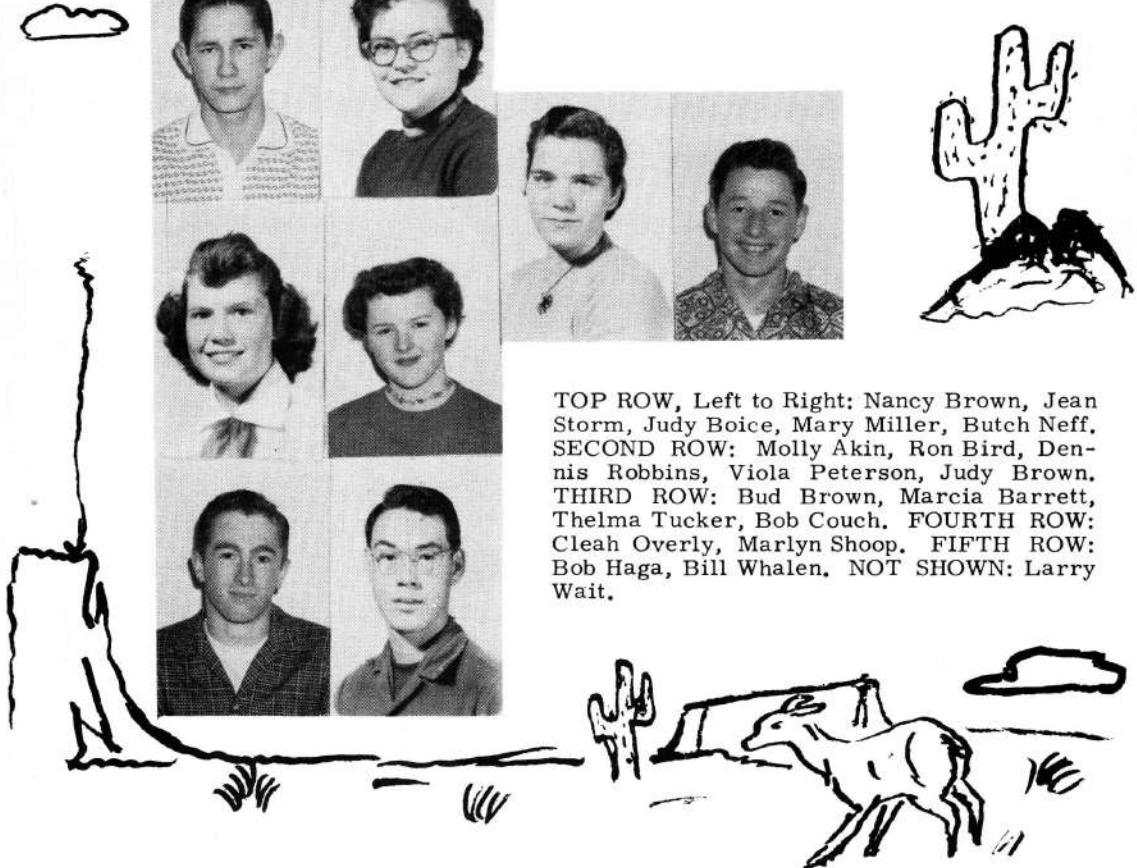

On the volleyball team were Mary Miller, Jean Storm, Nancy Brown, and Judy Boice.

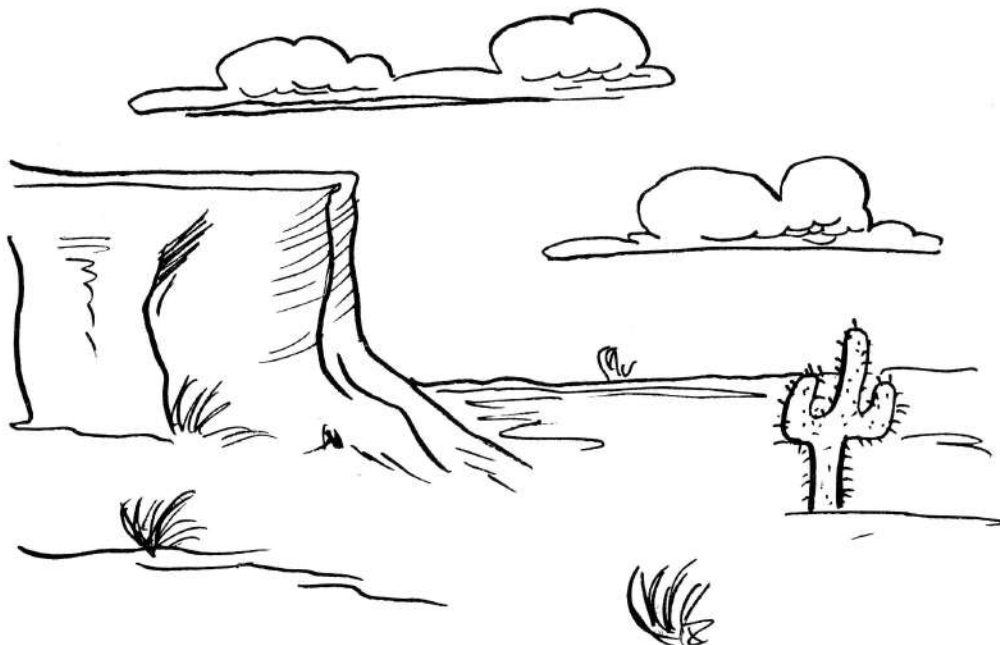
