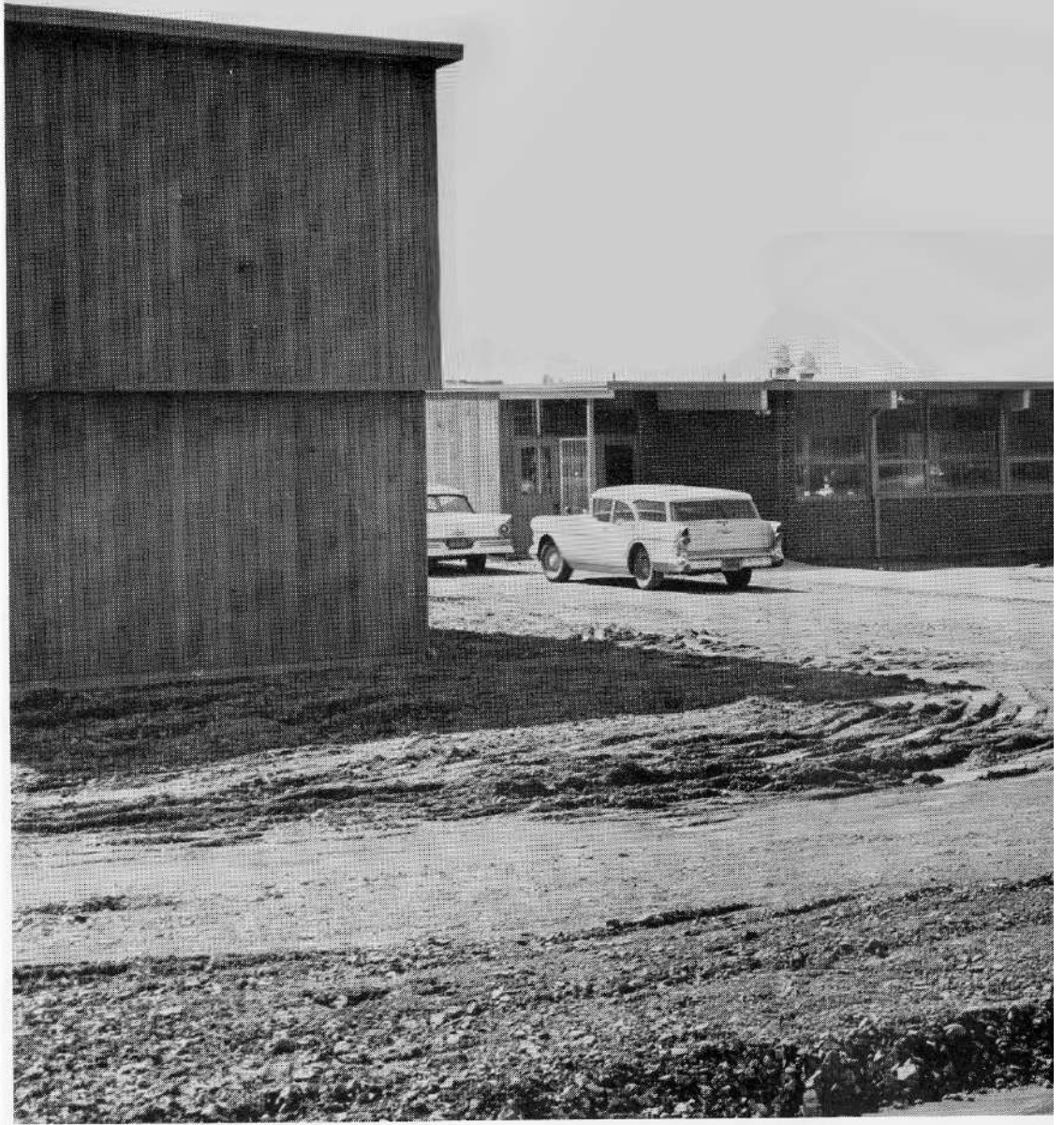

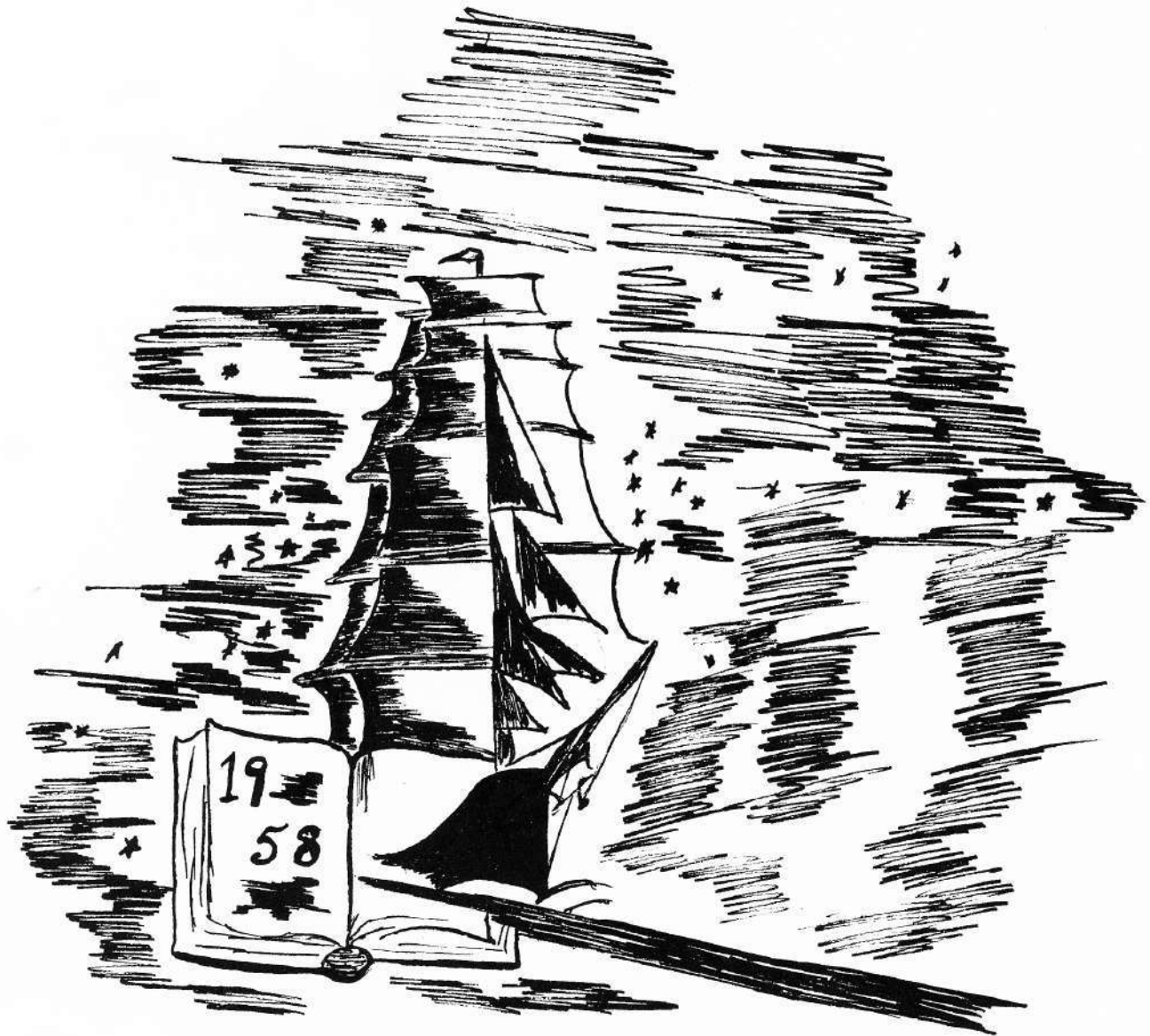

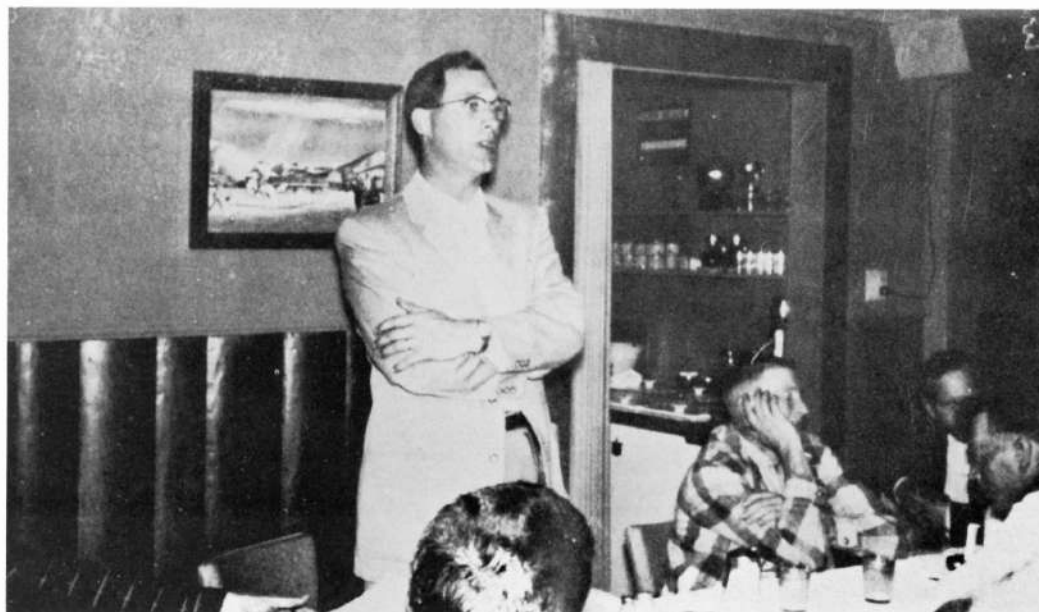
Various activities have been sponsored by them to raise these funds; among these have been dances, raffles, turkey shoots, a booth at the County Fair, and membership drives.

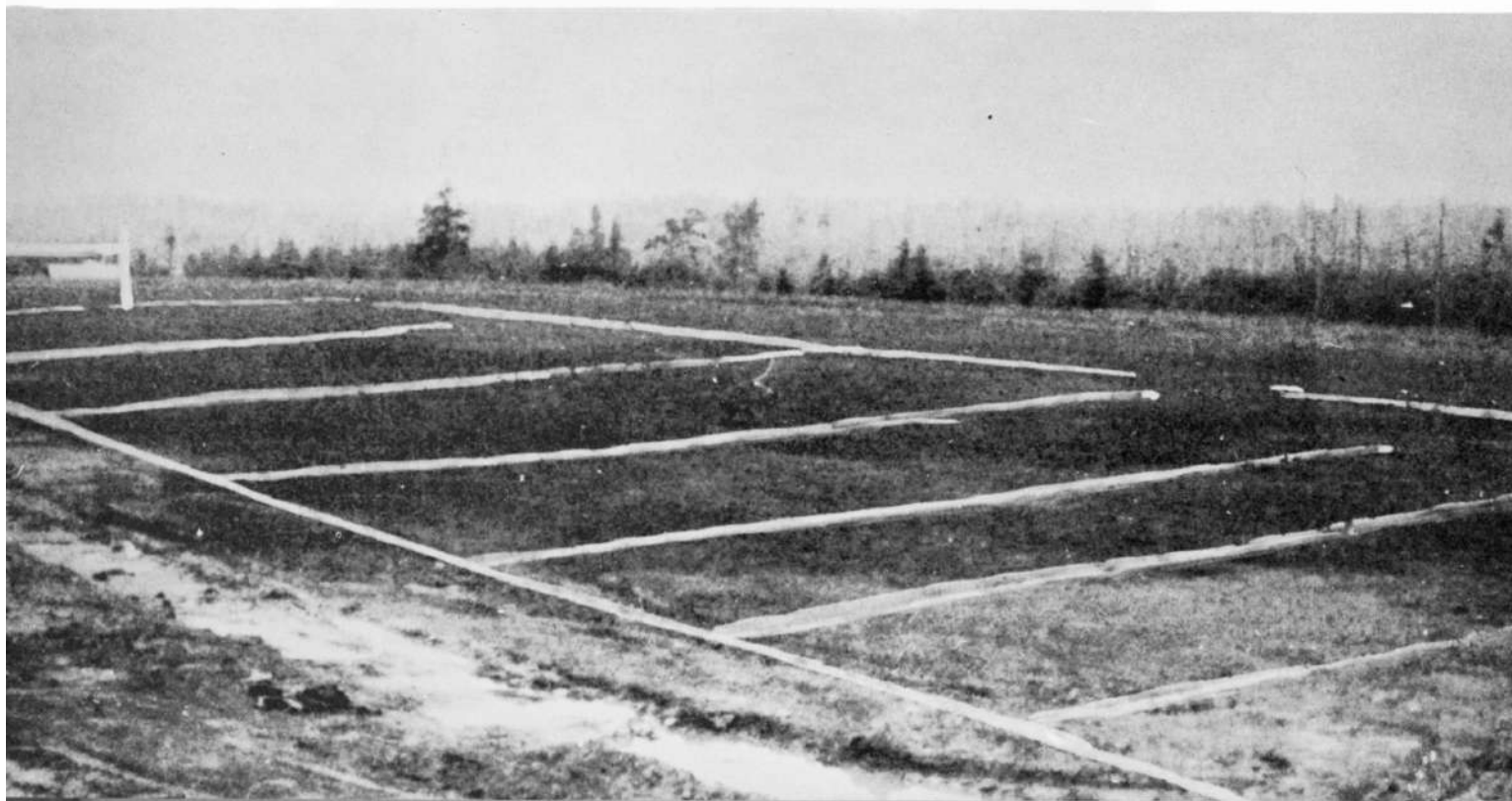

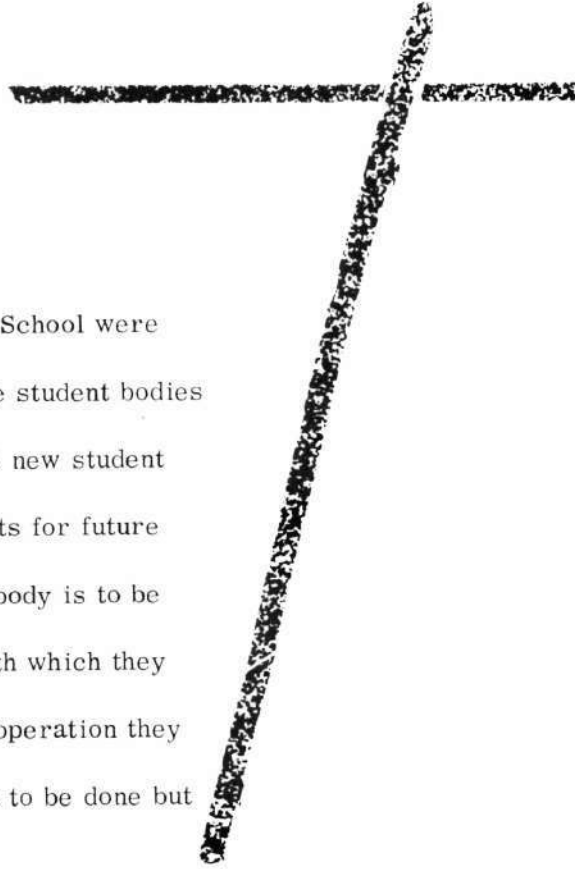


President John Mayea presides at a Quarterback meeting.

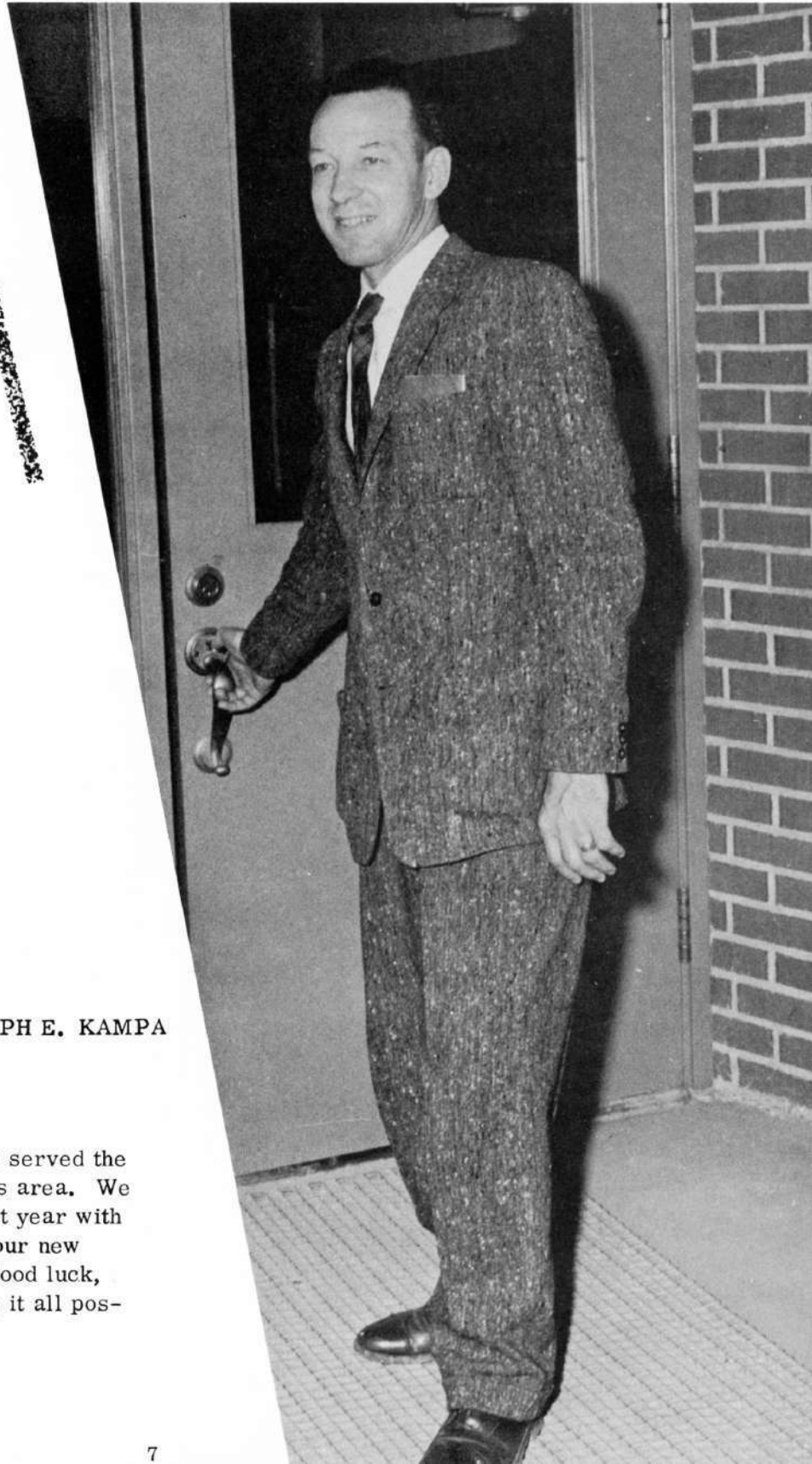

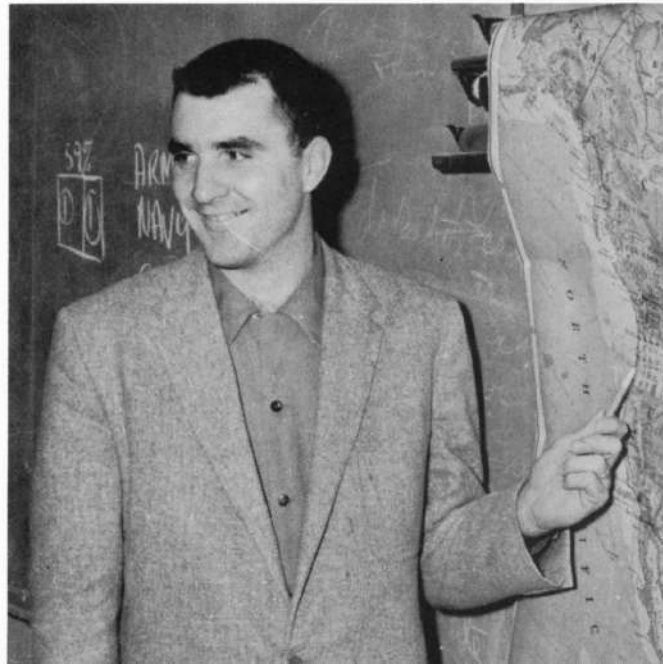
## MARGARET FOSTER

Mrs. Masterson taught the first foreign language class given recently in this area. She had a small but willing Latin I class. She also served as Assistant Librarian.



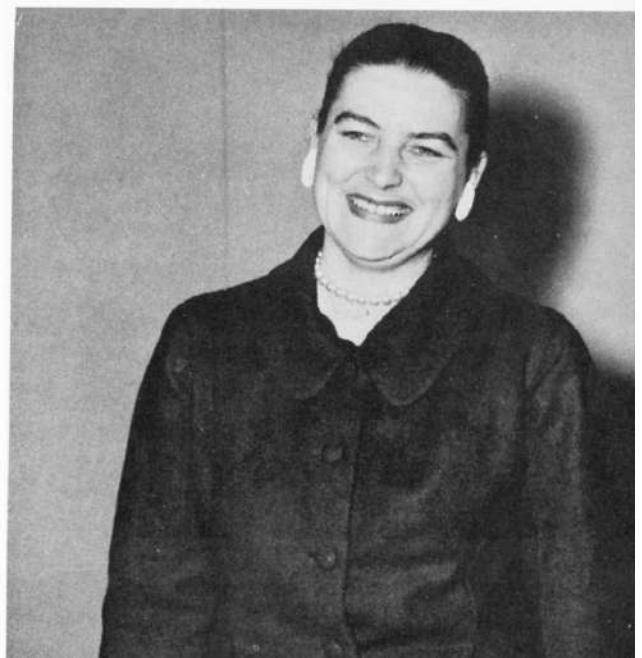
**CAROLYN SCHLAFMAN**

#### EVA JOHNSON

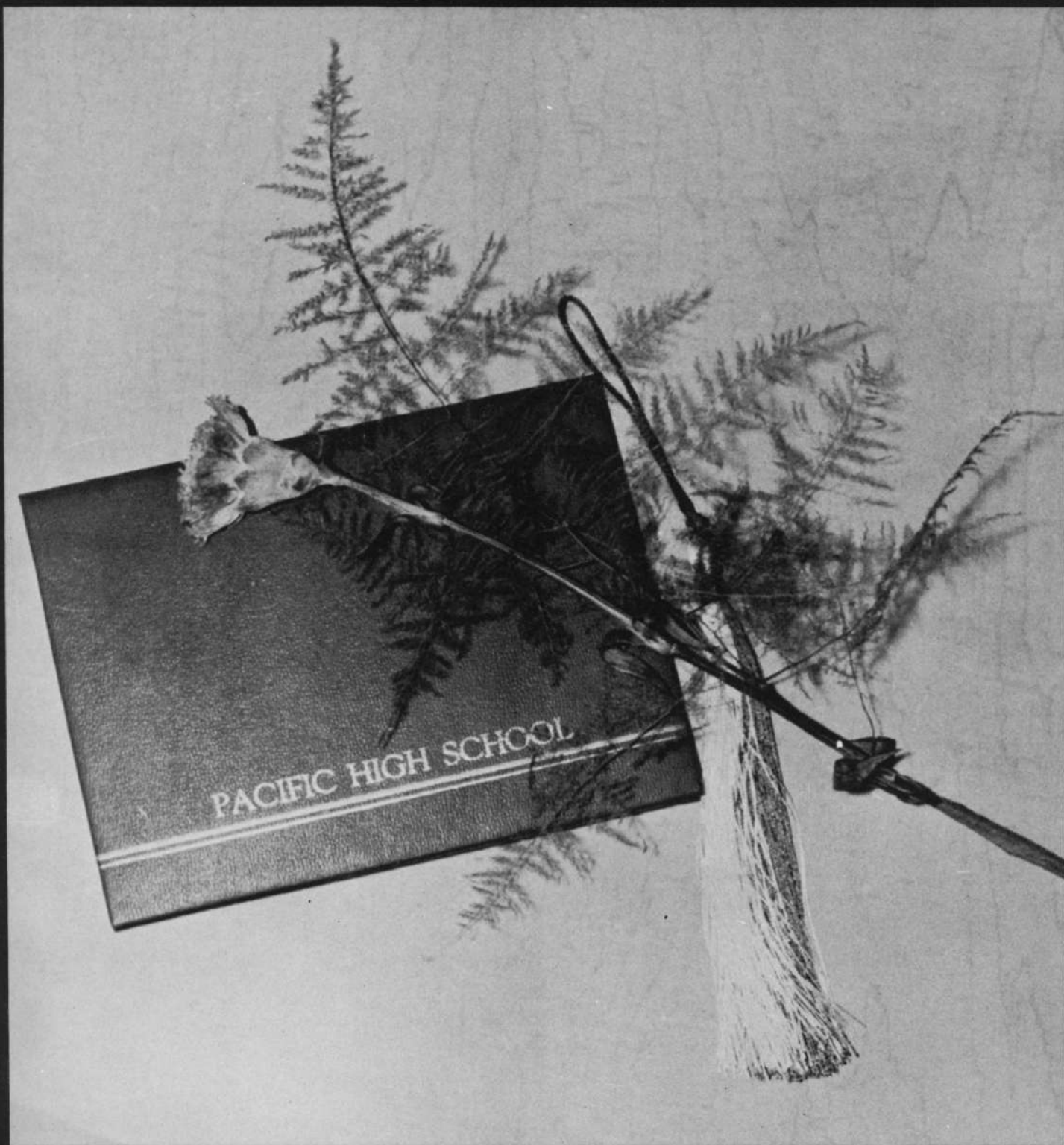

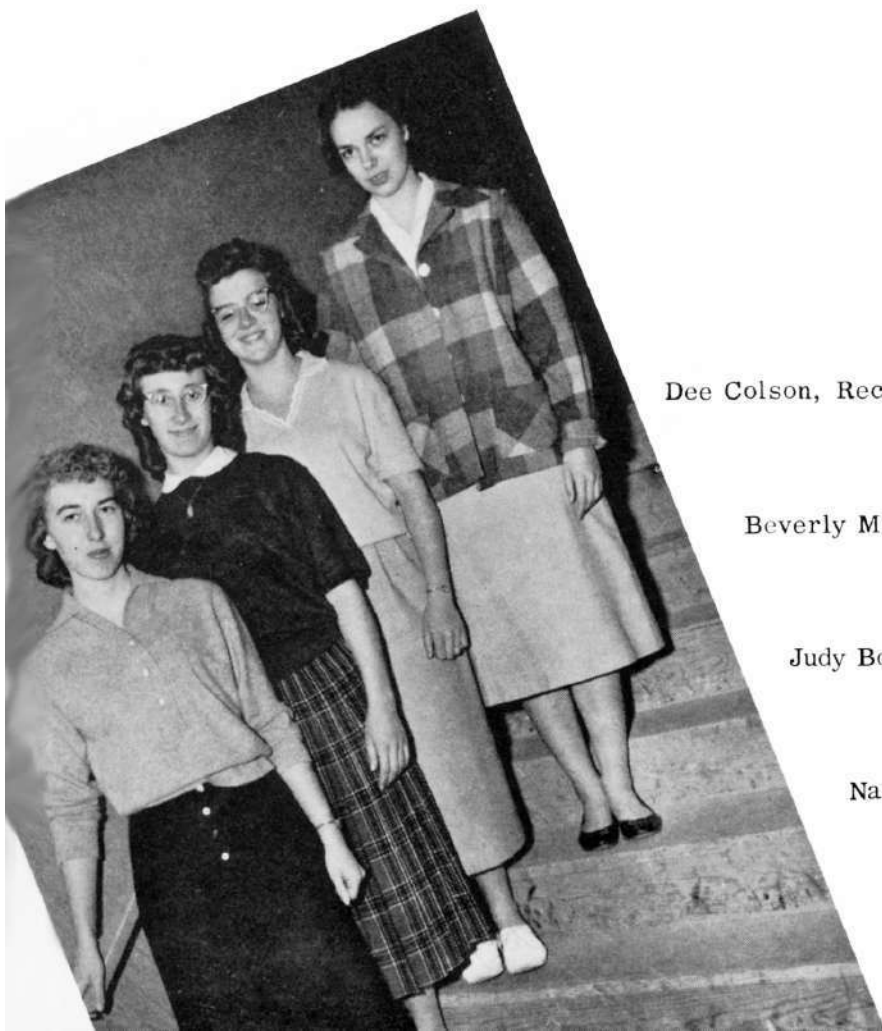
Some of the projects for making money this year were, making Christmas candles, selling Christmas Cards, selling Date Books, Cooked Food sales, typing jobs, and a car wash.
