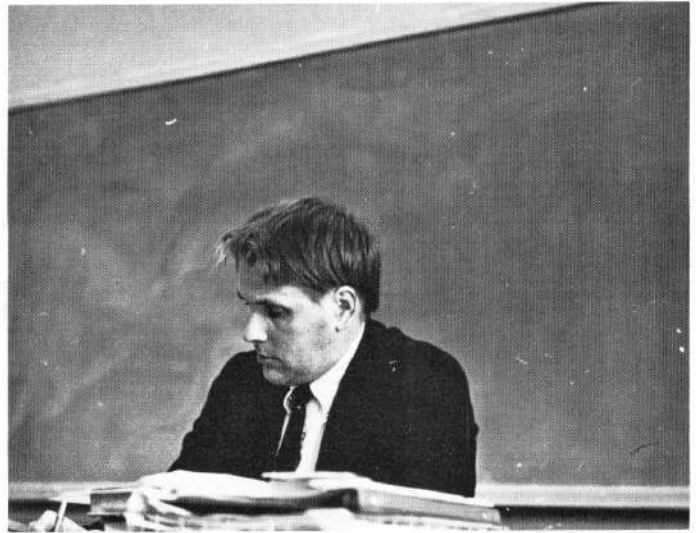


DOUGLAS C. ORTON

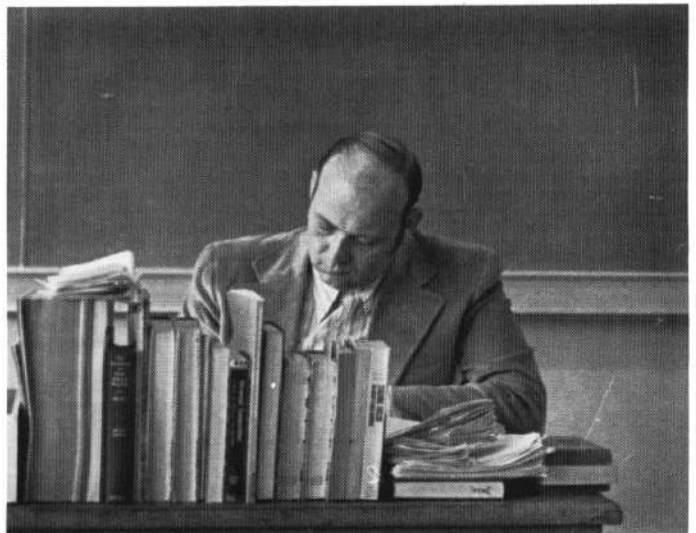


ALIDA R. BENDER

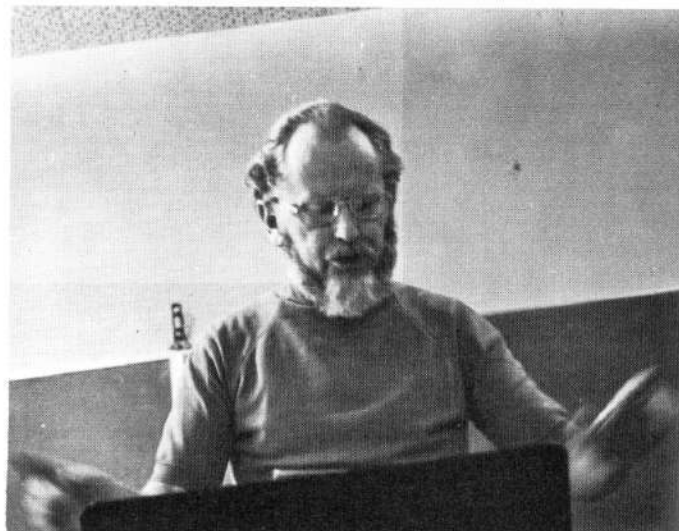


THOMAS W. RADCLIFFE

Miss Wilson, who grew up in Roseburg, is a graduate of Roseburg High School, and holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Oregon State University.

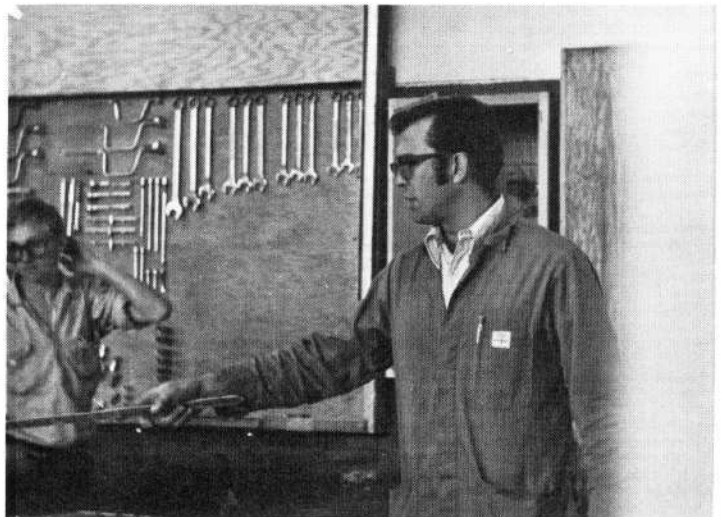


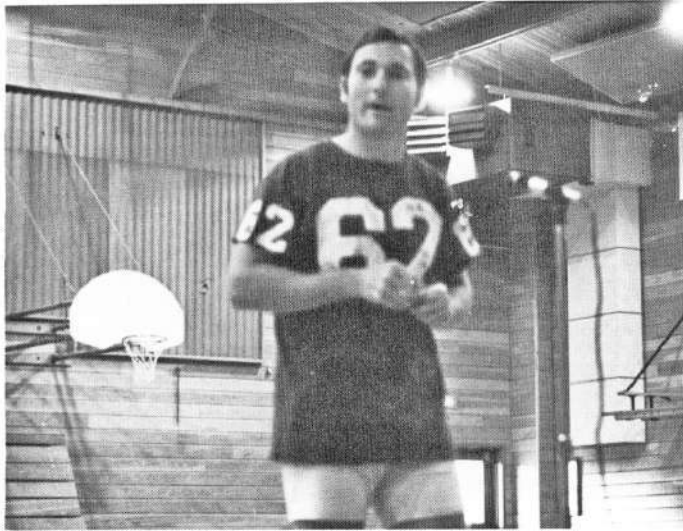
GLEN A. KADELBACH

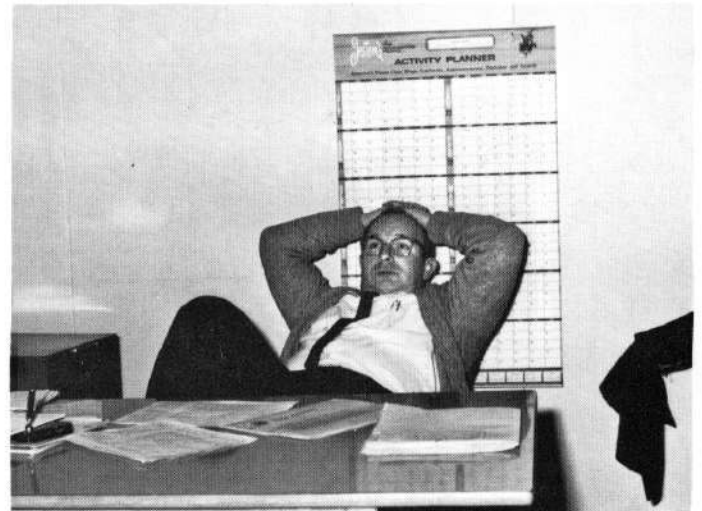
BARBARA R. DODRILL

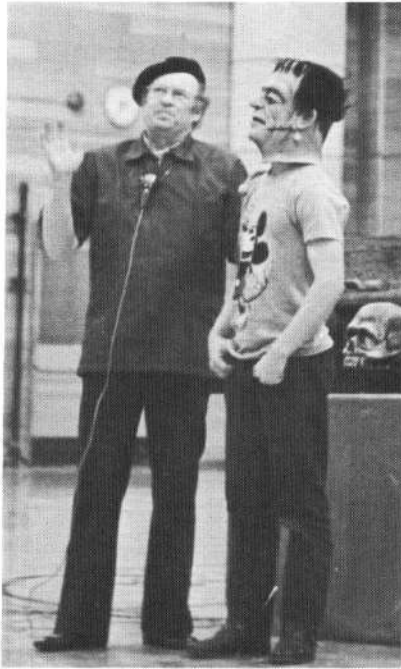


The Future Business Leaders of America worked all through the year raising money to go to the state convention. They attended many community meetings and took part in activities through out the year.

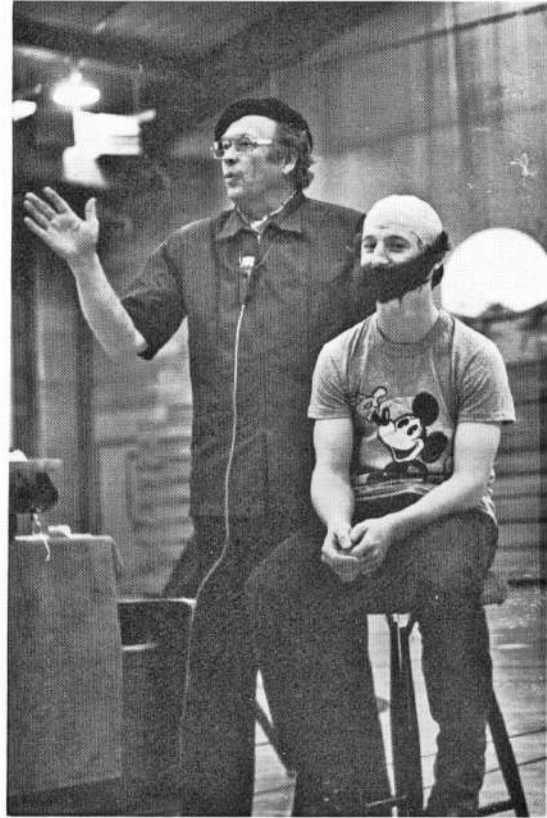

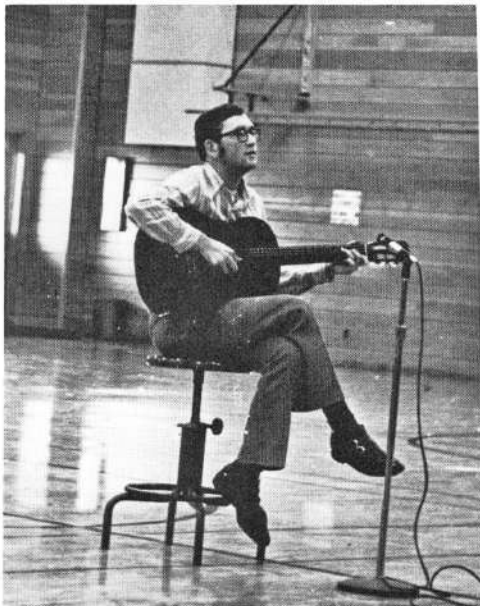




# ASSEMBLIES

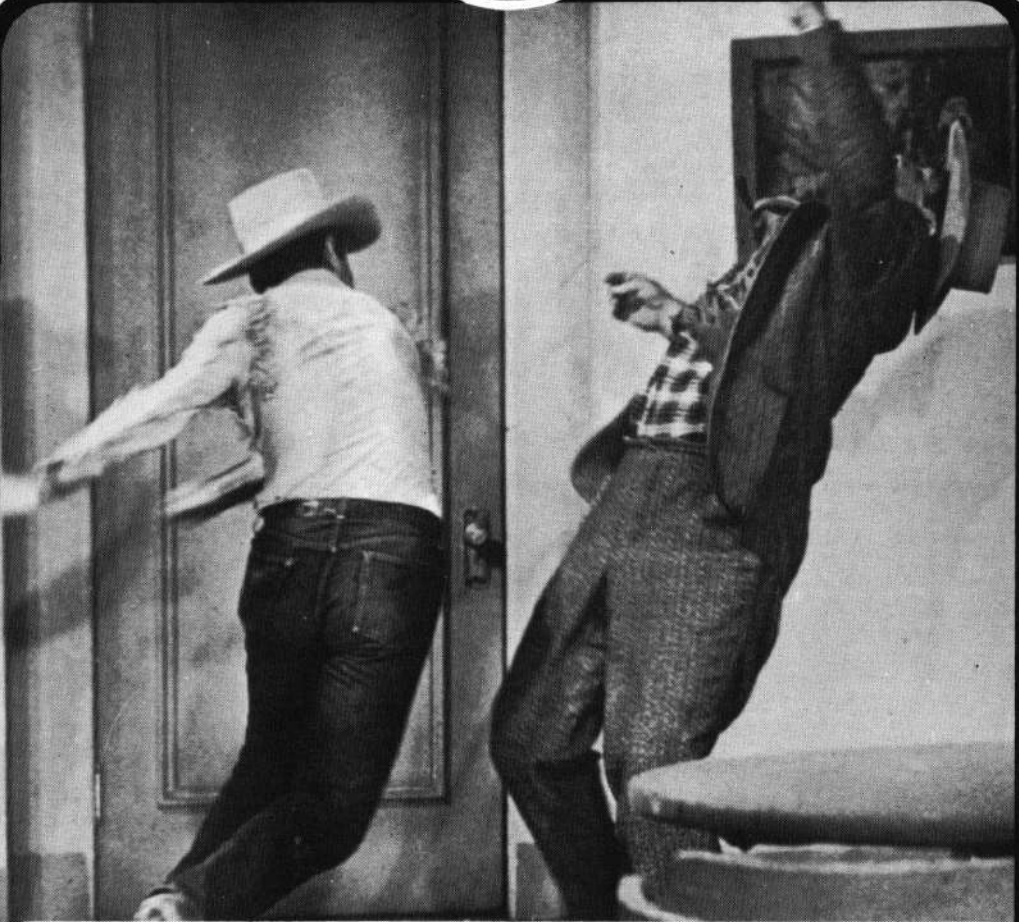


The Snake Man gave an assembly on reptiles and snakes. He had many live specimens and gave the audience a few scares.

Graduation for the class of '72 was held on Thursday evening, May 25th, at the high school gymnasium. Thirty-five seniors graduated.

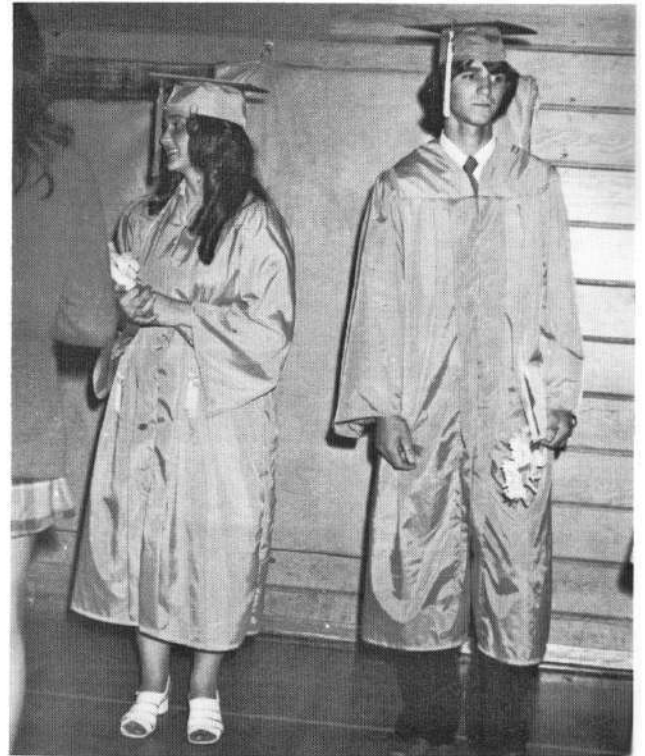
