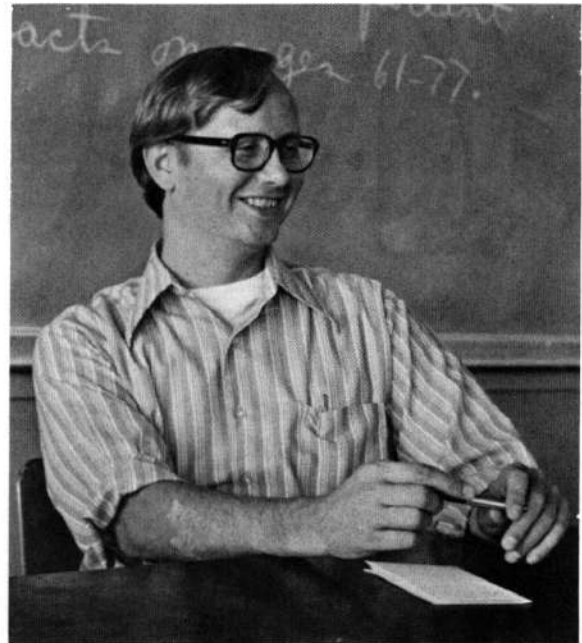
Mr. Johnson and Mr. Davis talk about their worries on the day before school starts.

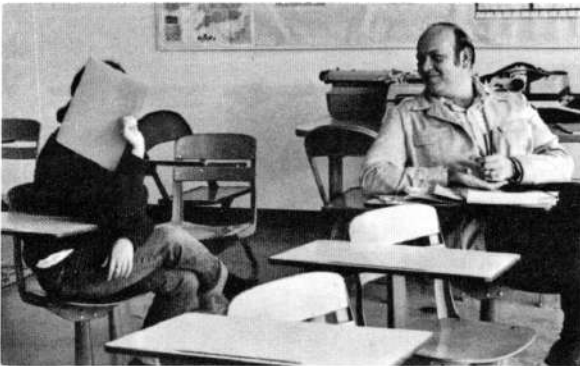

After the football game many Pacific students and alumni attended the dance held in the balcony. The music was provided by Motra. By midnight another homecoming had ended and everyone had their own memories.

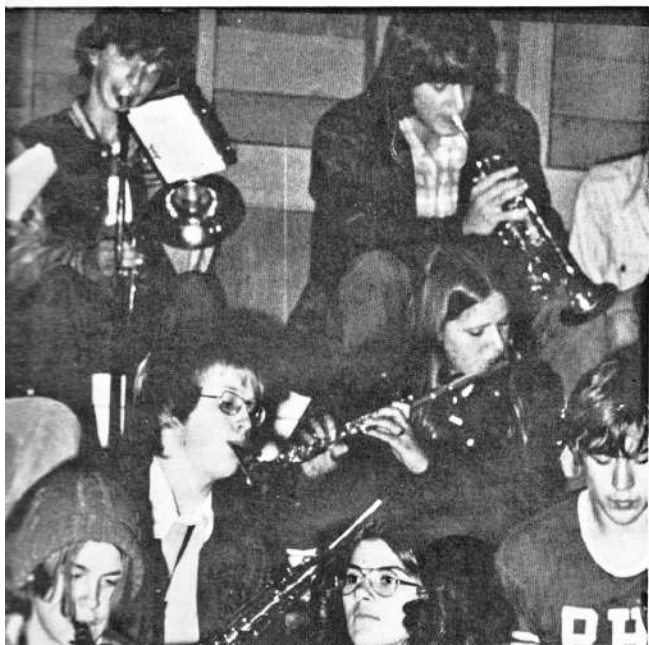

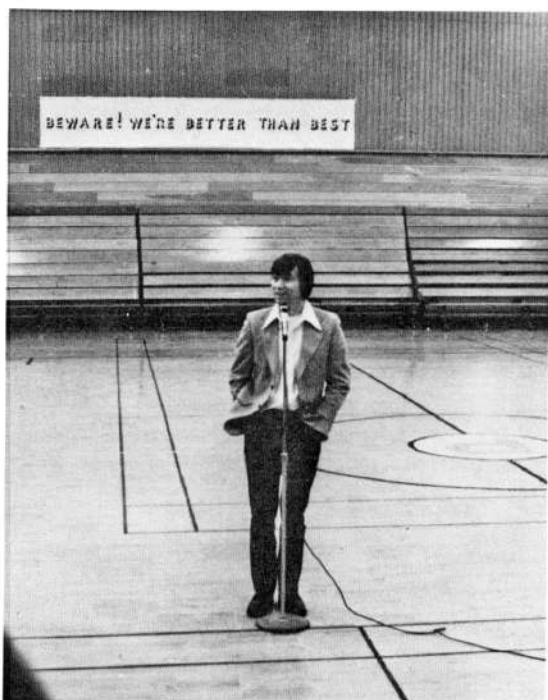

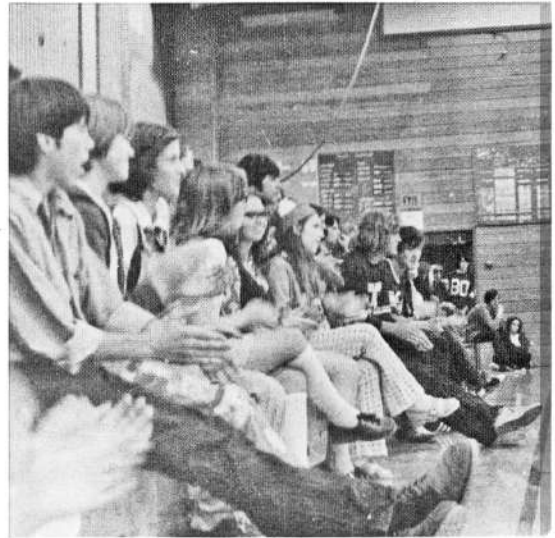

The Lettermen have a meeting to discuss the activities they plan to have.



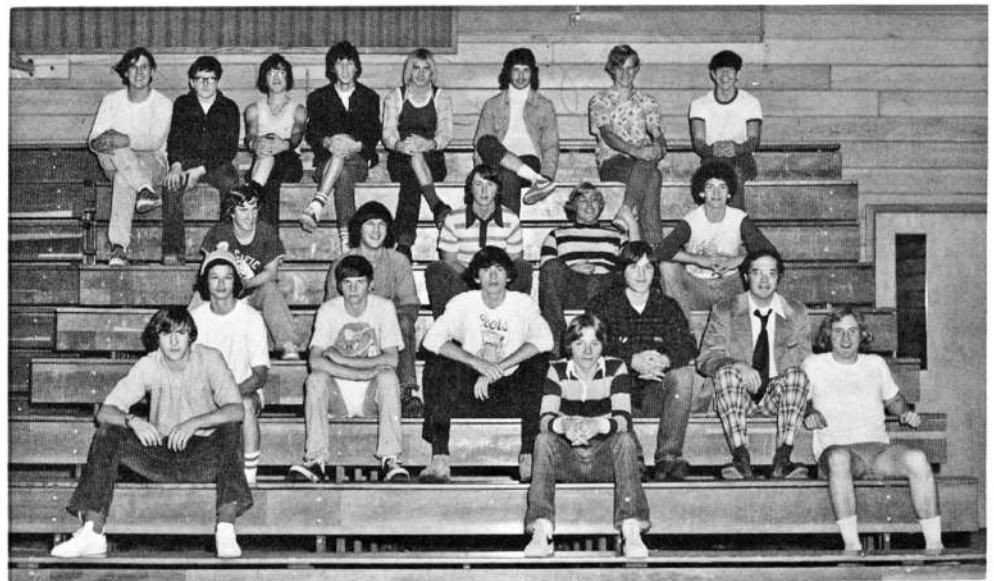

Membership in the Pacific Lettermen's Club shall consist of boys who have earned an athletic varsity letter in a sport either as a participant or as manager.

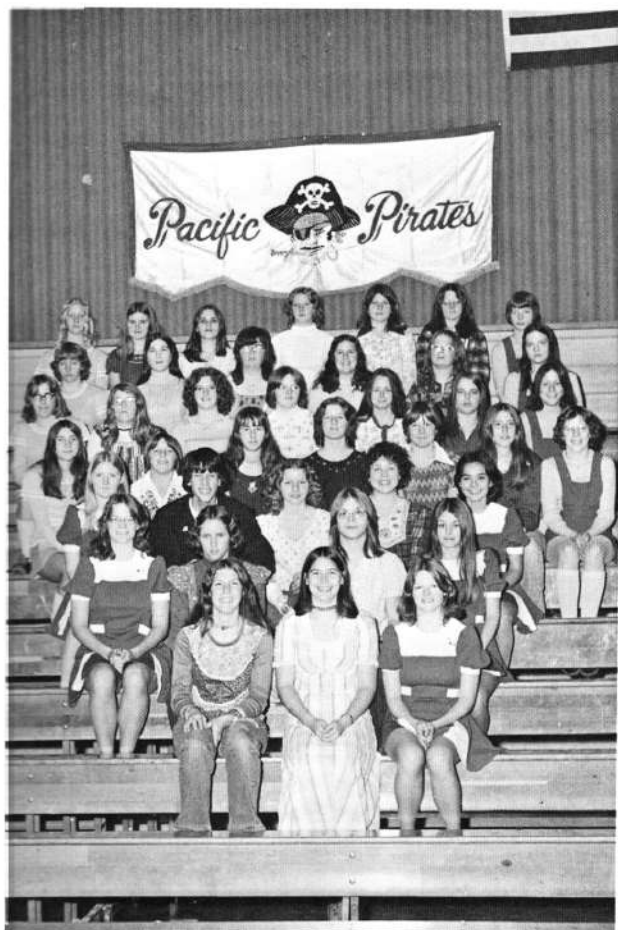
To retain membership in the organization, a boy must earn an additional letter each year after original admittance unless physical disability prevents this.

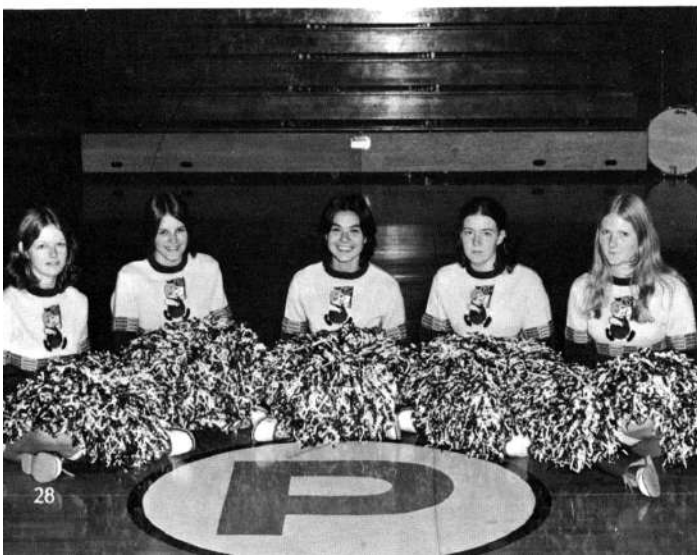

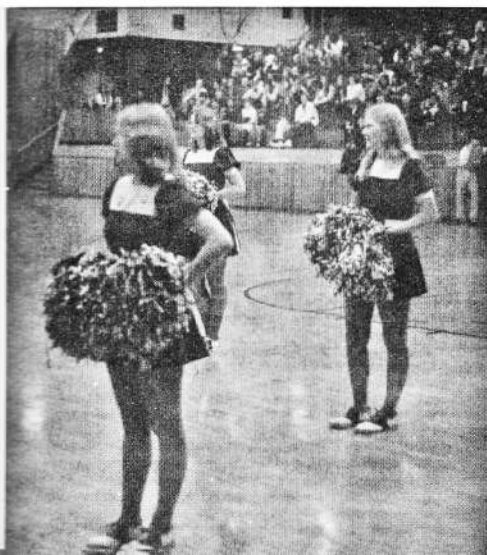

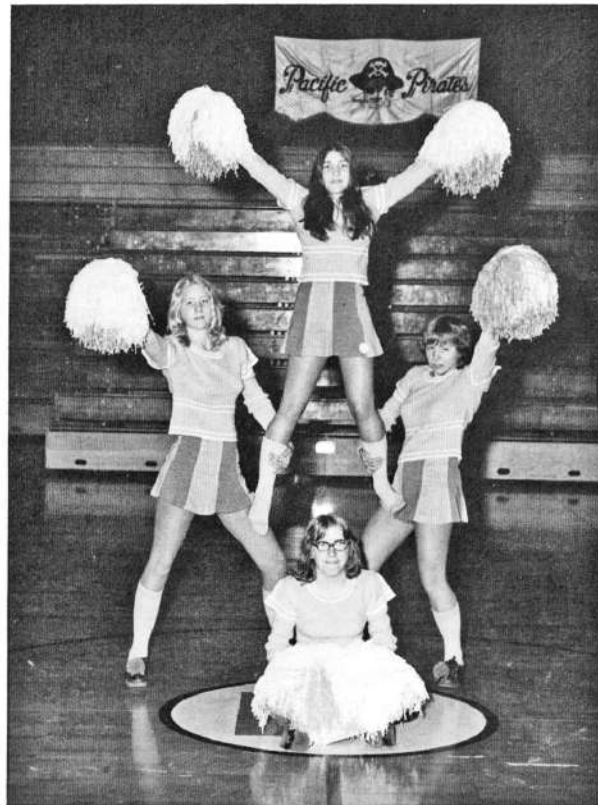

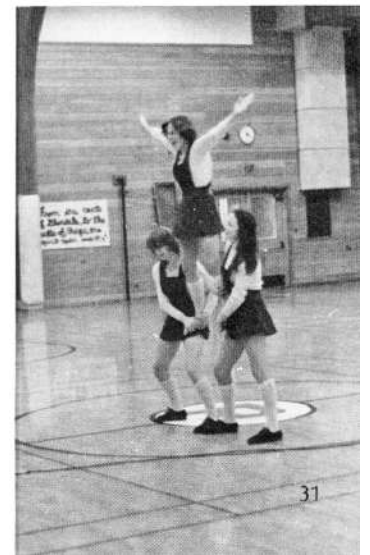

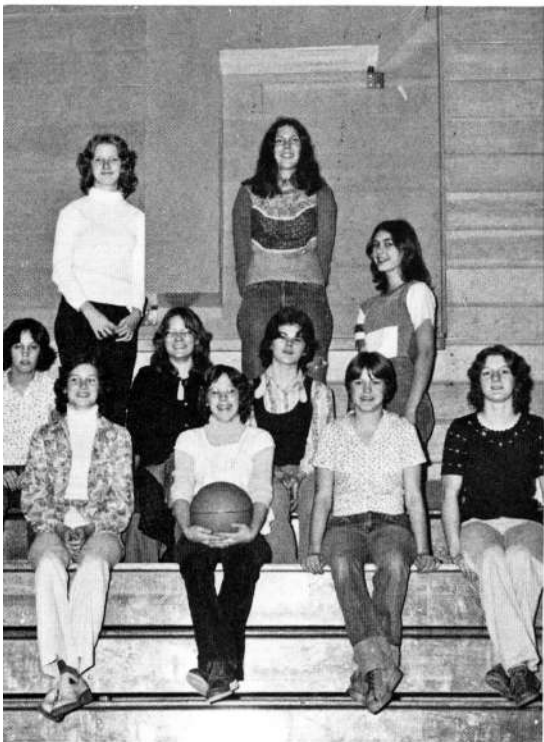

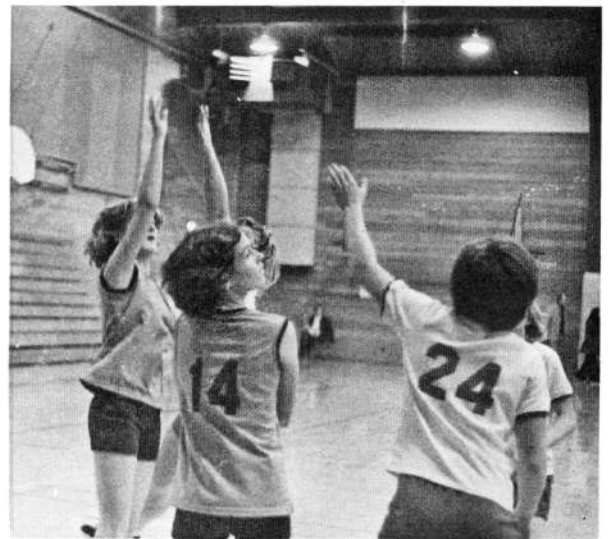

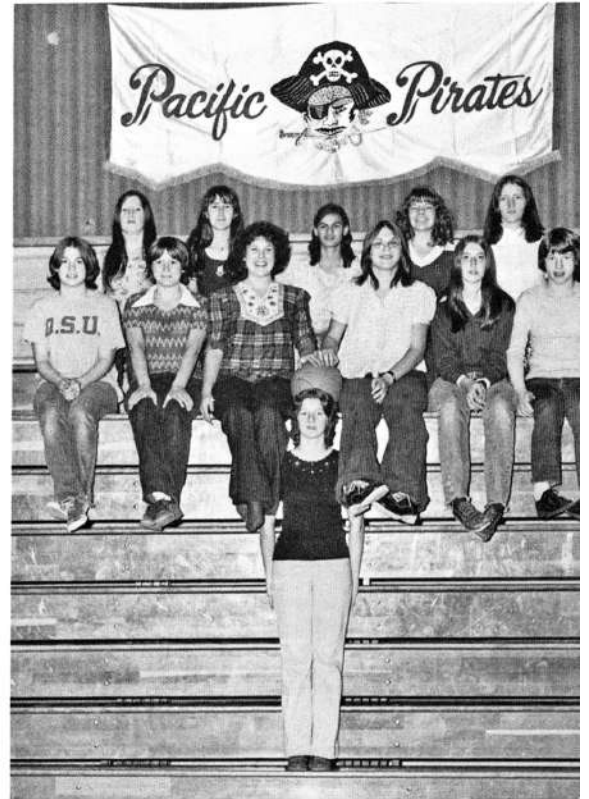

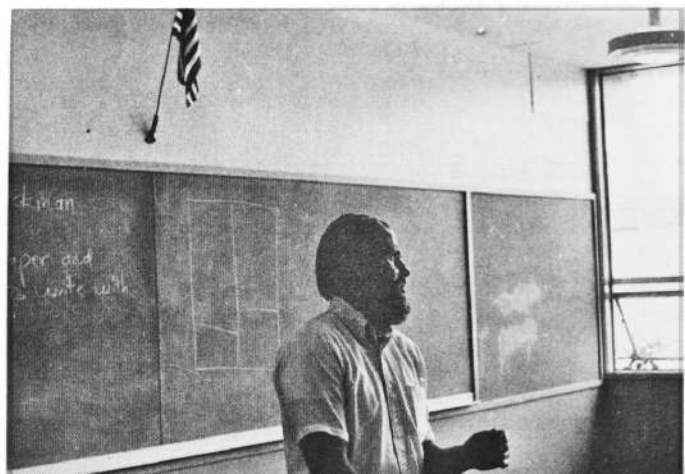
