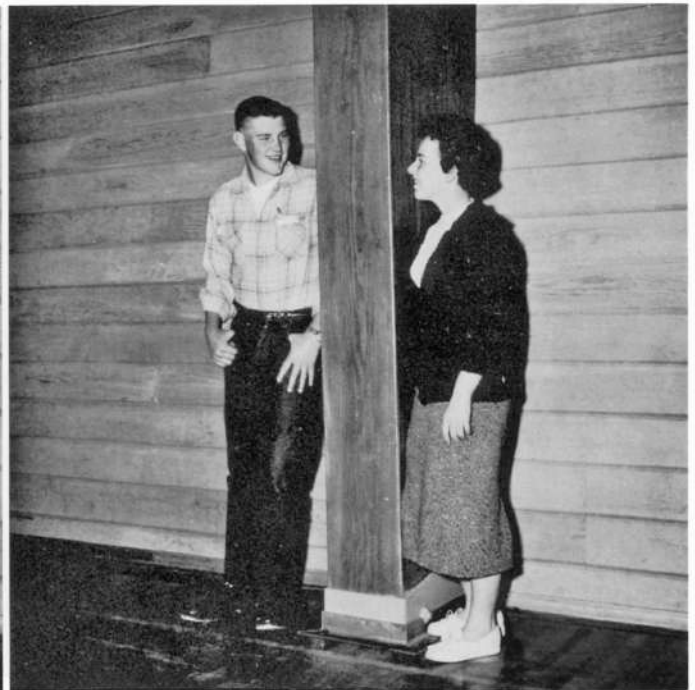

Our futures we'll arrange.

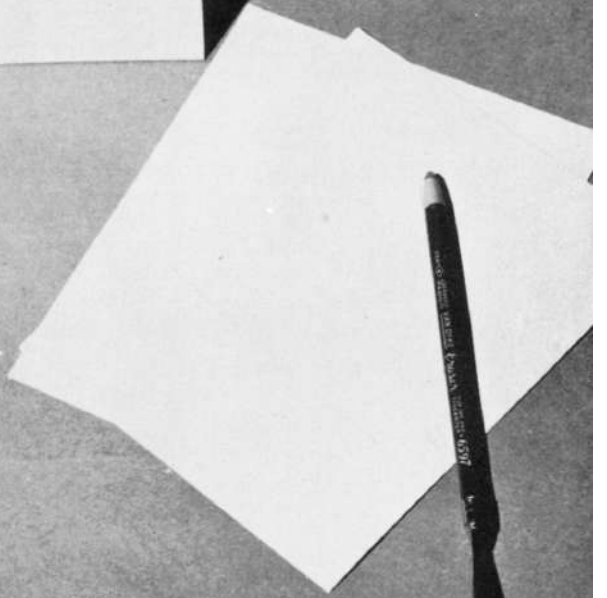
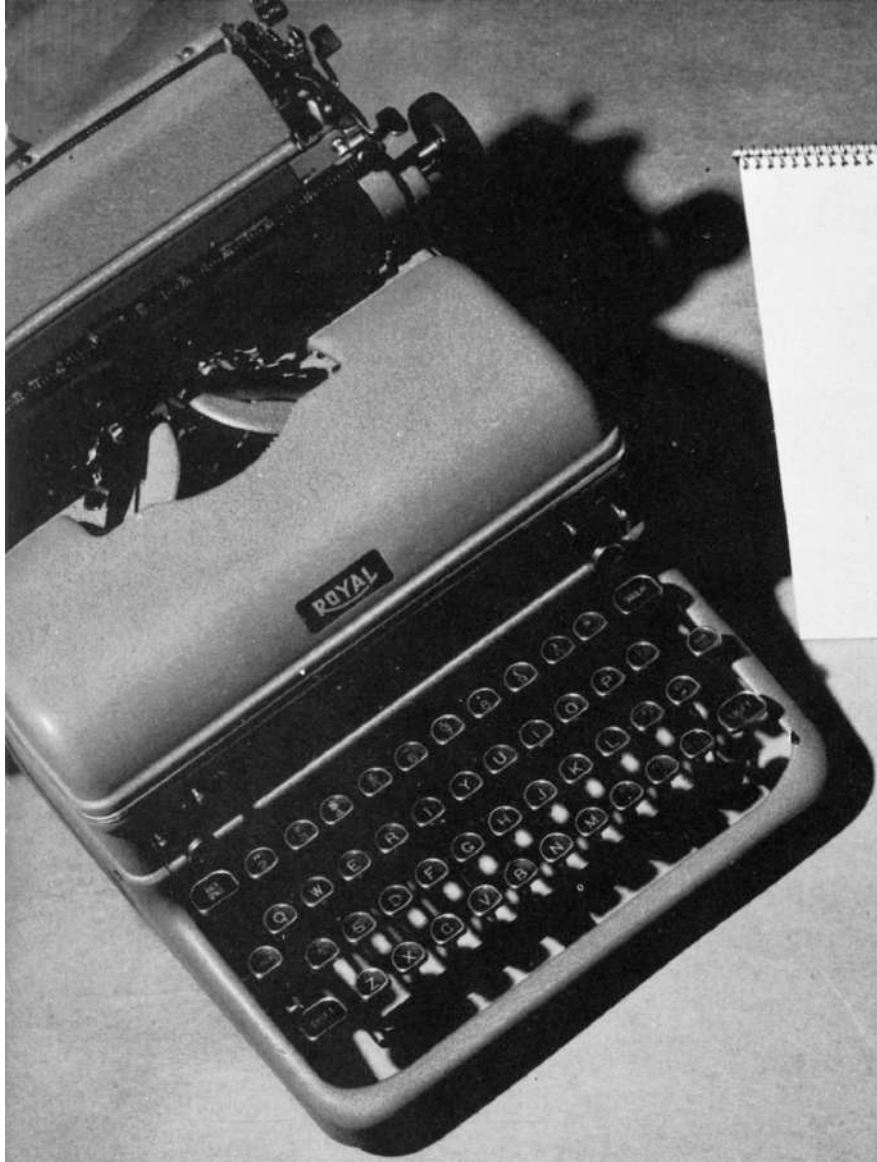
