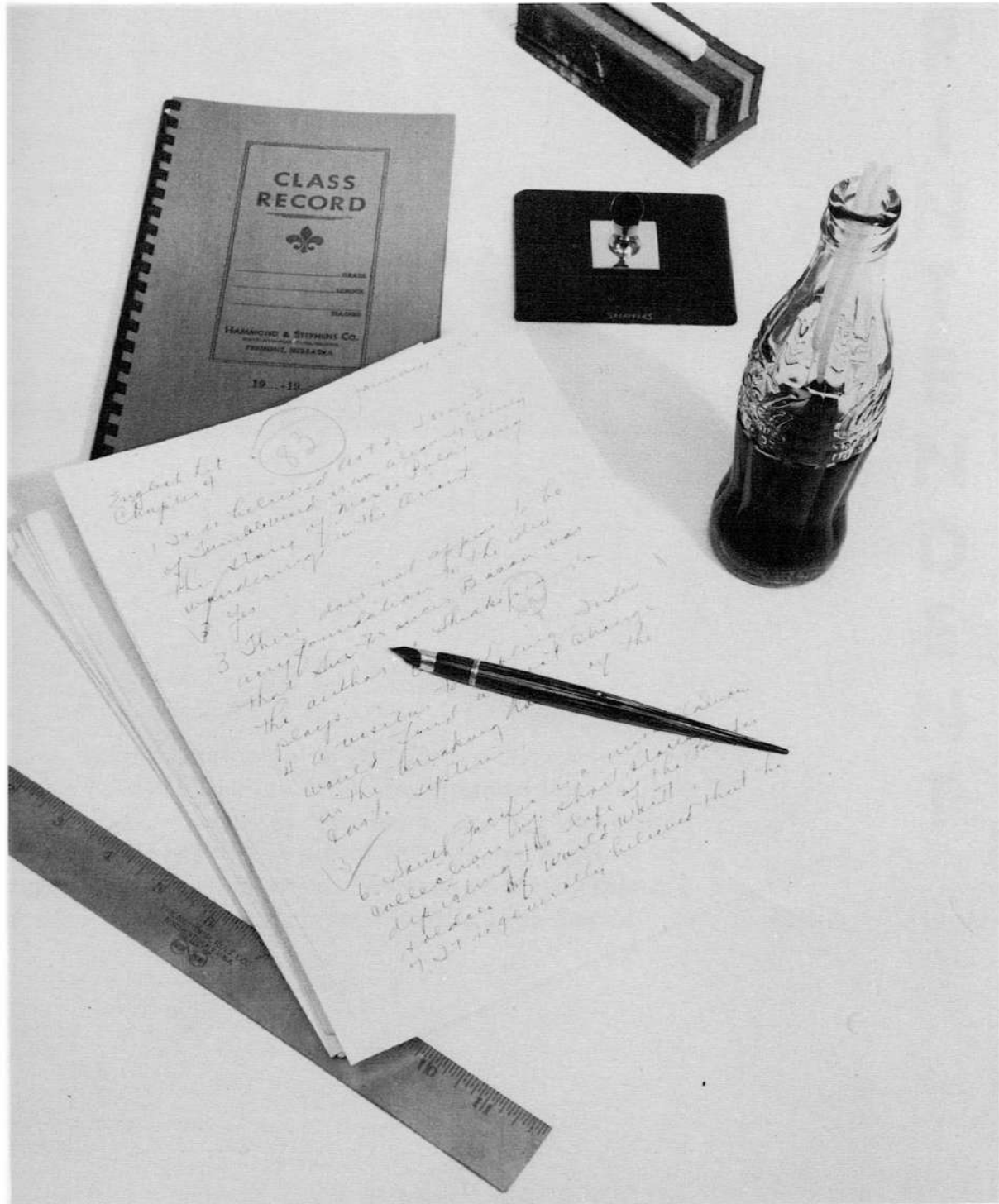
For many long years this building has served as Port Orford High School, and as we walk down these hallowed halls and through these rooms we have loved, many treasured memories come to our minds.

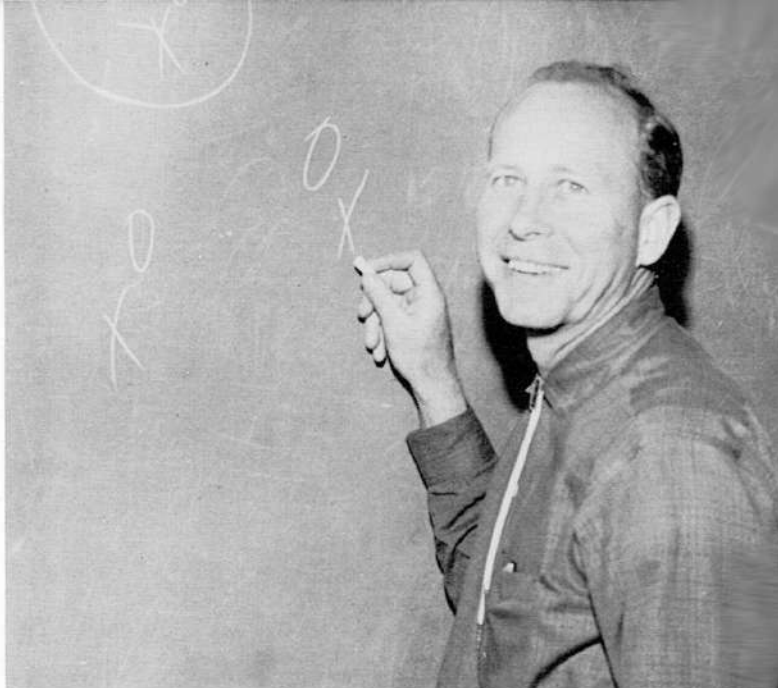
MRS. ANNA THOMAS

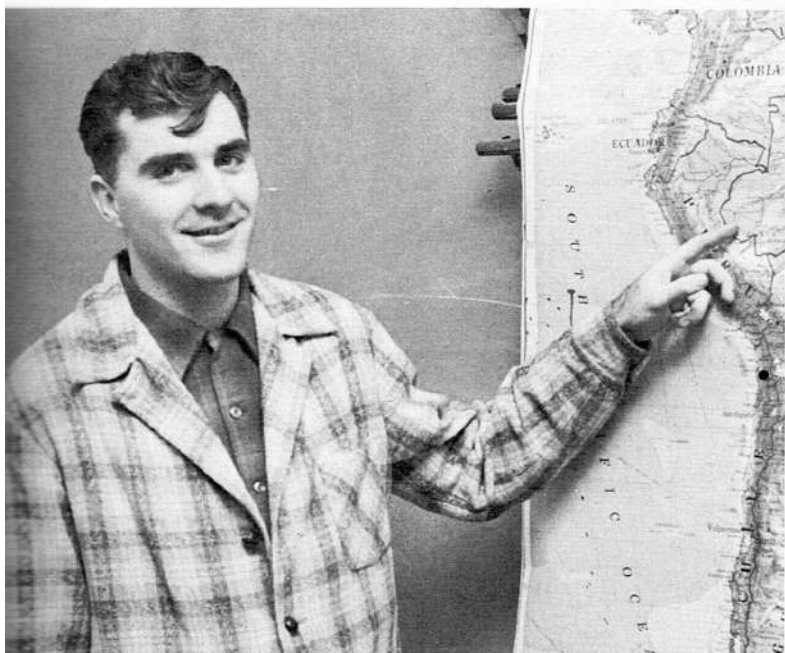
MR. EDWARD KERPA

MISS CHARLOTTE MARTIN

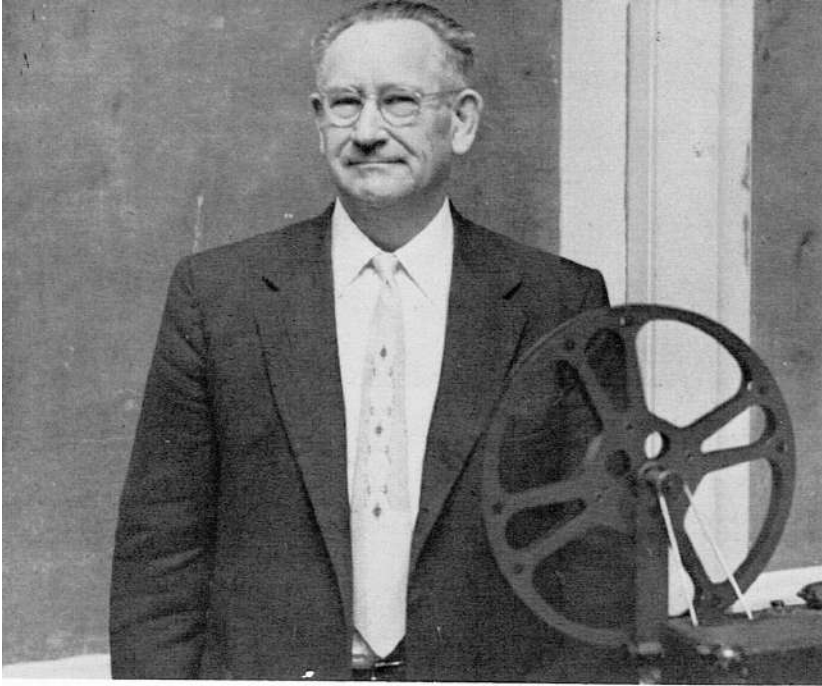

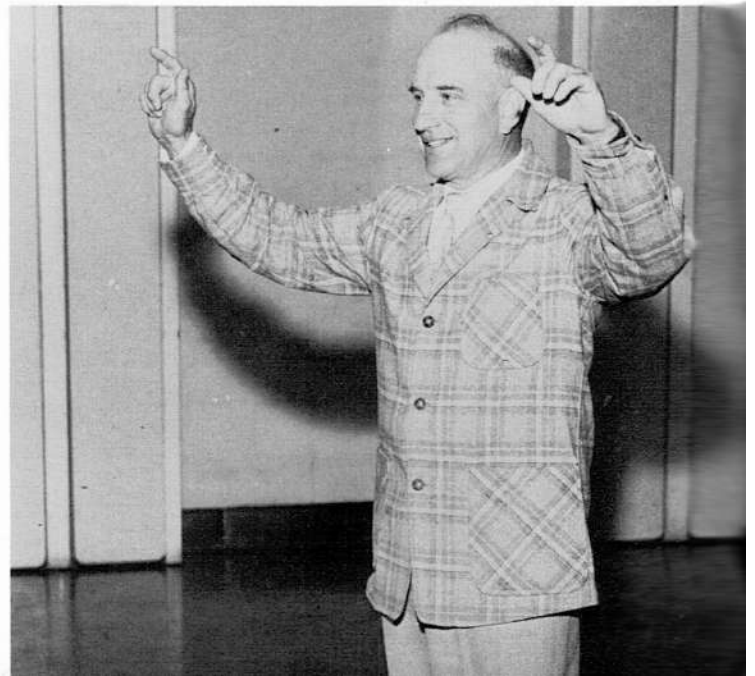


MRS. MARGARET FOSTER

"Doc" has been our school custodian for the past five years at Port Orford High School.

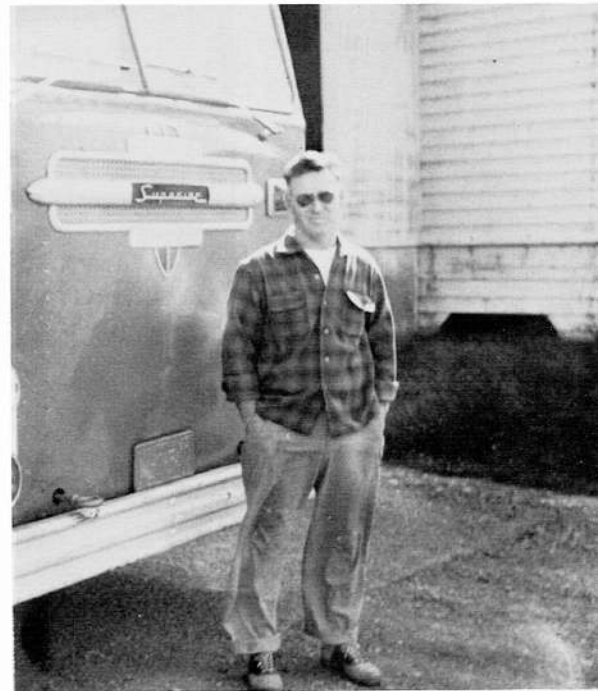
