




History




Dale Bures is the science teacher. He graduated from Oregon State University with a Master's degree.




Janet Kerker graduated from the University of California/Davis with a B.A. in Spanish. She has done post-graduate work at the University of Oregon.



You were freshmen, but you lived through it, and in the future you can help put other freshmen classes through their paces. It is part of you rite of passage on a P.H.S. student.





This year's officers are President Josh McDermott; Vice-President Tom Lee; and Secretary/Treasurer, Shelley Pendergrass.





Bits And Bytes: Computer Club






Putting together a yearbook is one of the hardest — and most satisfying — jobs high school students can do.












Following is the text of Coach Gore's remarks on the basketball season delivered at the dessert awards banquet:

It took a lot of hard work, but the last 3 or 4 games this year I'm proud to say we had 9 varsity level players on this team."





Most of the group found the trip interesting and enjoyable.


