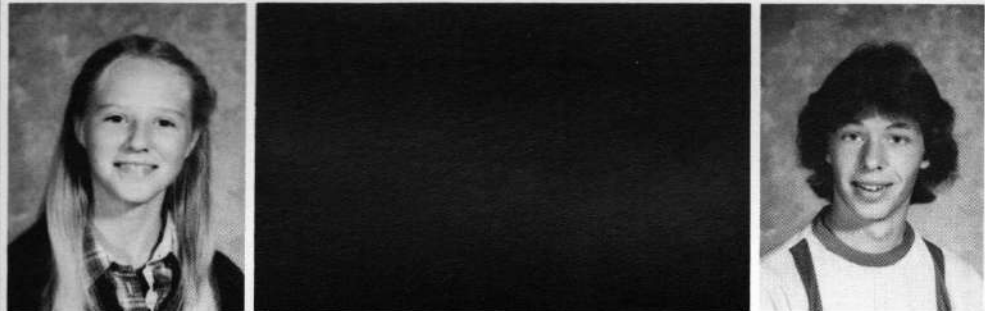
Teachers And Students Make Plans For A Terrific Year

2CJ SCHOOL BOARD MAKES IMPORTANT POLICY DECISIONS



Several Ideas Prove Controversial

Among the actions taken which affected P.H.S. students, the board decided to increase the credits needed for graduation from 21 to 25, effective with the class of 1980. They decided to segregate the buses to athletic events and to increase the athlete's meal allowance from \$1.50 to \$2.00. They approved the Junior Prom being held in Coos Bay, and decided tentatively to have Drivers Education as a separate class.

Some students visit with teachers who remain in the rooms during the lunch period. Occasionally someone will study for a test, but mostly noon is for gossiping with your friends.

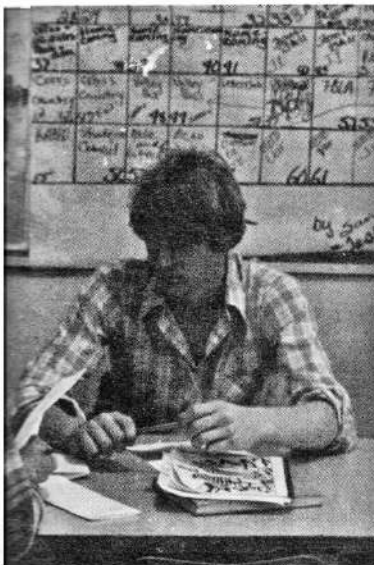

Pirates Have Football Mania

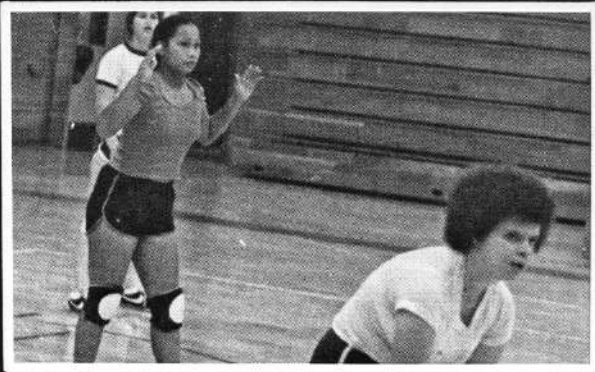

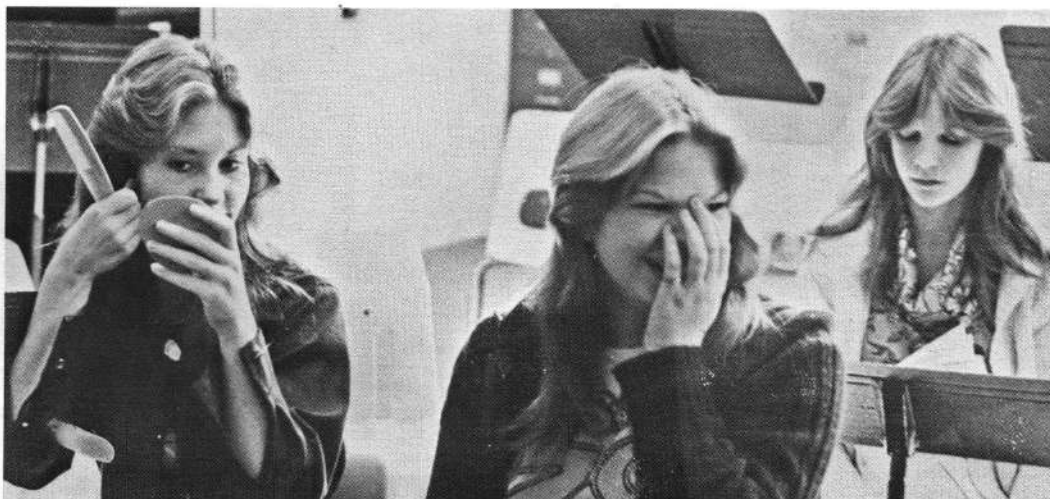
Sings In Concert; For Charity
