Dr. Wood has been the Superintendent of District 2CJ since 1981. He has a Ed.D degree. He was an administrator in Colorado before coming to our school district.

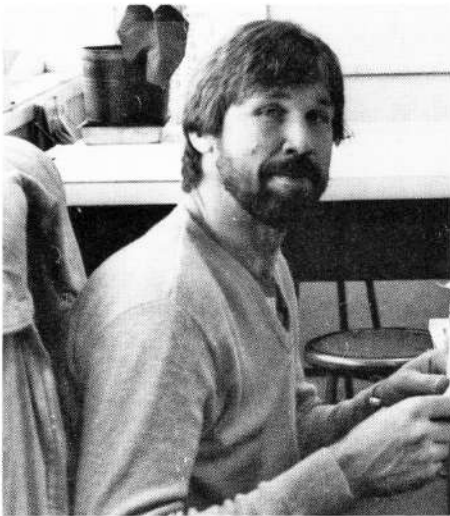
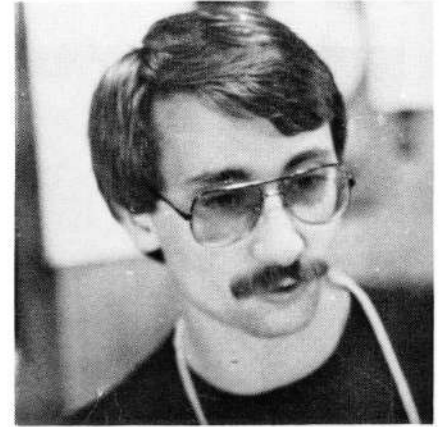

It is telling how to write, showing how to type, making smelly gases and chemical marvels.

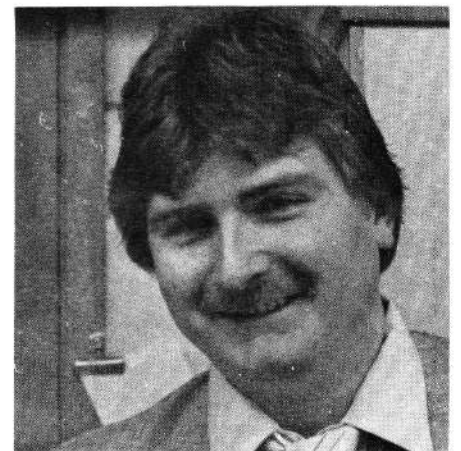
It is to be an example, to deal in both the practical and the theoretical, to show patience, to use a hundred different approaches when the first ninety-nine didn't work.

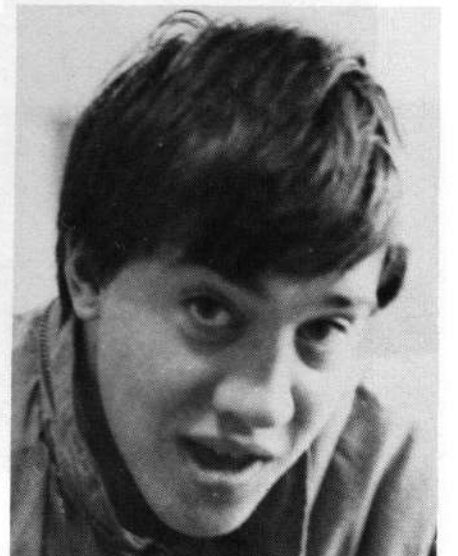
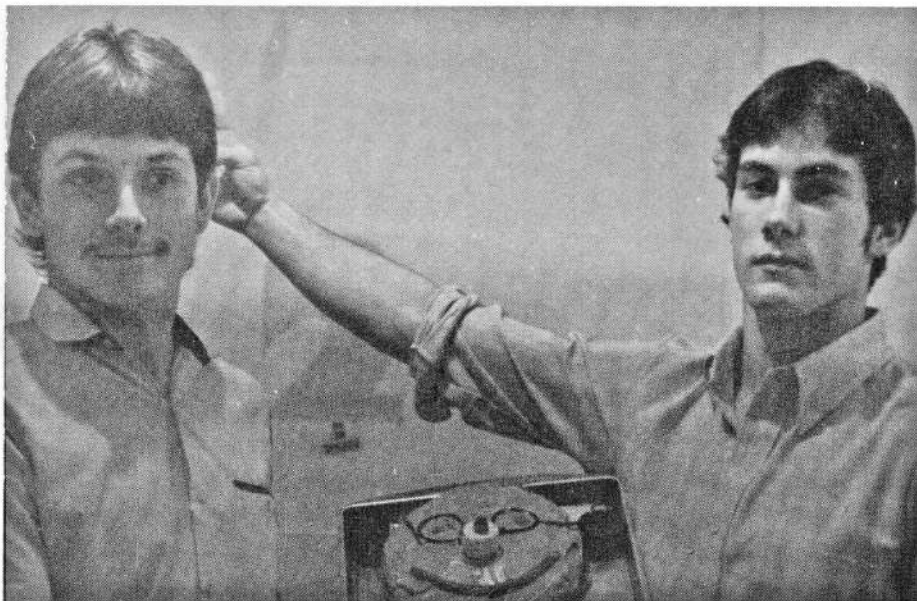
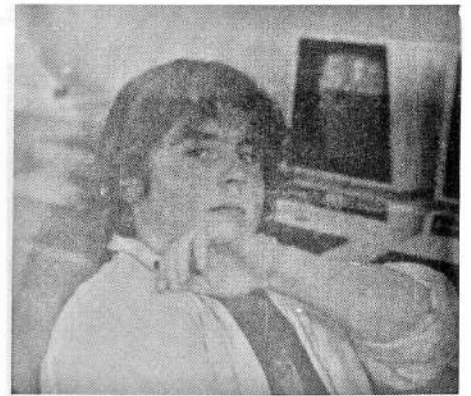


Board Appoints Many Education Committees

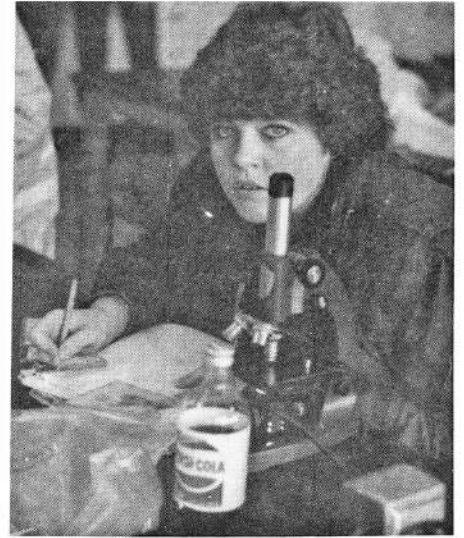
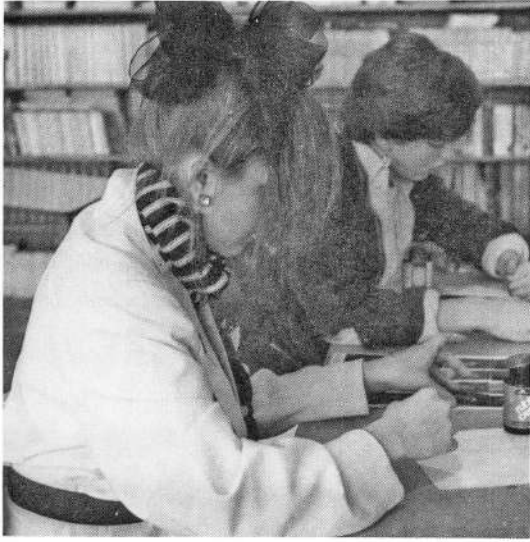
The school board during the 1984-85 school year appointed a number of committees to consider improvements for the future. Among the committees named were these:

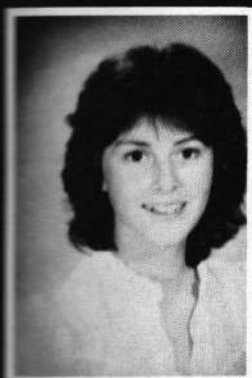
Being a sophomore is:

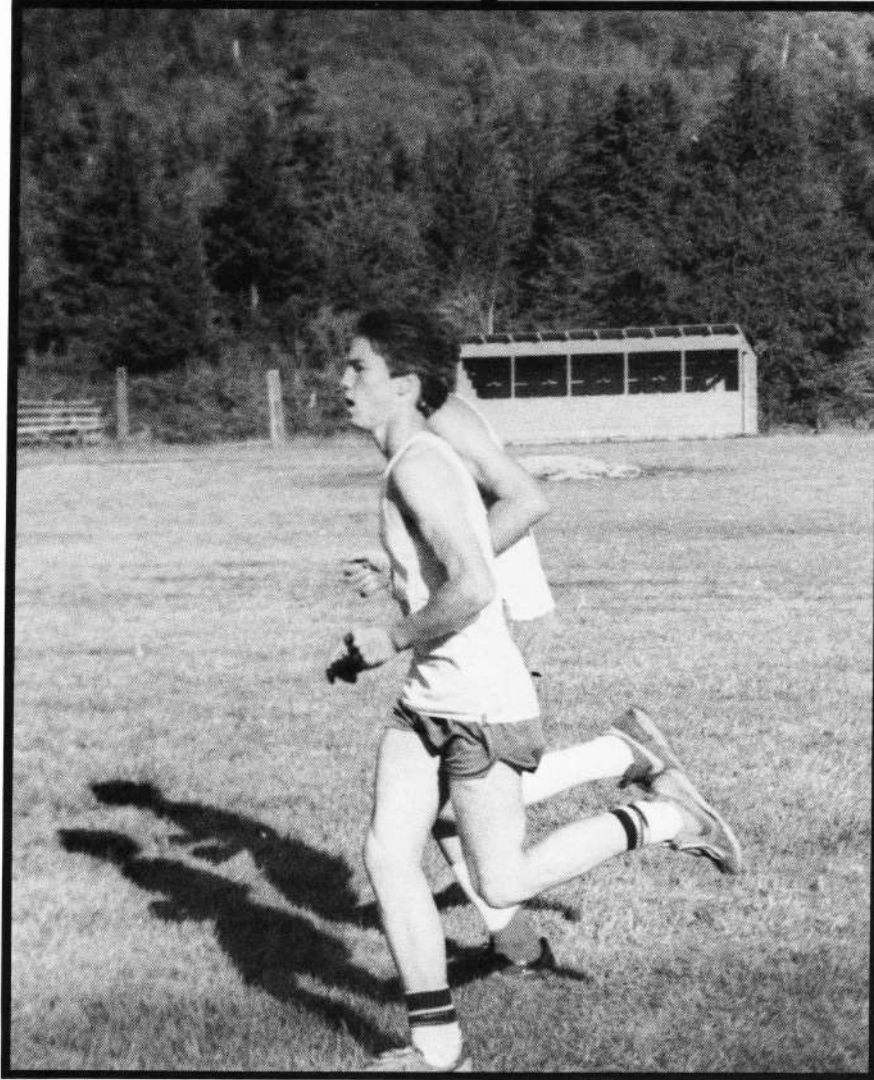


Juniors become new leaders

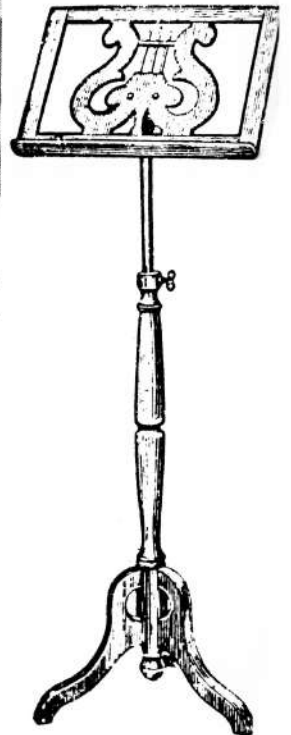
Wenzel Leads Band

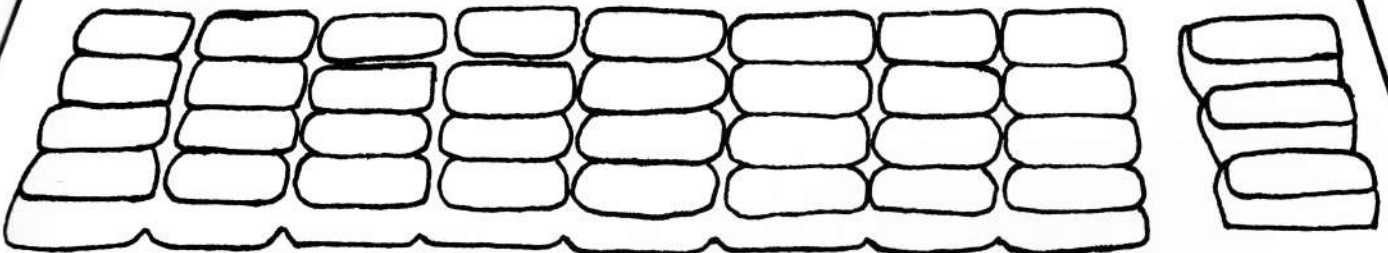
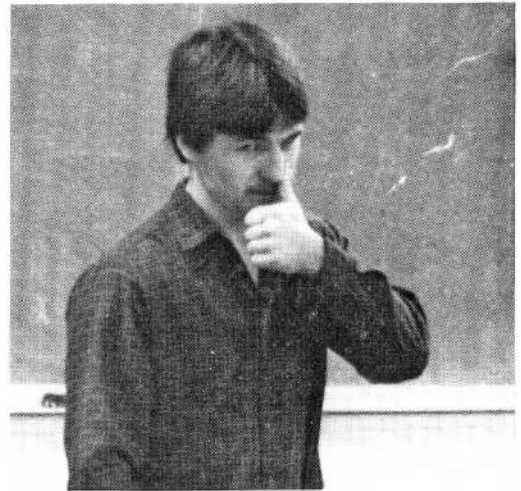


The 1985 Computer Club was composed of six club members. The club President was David Baker, and the Vice President was Michael Webb.

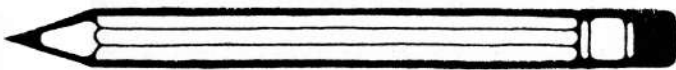

Future Business Leaders Of America

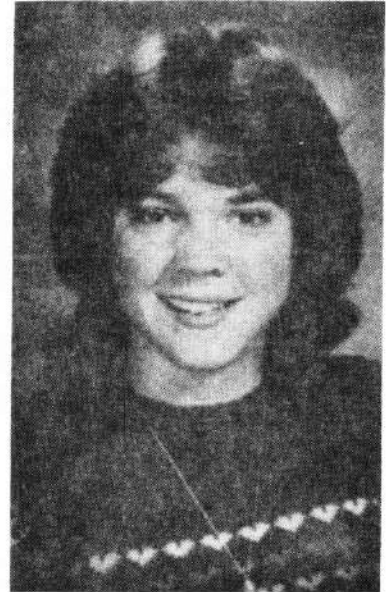

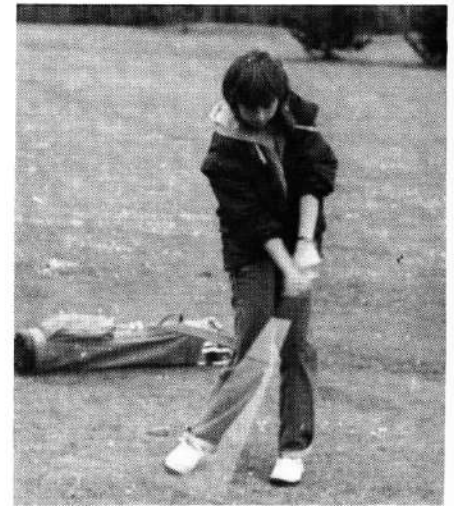
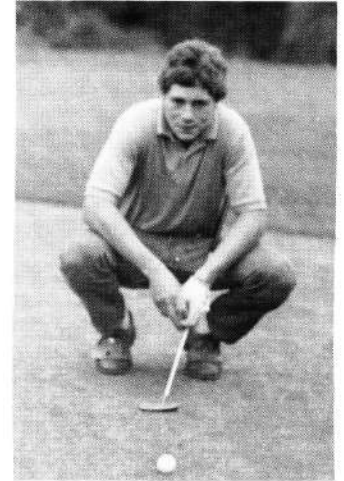
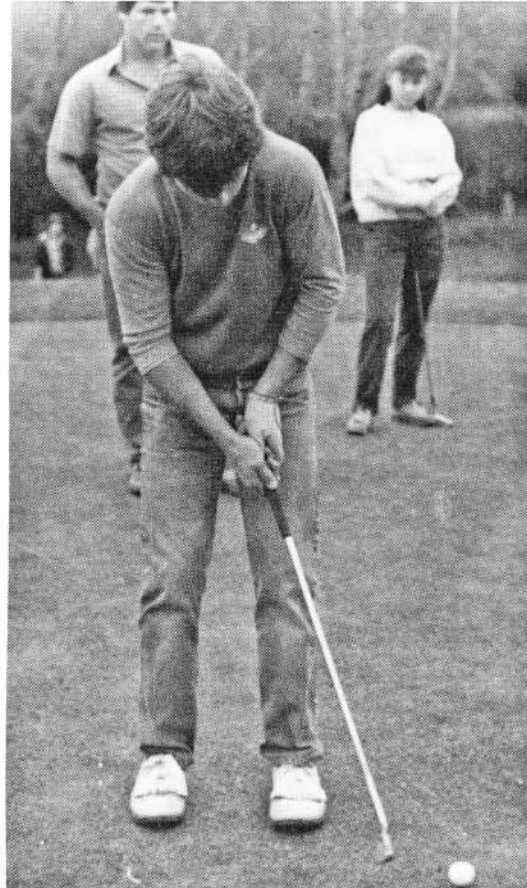
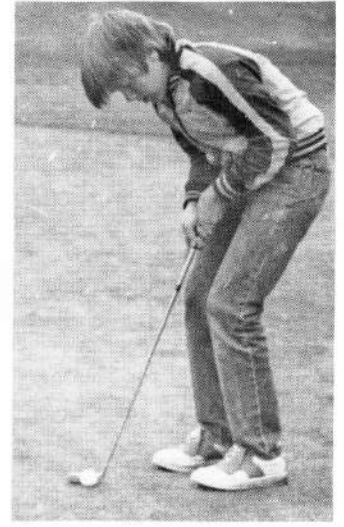
The only person who went to state was Marion Dallison, who placed fifth in the javelin.
