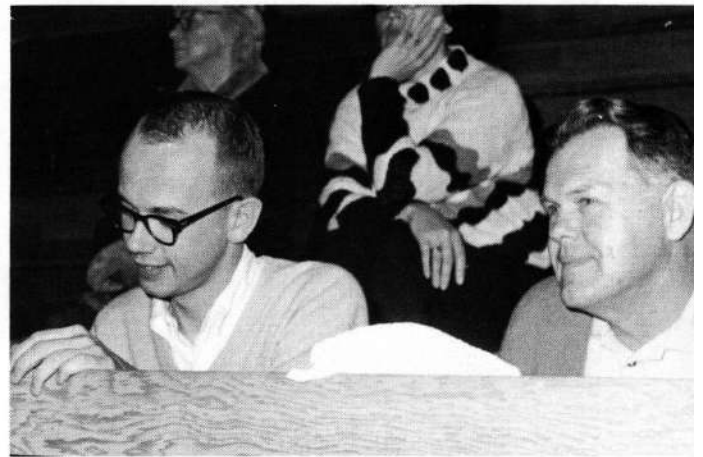

# Future Farmers Have Outstanding Year



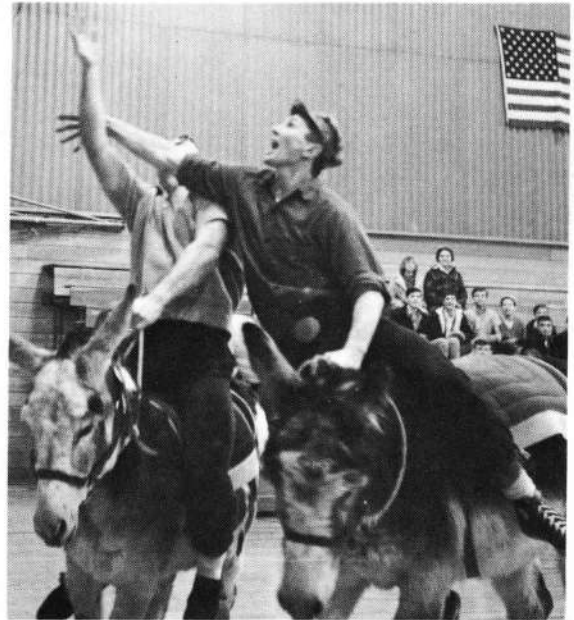

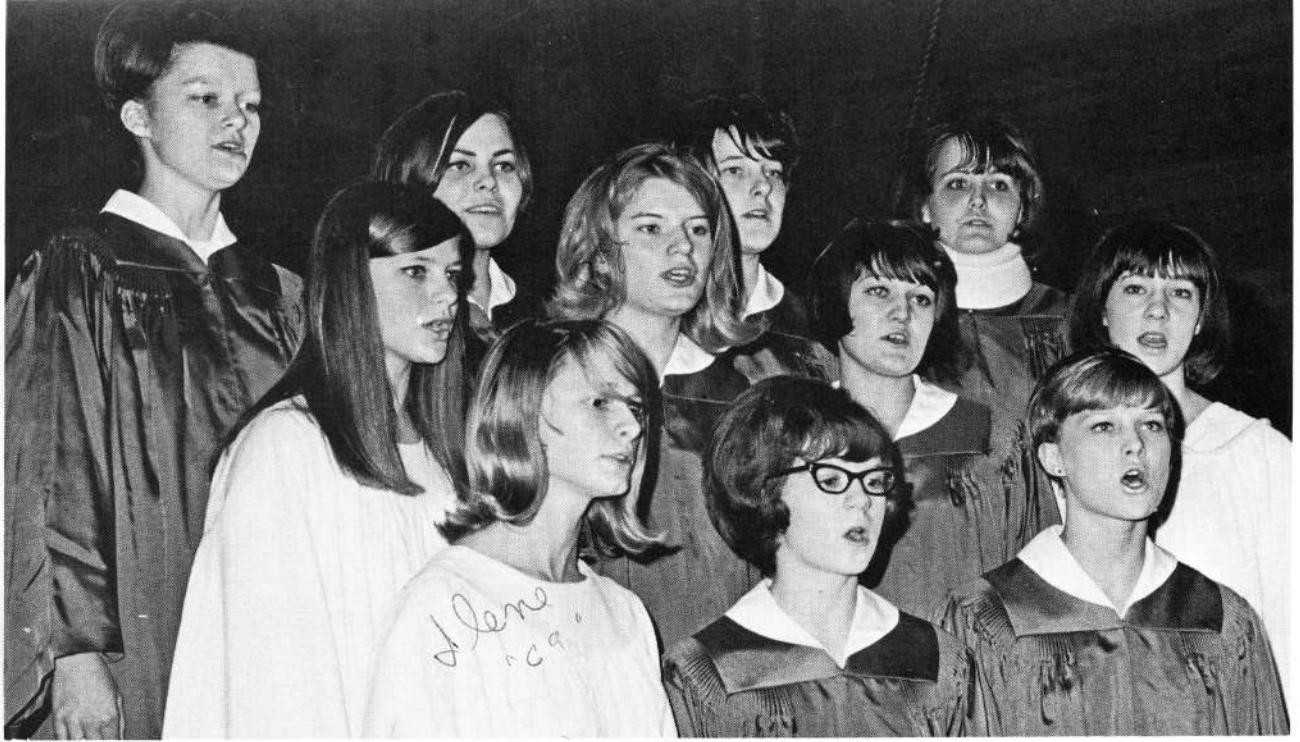

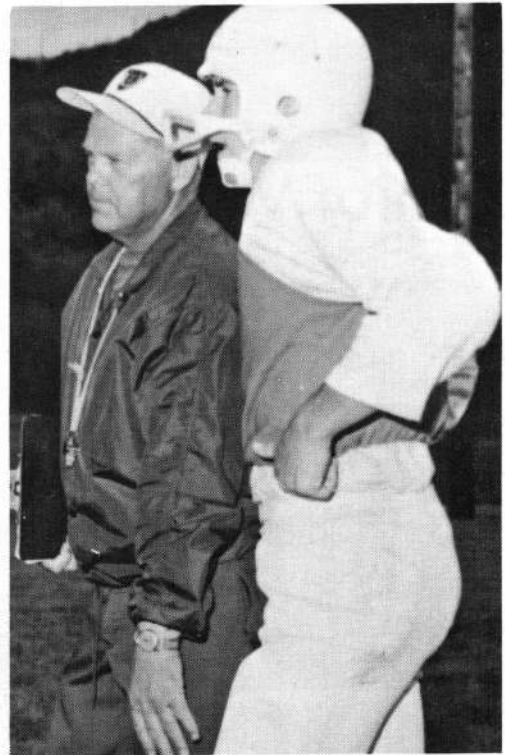

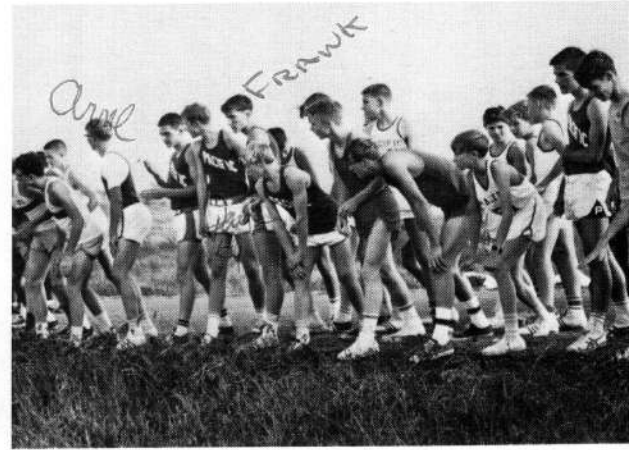

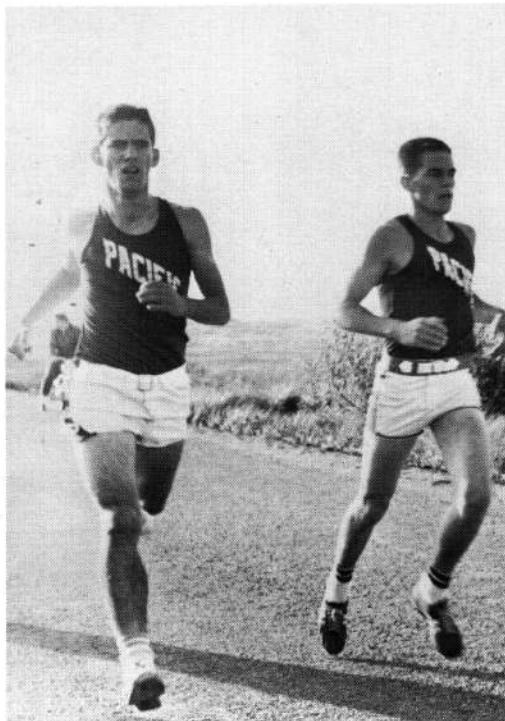
## History Made At Pacific Cross Country Team Takes First Sunset Championship

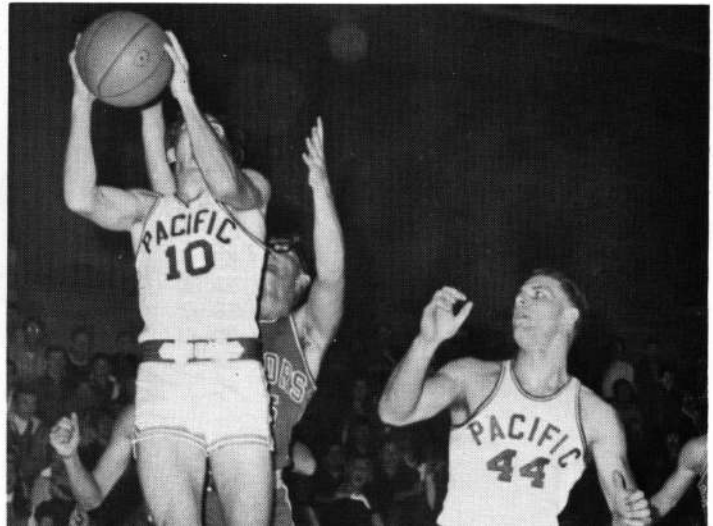

# Excellent Teamwork Earns Frosh 19-1 Record

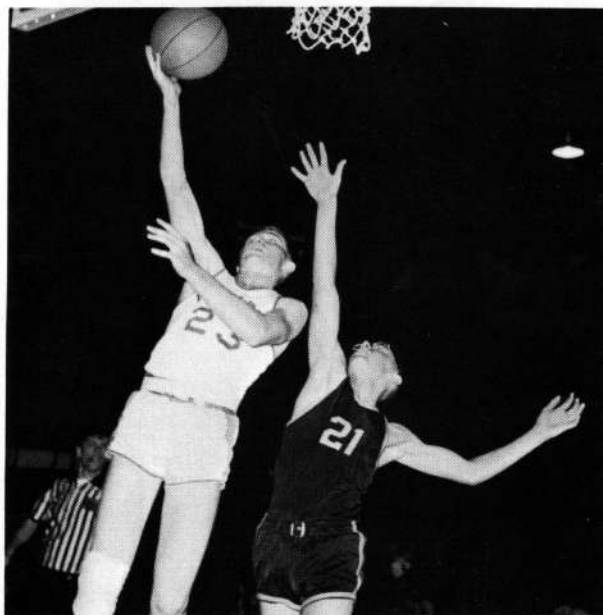

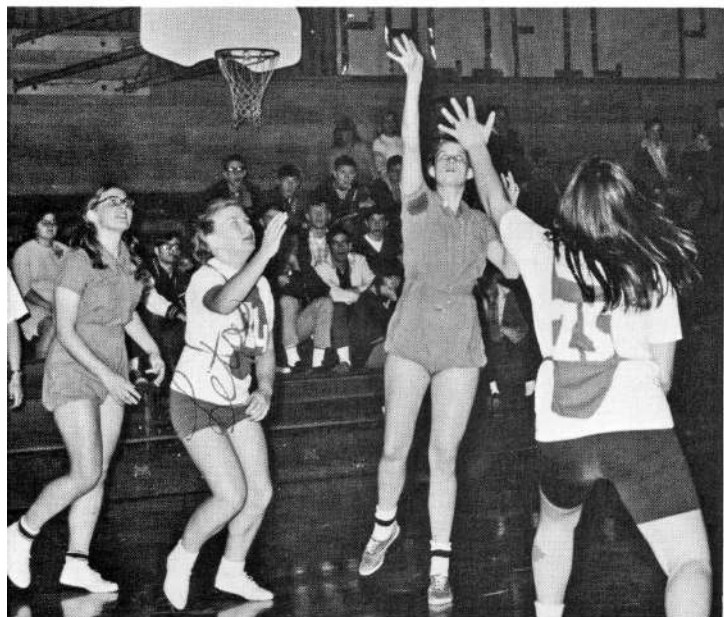

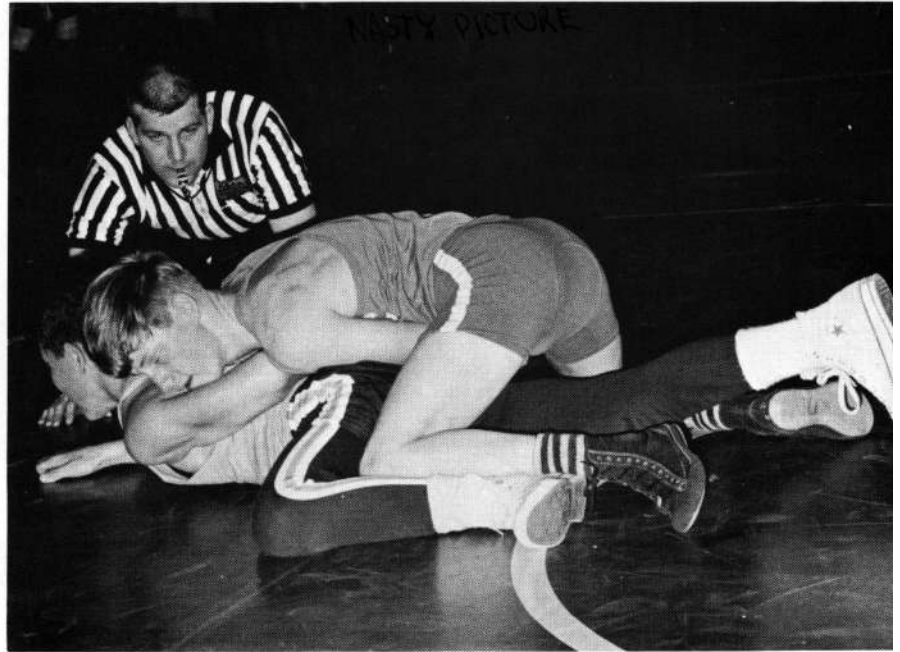
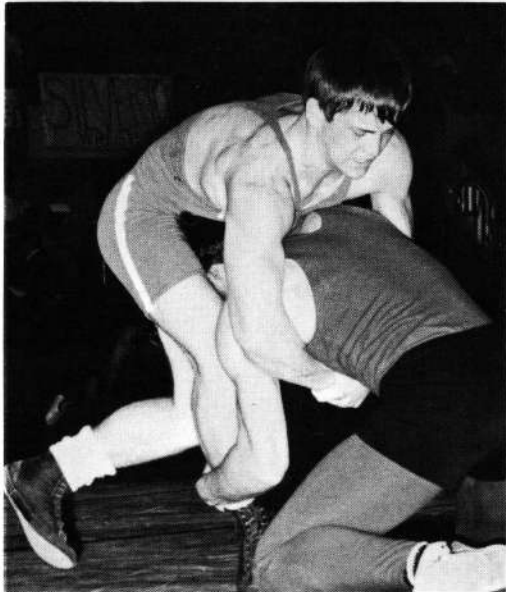

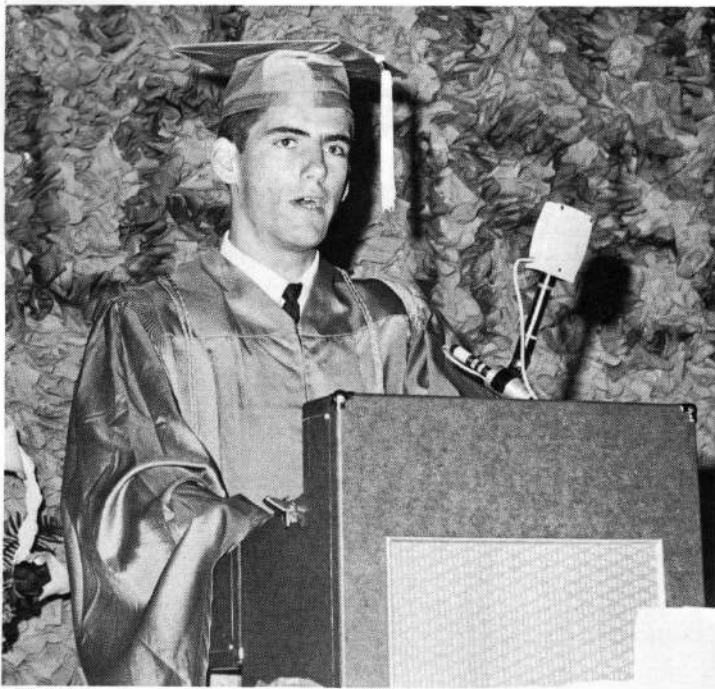

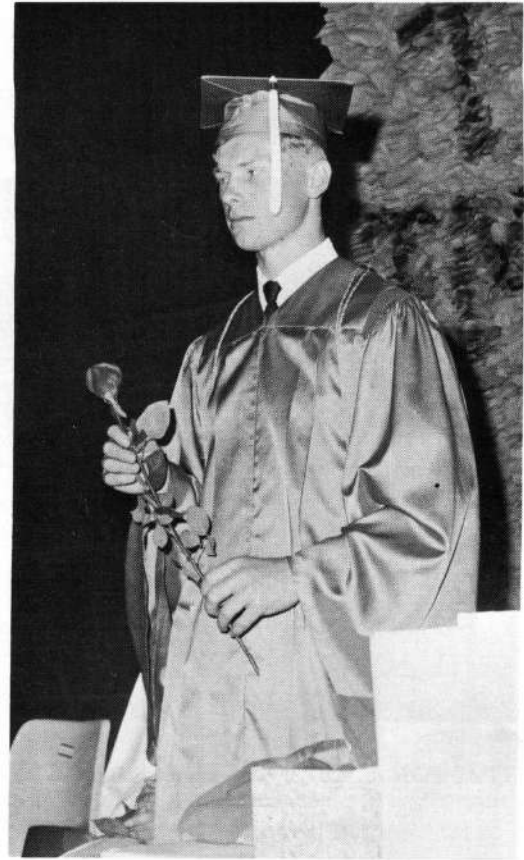
