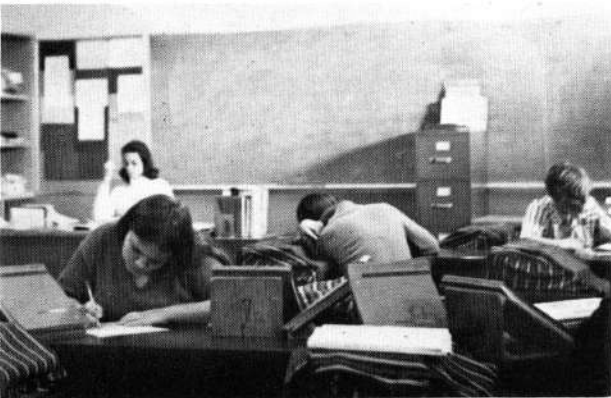
# FACULTY

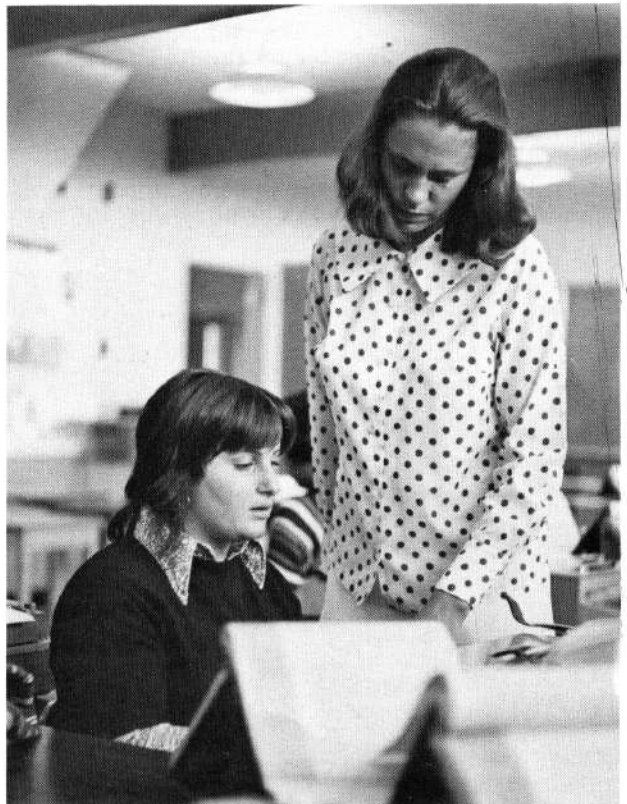

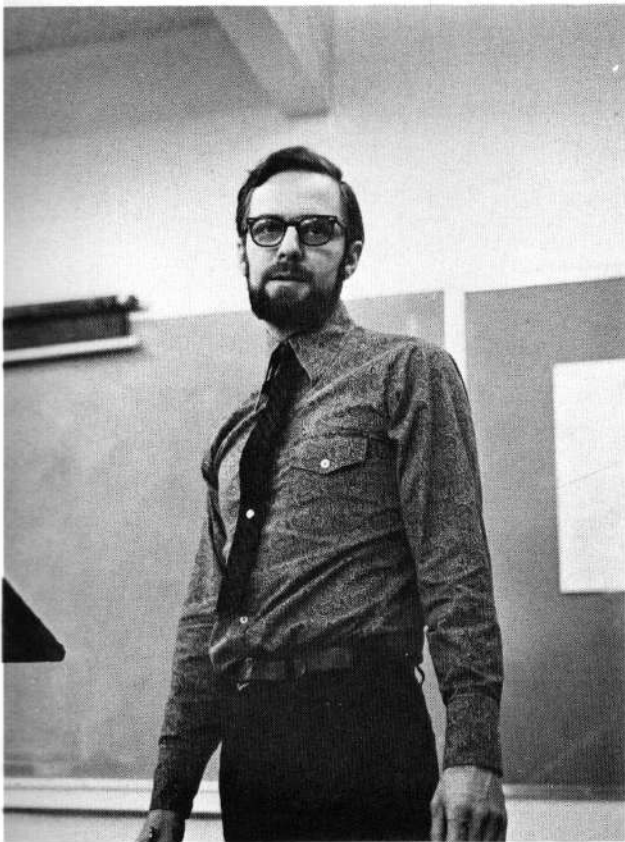

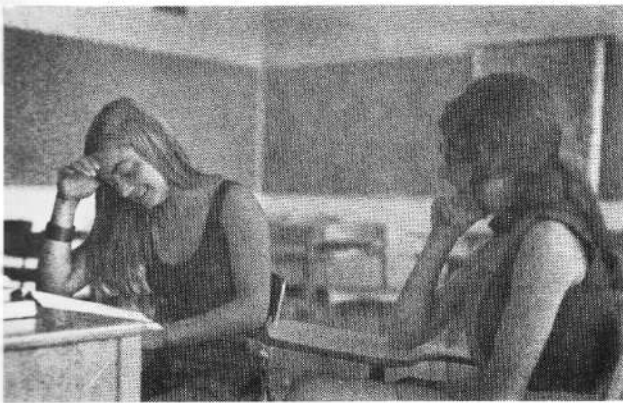




THOMAS W. RADCLIFFE

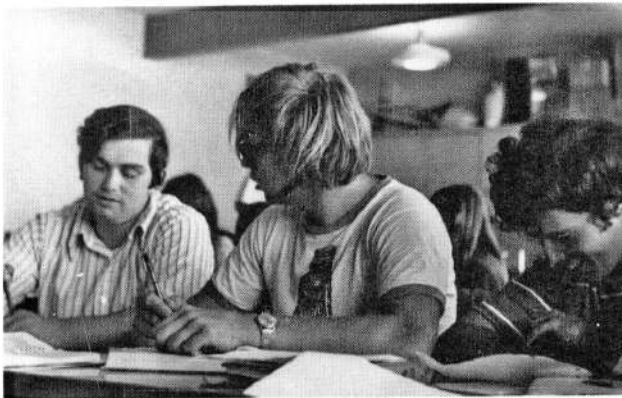
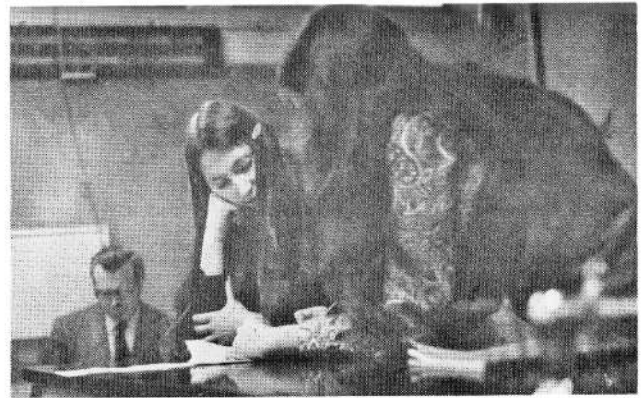




WILLIAM K. JOHNSON

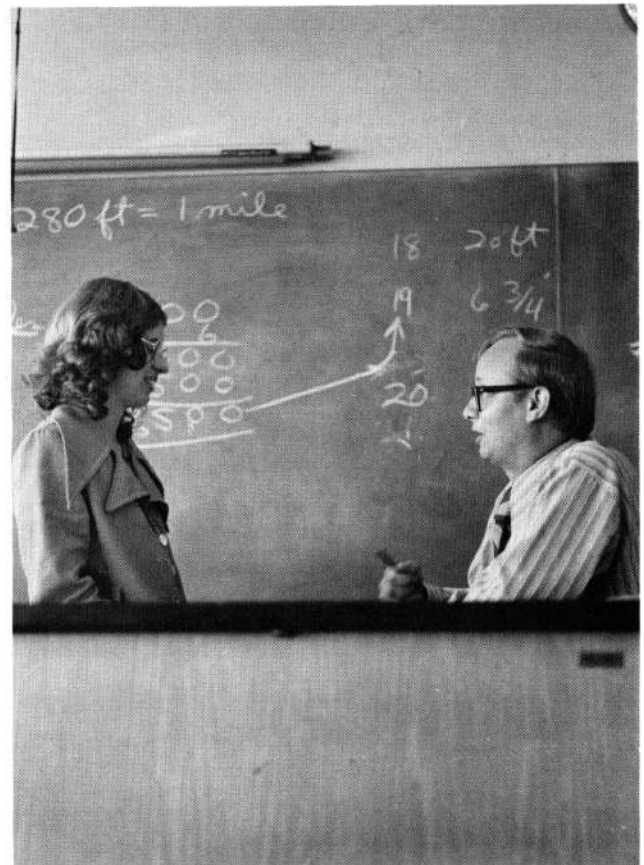

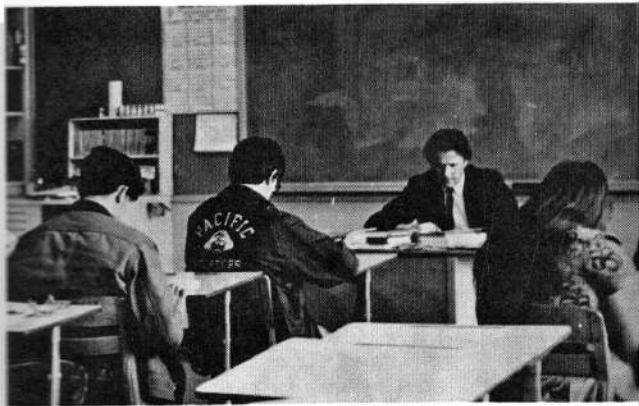
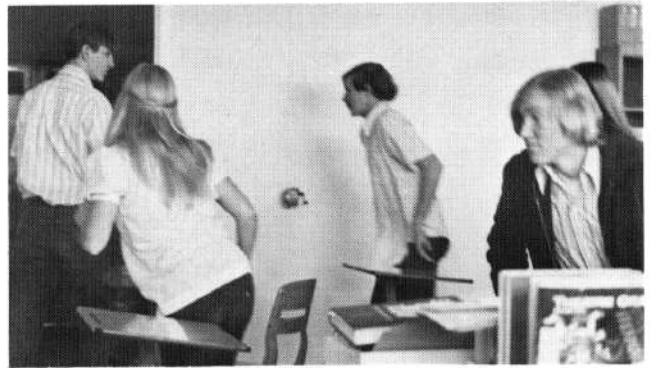


MARSHALL D. DAVIS

He teaches English III and IV, Speech and Annual. He is also an advisor to the Junior class. Mr. Davis has been at Pacific High School since 1970.

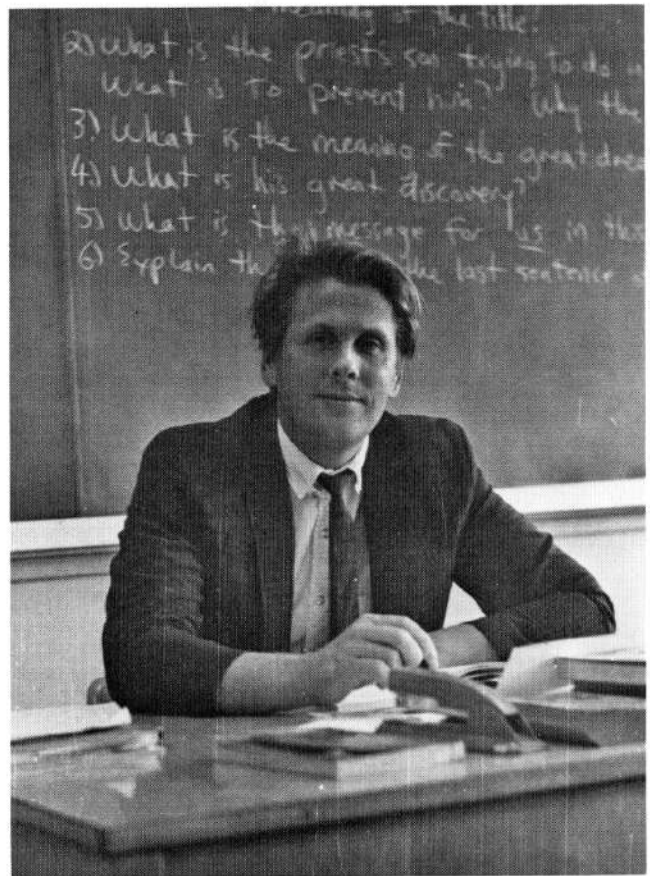

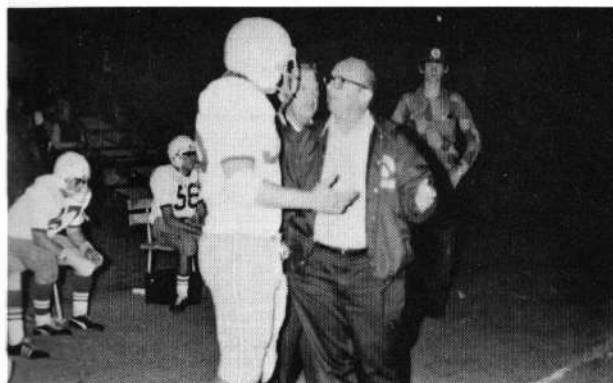




DONNA J. BERRIER

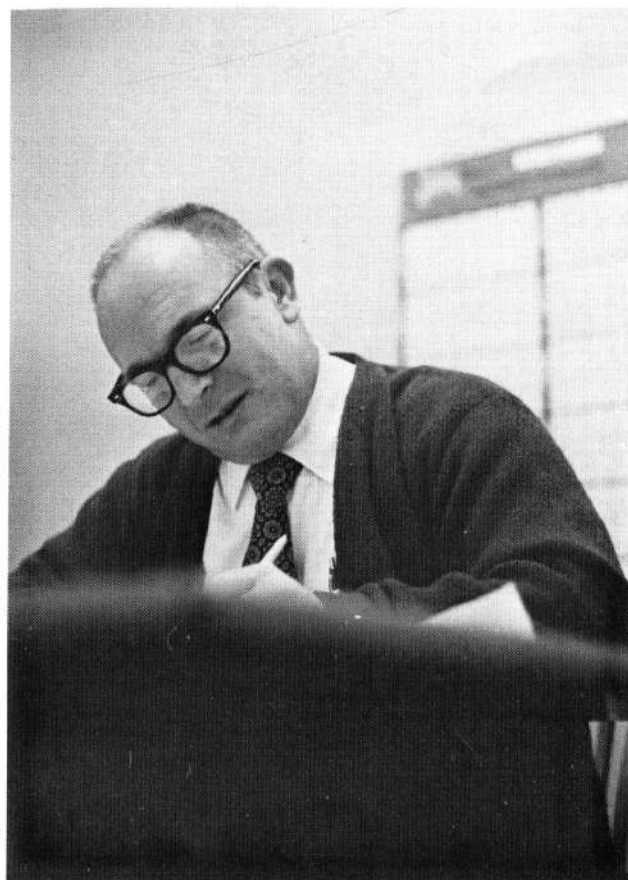

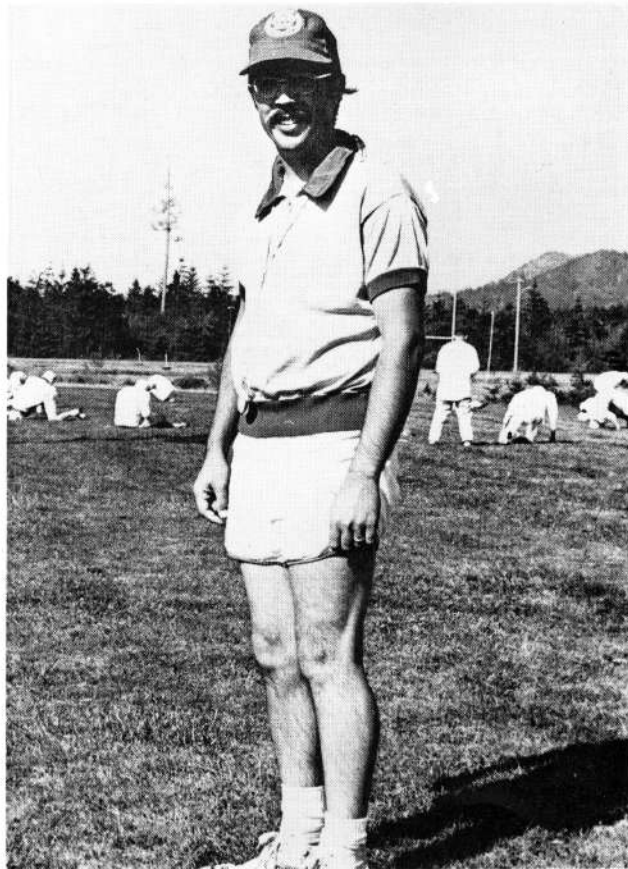

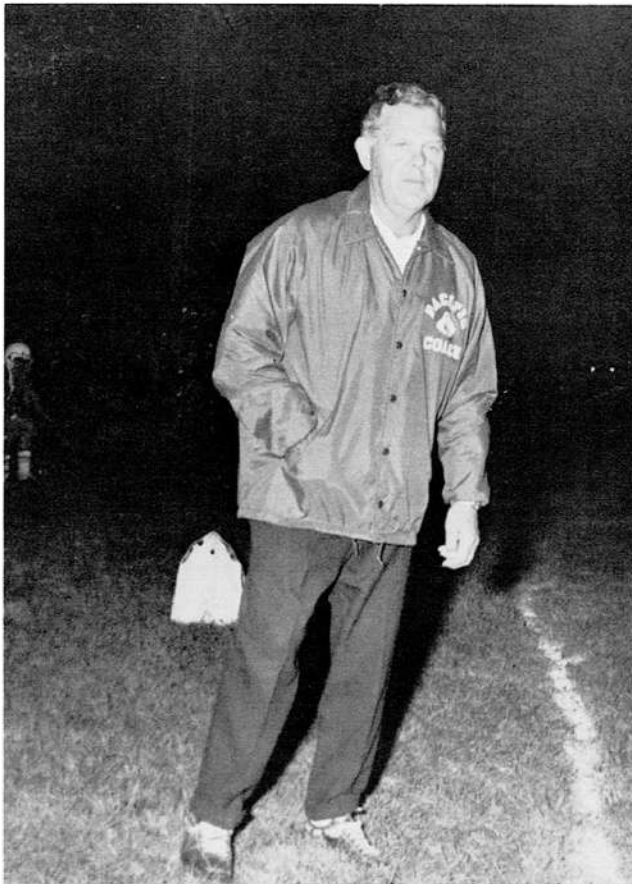

MERRITT G. MCKEEL

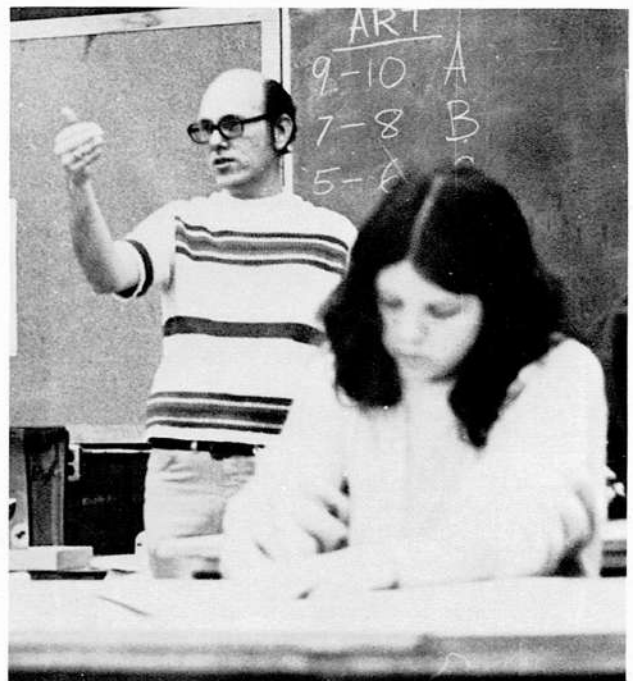

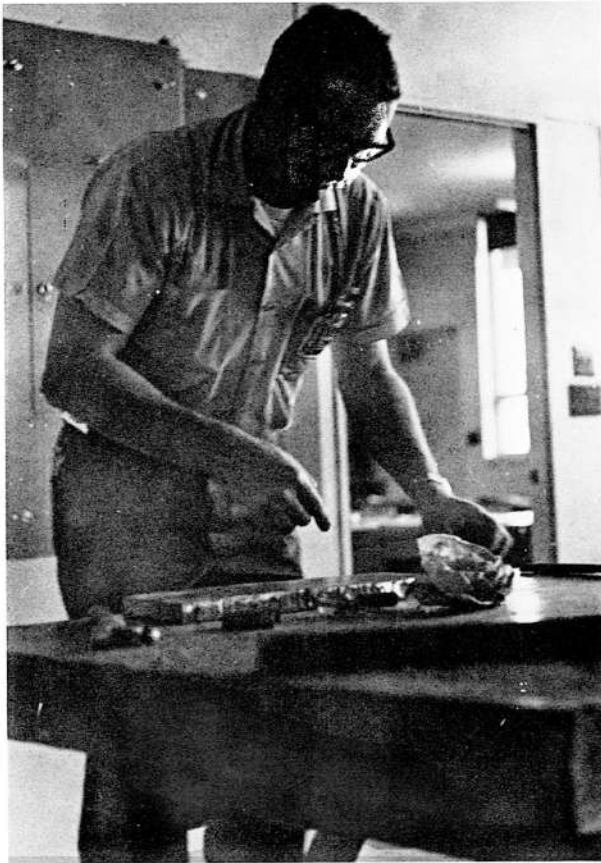

Mr. Tryk is a free-lance commercial artist and photographer from Los Angeles. He began teaching art at Pacific this year.

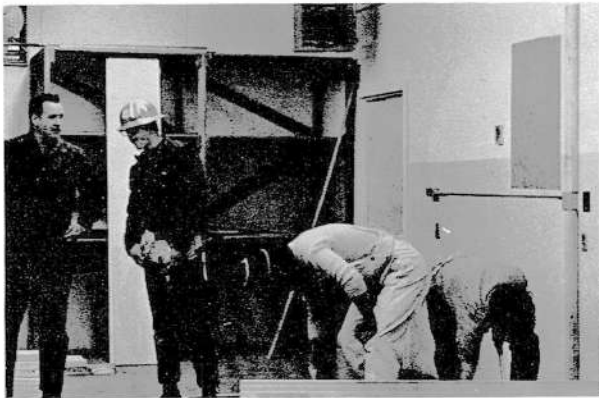




DALE M. REEVES

Mr. John Wahl, Principal of the high school, and two other members of the faculty presented scholarships worth \$8,600 to seventeen Seniors.

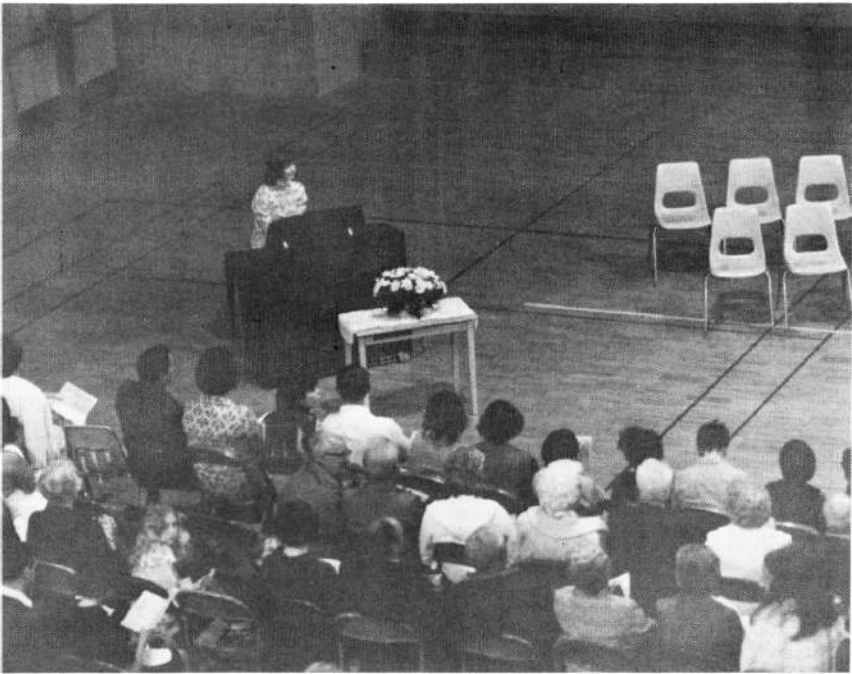
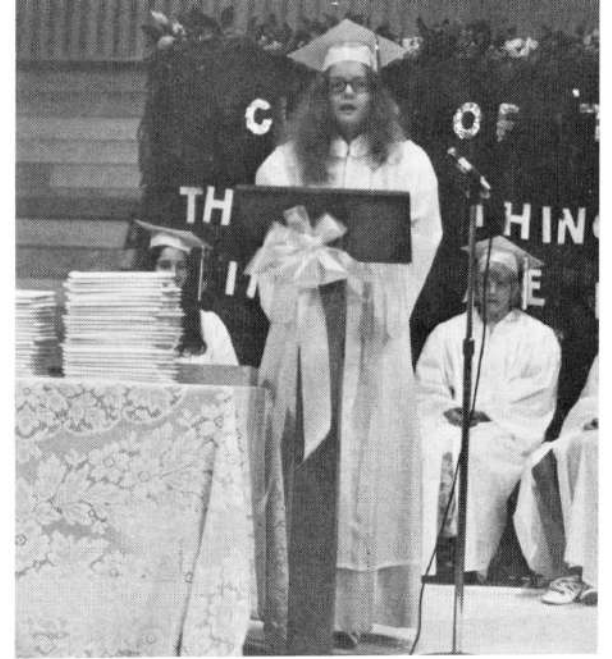
