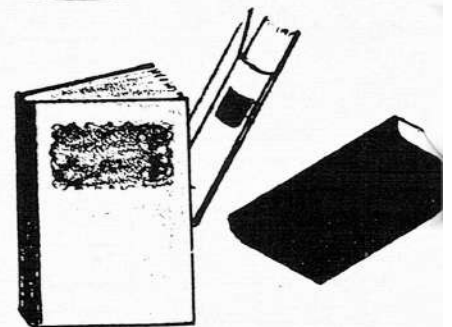
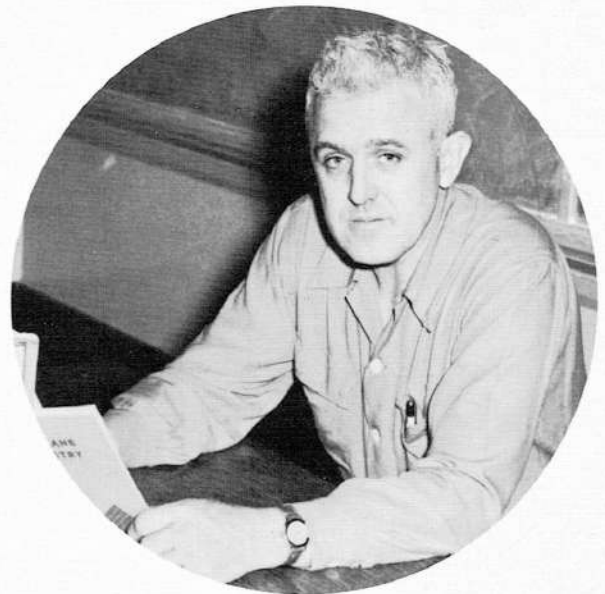


MISS ELAINE C. ROGERS

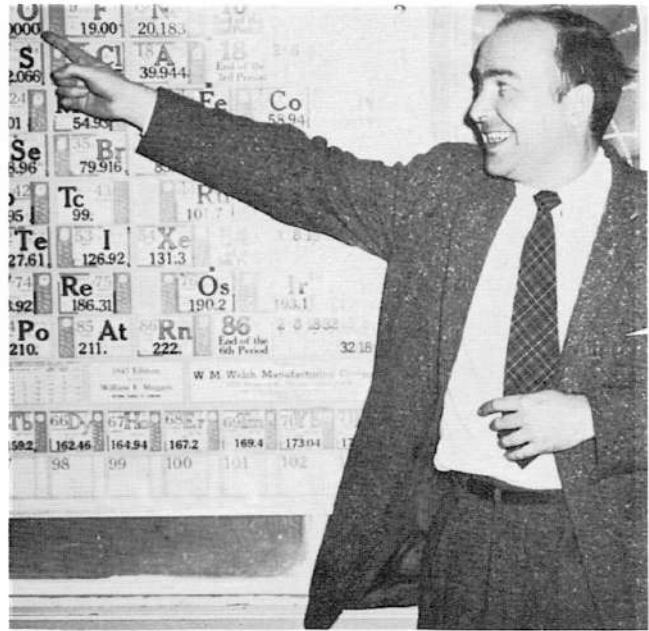
MISS LOUISE E. SIDERI

This is Mrs. Fromm's first year at POHS. She is teaching English III and IV and Library. She has attended Portland State College and the University of Oregon.



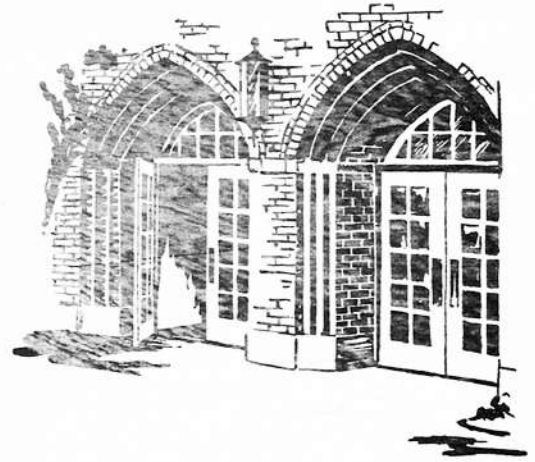
MR. BERNARD LYONS

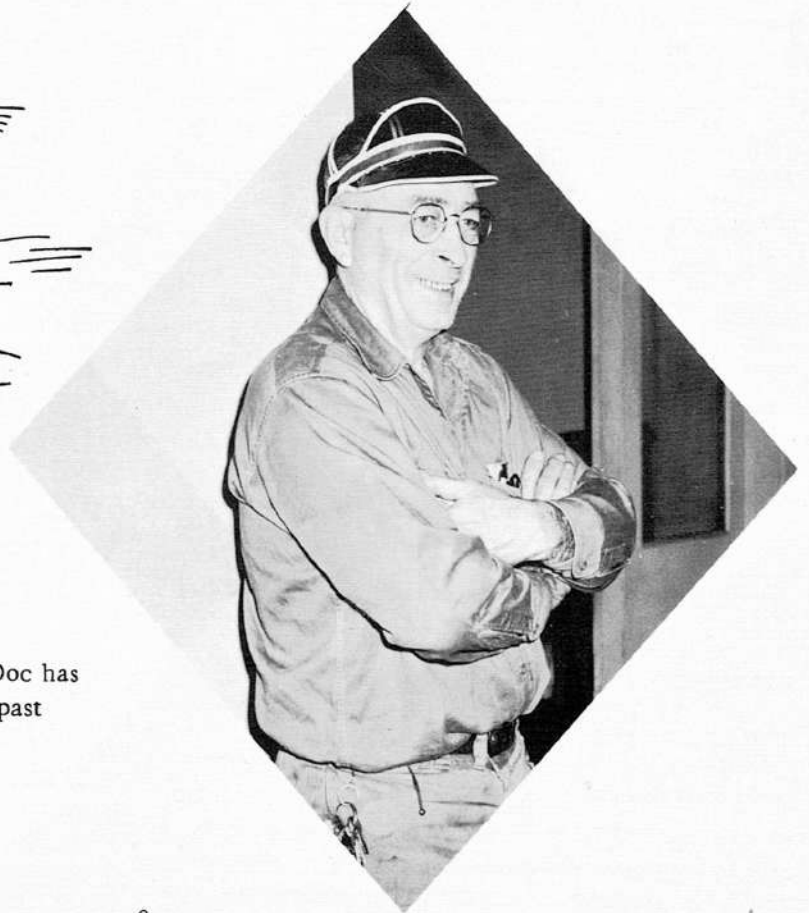


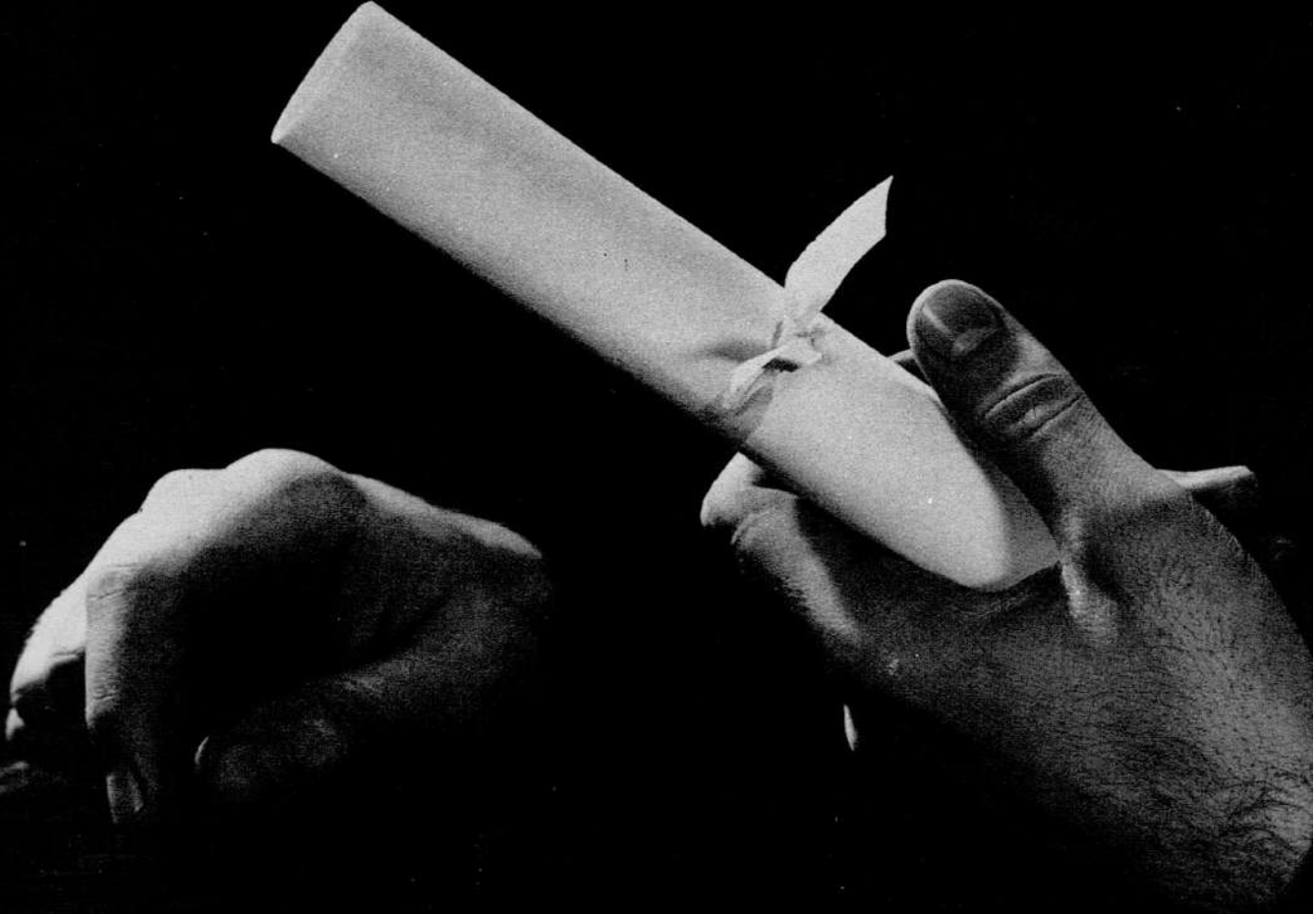


MR. CHARLES JENSEN

for approximately eight years.

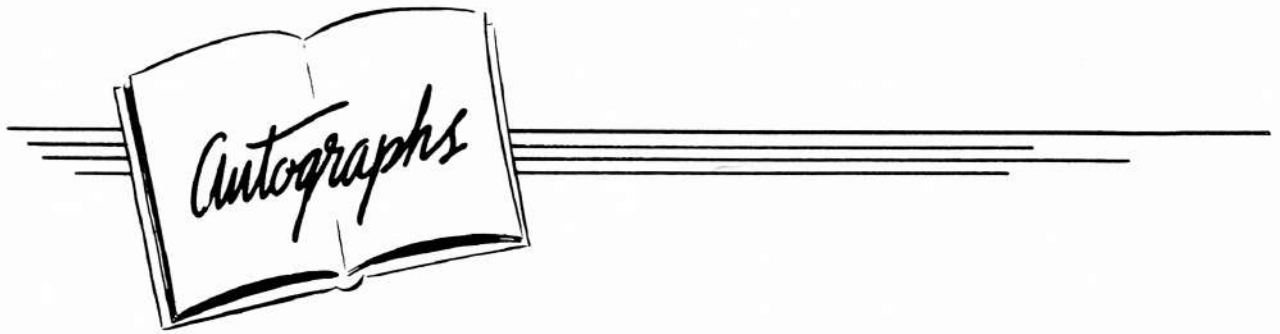

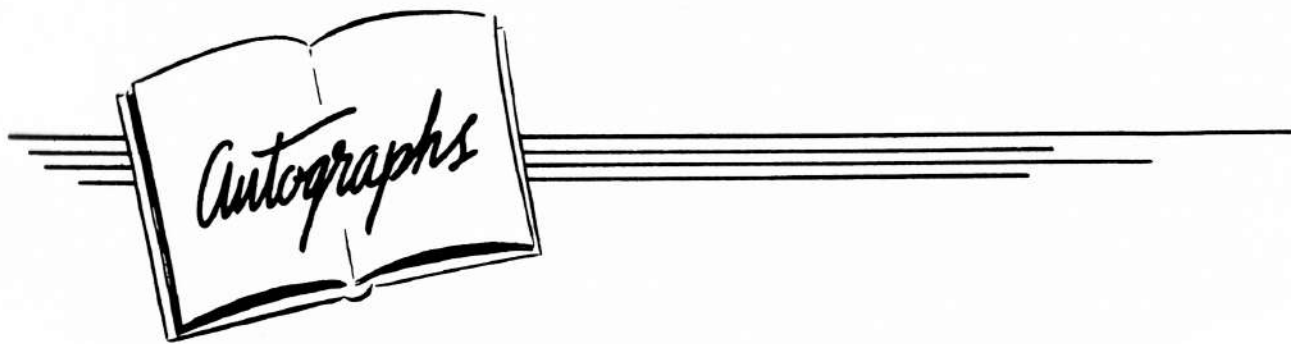
Prophecy
