During the war, he was taken prisoner by the Japanese. He sustained a back injury while a prisoner of war.

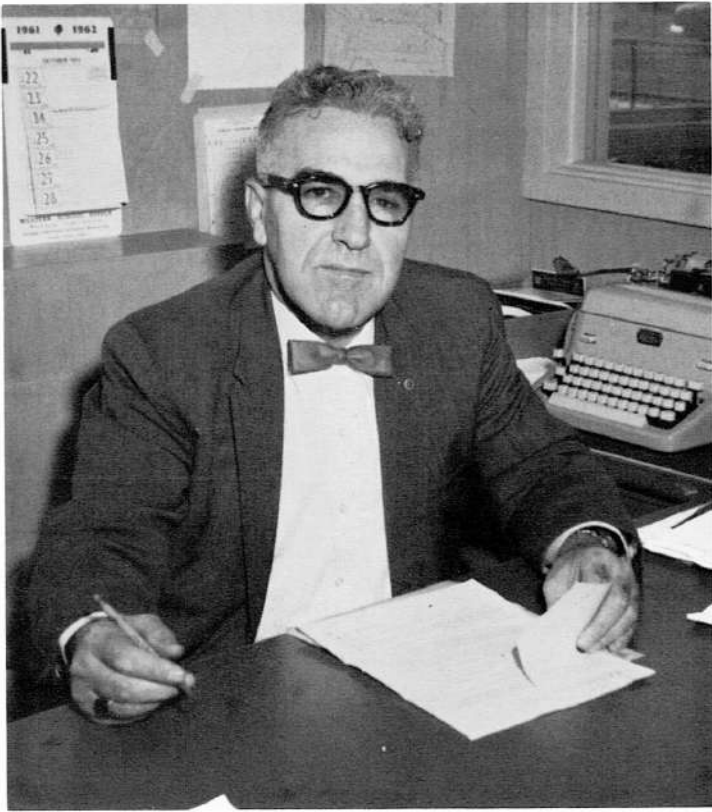
Due to a heart condition, Quig had to quit work to spend some time recuperating.

His life has been one of many occupations and businesses. These include, a logger, a dairyman, and a custodian.

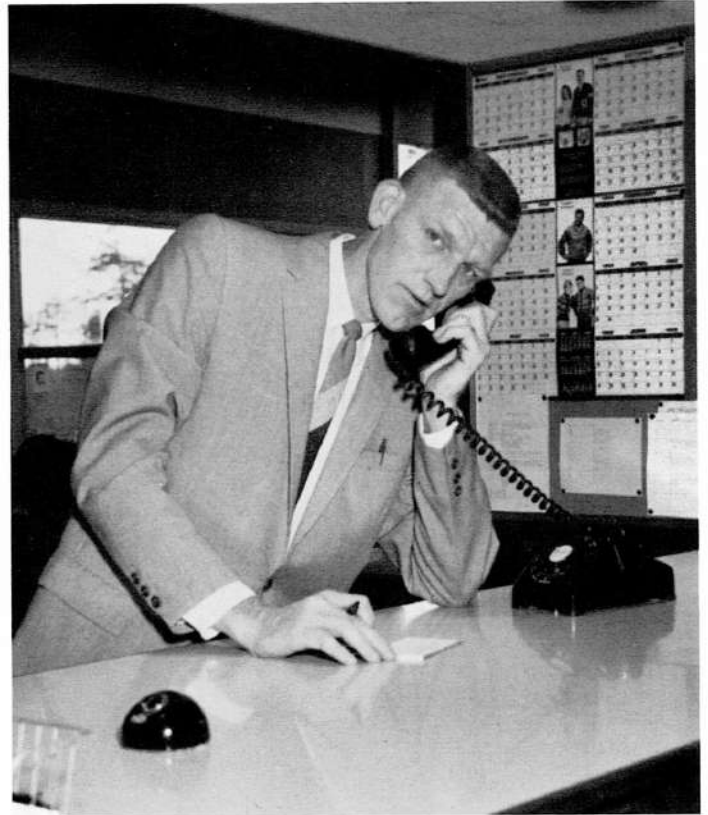
We the students of Pacific High dedicate the 1962 Scope, to Everett Quigley, known affectionately as Quig.

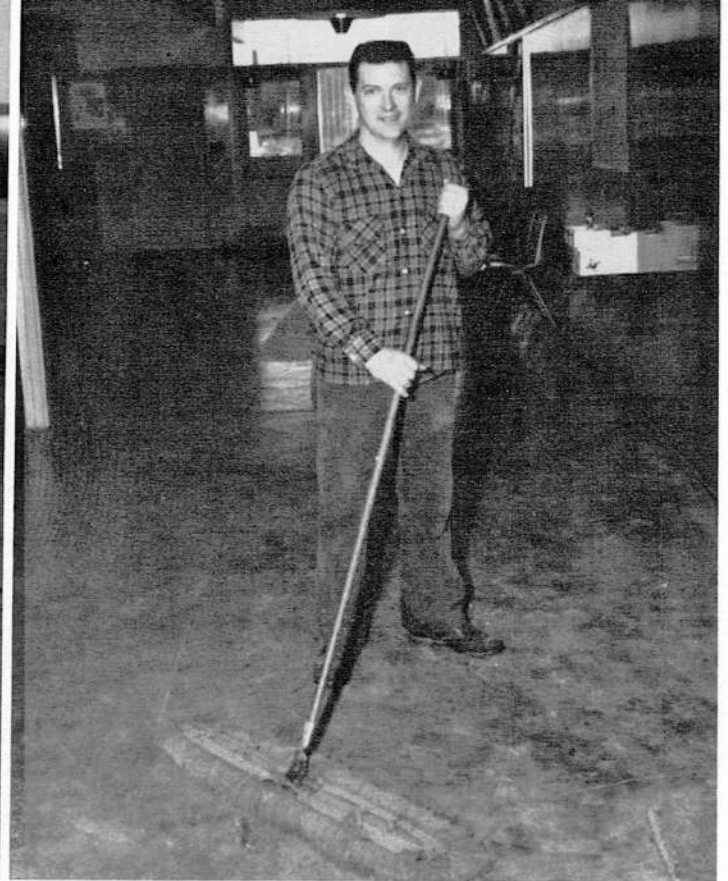
Each member of the Student Council received a Student Council Pin.

The Junior-Senior Banquet was held May 18, 1962.

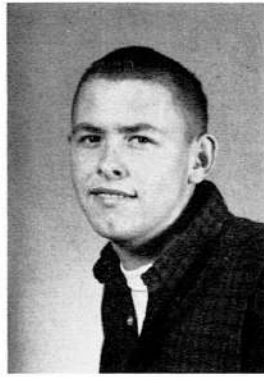

Twenty-six girls participated in the activity, "Go! Fight! Win!," during the half-time of the Homecoming game. They also had charge of the bonfire before the game.

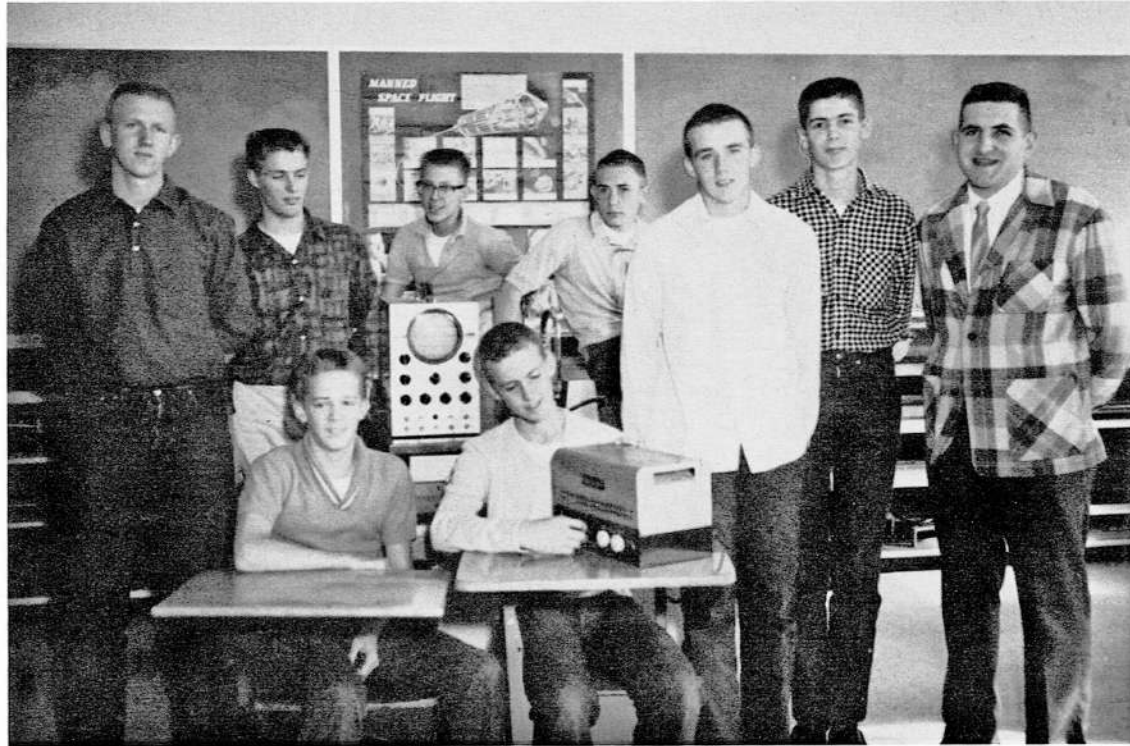

Next season Pacific is bound to make good, for we have the makings of a good team.



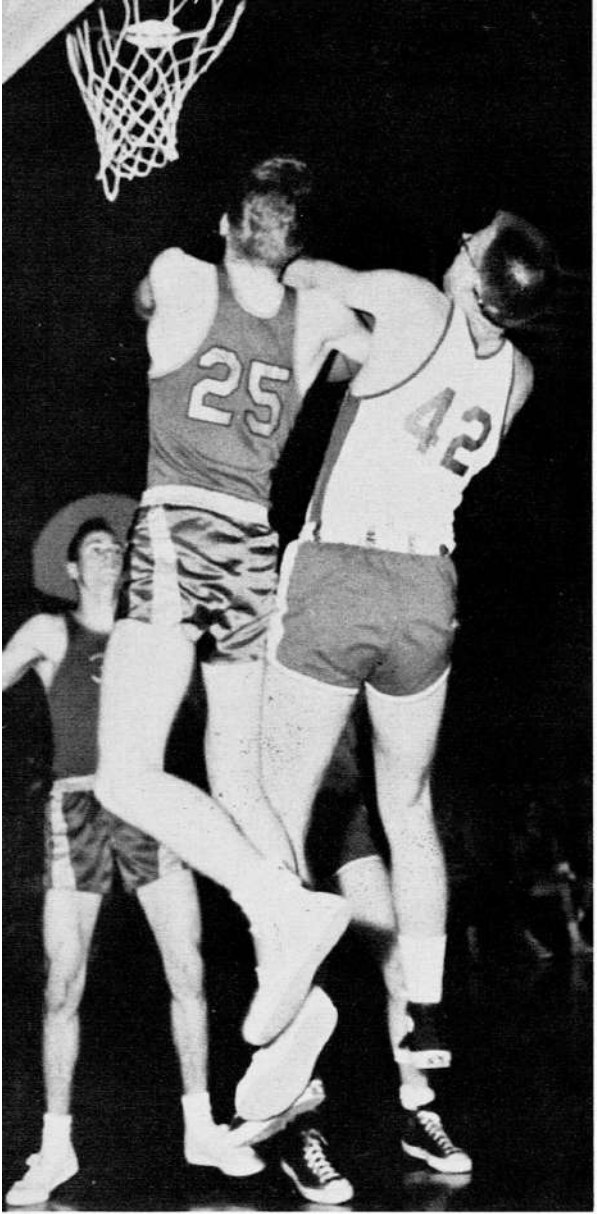

We had several outstanding men on our squad and Merle Churchill and Don May, the co-captains, went to state. The boys were under the coaching of John Botz.

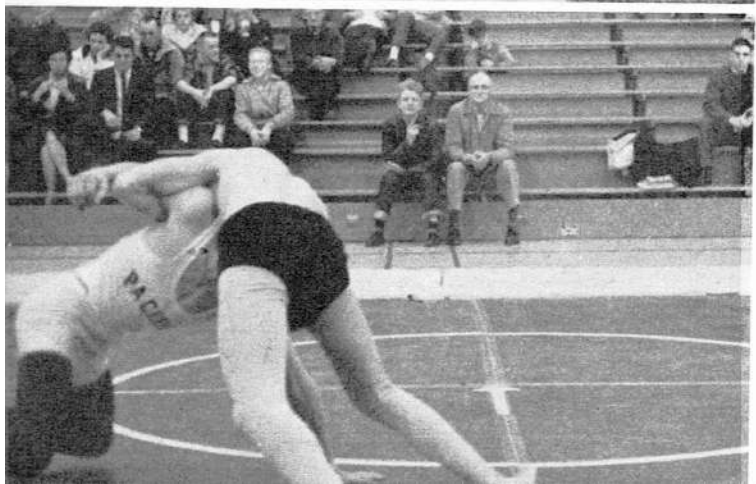

Veteran's Day Assembly

November 11, 1961

Pacific High School's fourth annual Veteran's Day Assembly, the only high school in the United States having this assembly, was held November 11, 1961.

This assembly was originated by the past principal of Pacific High School, Joe DeMarsh. It is designed as a tribute to those persons living and dead who have served in the Armed Forces of our country. In the past three years we have had such guests as Rep. A. Fegal then Mayor of Roseburg and Robert Duncan, Speaker of the House of Representative for the state of Oregon in 1959. Many service groups have also been guests.

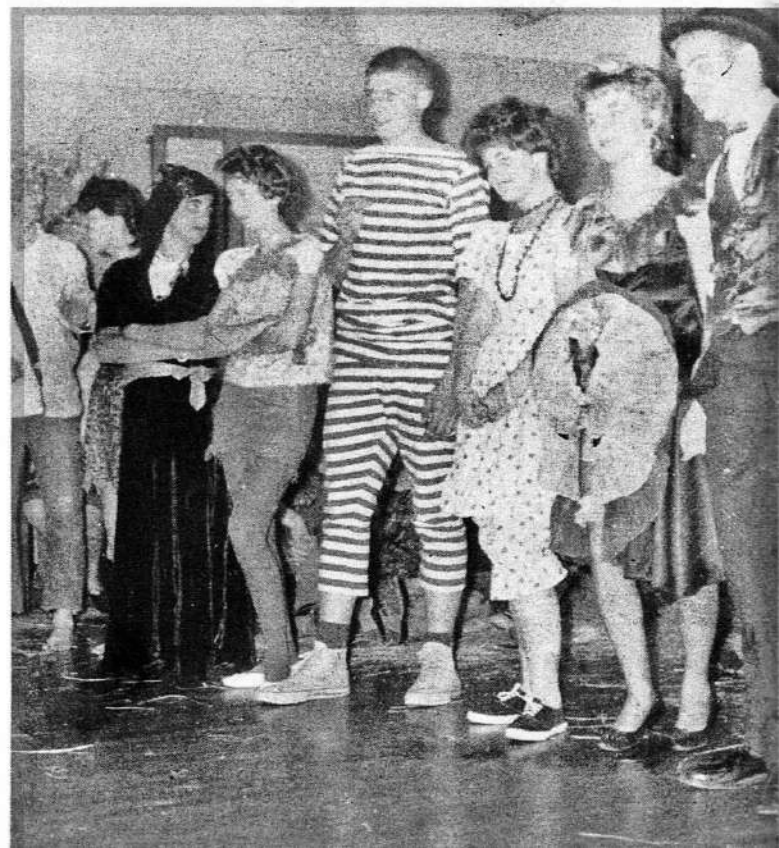


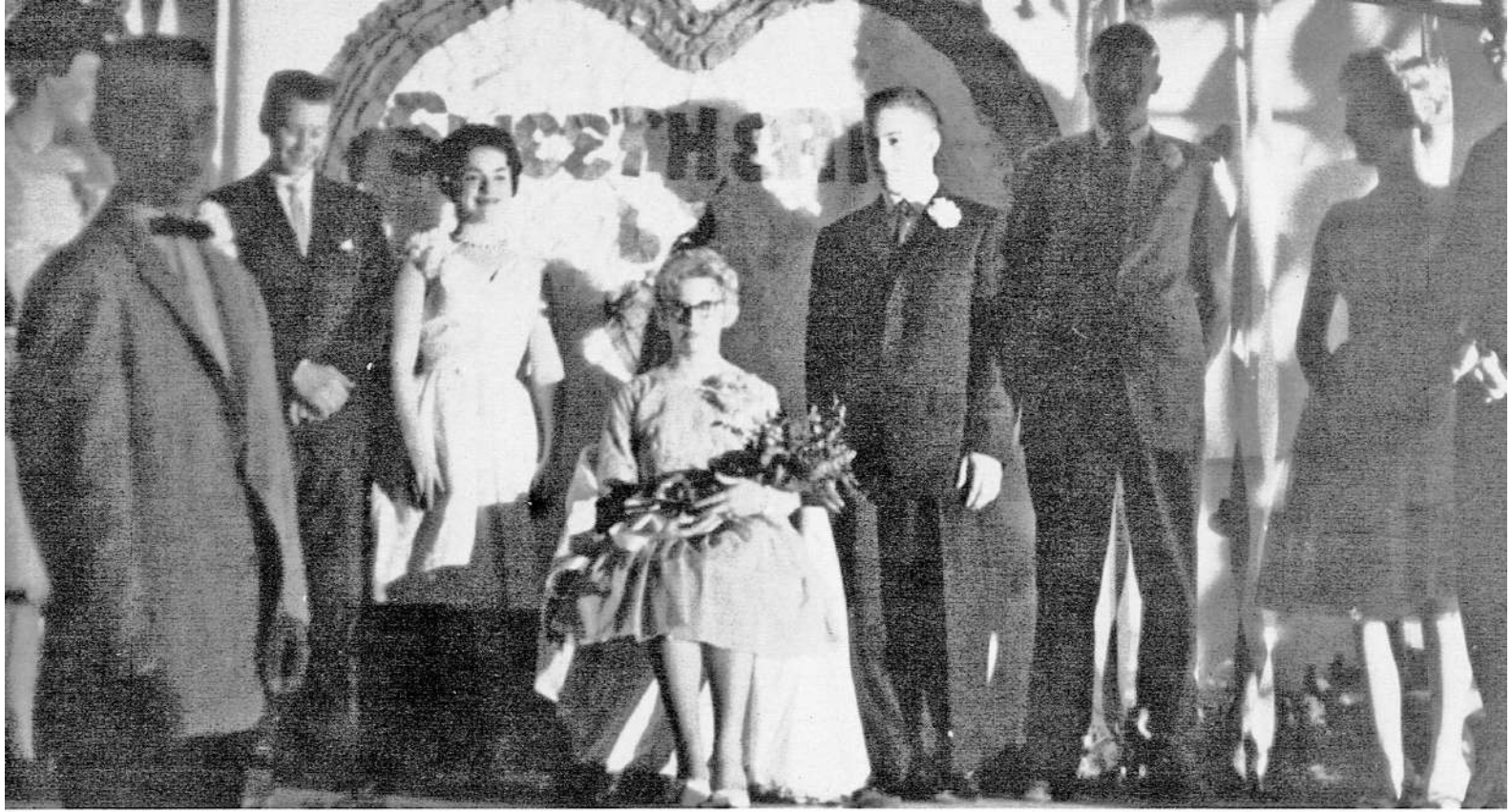

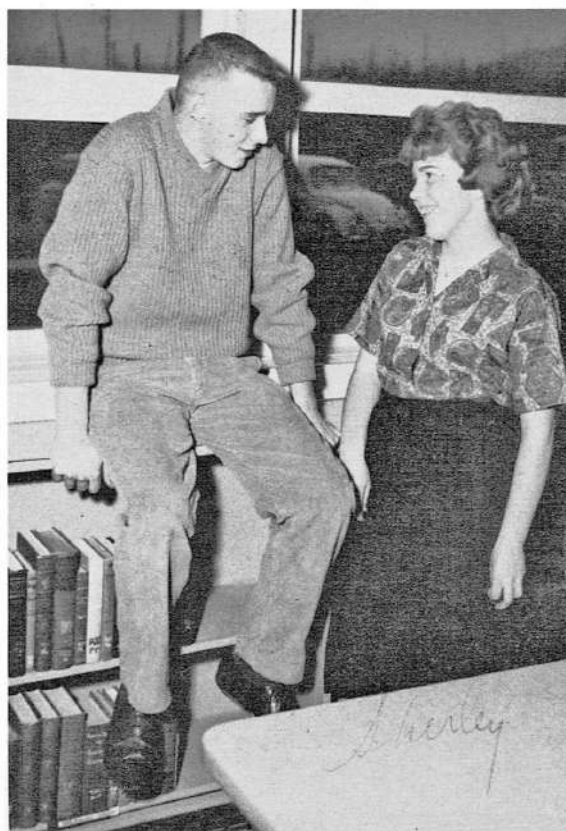

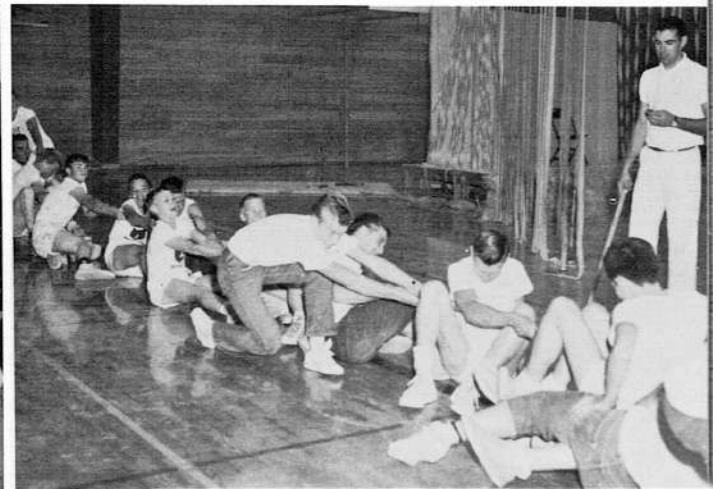
