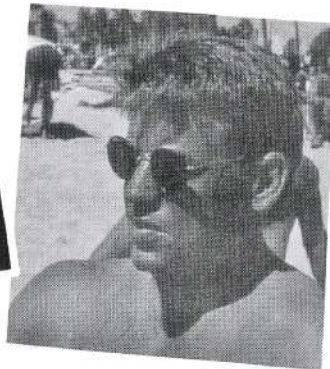


The 1992-93 school year was filled with many events both in our school and out, that deserve to be recognized when we look back as the year comes to a close.

Their standoff in Waco, Texas at the Branch Davidian Compound ended in late April when the compound caught or was purposely set on fire. Koresh and as many as 85 of his followers died in the blaze.

We had television coverage of the March school board meeting, due to the teacher contract negotiations. The 1993 Prom, "Winds of Change", was held April 24 at the Langlois Lions Club. Graduation was held June 4.



The World Series was won by the Toronto Blue Jays. The Dallas Cowboys defeated the Buffalo Bills in the Super Bowl. Our cross-country teams went to state, where both Jennifer Cox and Randy Duncan placed 9th overall. The girls sent a team and placed 4th overall. The St. Marys basketball trip was an experience, due to heavy snow and ice both on the way there and back. The bus arrived back home at 5:00 A.M. The track team sent nine to state competition.

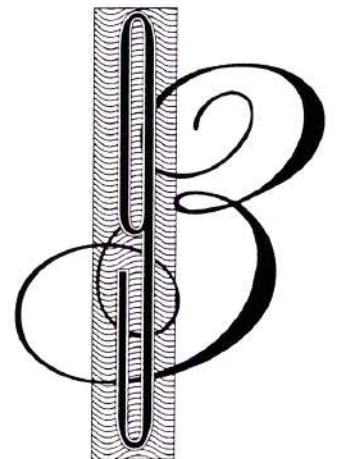

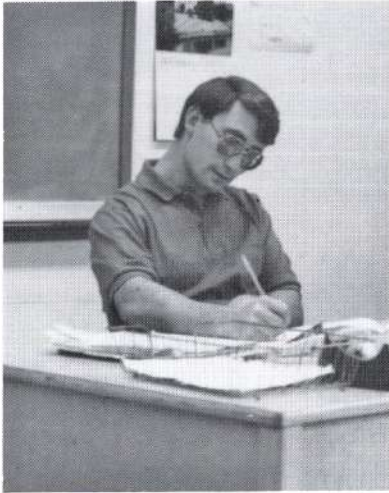

Jim Kistner is the instructor for Health, P.E., and Weight Training. He has a BS from Western Oregon state and a Standard from Southern Oregon State College.



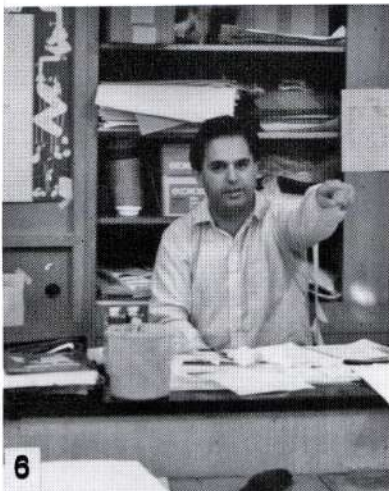

Stephen Hood is the Alternative Education Instructor. He has a BS in Environment and Resource/Geography from San Diego State University.

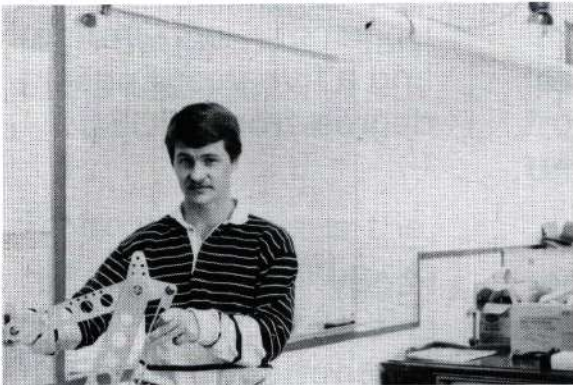

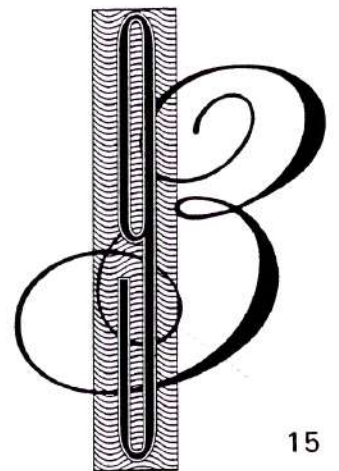

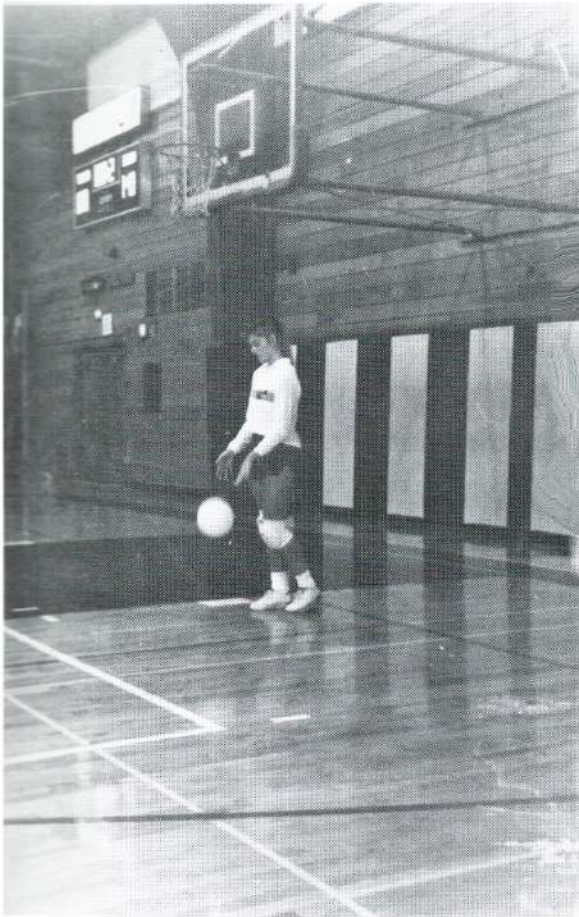

This year's basketball team finished with a 9-12 overall record and advanced to the league playoffs for the first time in the last four years. "The players worked hard and adjusted to the level of competition," said coach Jim Gray. Victories over North Douglas and Glendale near the end of the regular season boosted the Pirates into the last playoff position. A loss at Oakland in a hard fought game officially ended their season. Senior David Anderson led the team in scoring with a 14 point effort. Junior Zack Beck added 11 points per game from his point guard position. Sophomore Kyle Evens led the team in rebounding with an average of 12 boards per game to go along with 8 points. "I really think we will be a team to contend with in the near future", said Coach Gray. "Pacific returns four very talented players and will be helped by the success of the junior varsity as well. Coaches Watjen and Creighton did a very good job."

Computer Club Leaves Their Mark At S.W.O.C.C. and O.I.T.

The Computer Club is continuing to be one of the most successful groups at Pacific. The club consists of Programming and Robotics classes I, II, and III, taught by Paul Young, and which include President, David Pritchard; Vice President, Amy Waterman; Secretary, Brandy LaPlante; and Treasurer, Chris Sabin. While P&R I and II work mostly on assigned projects, P&R III students are able to design and construct their own senior project, a project that will take the entire year to create.

One of the most interesting and complex projects that has evolved from this curriculum is Jeremiah Cassel's G.R.I.P. system. (G.R.I.P. stands for **Graphic Rotating Image Plotter.**) With Josh Stevens assisting with the programming and Paul Hewitt building the base, Jeremiah was able to put together a robot which could interact with its environment.

The club did very well at the annual skills day contest at S.W.O.C.C. This year, unlike in the past, Pacific actually had some competition, since Bandon had bought a professionally designed robot and programmed it to pop balloons. It didn't impress the judges that much though, as Jeremiah's G.R.I.P. system took first place. The Silver Bullet project, which was a joint effort among P&R II students Chris Sabin, Brandy LaPlante, Paul Hewitt, and Darren Hodge came in second, and Amy Waterman's promotional video tied with Bandon's robot for third place.

Later in the year, Jeremiah, Josh, and Paul Garratt took the G.R.I.P. project to the regional robotics contest at O.I.T. in Klamath Falls, where they spent the weekend. The project took second place, a very impressive standing considering that they were competing against much larger schools with bigger budgets and many companies donating time and parts to their cause. Judging from these performances, the computer club will undoubtedly be a continued success in the future.

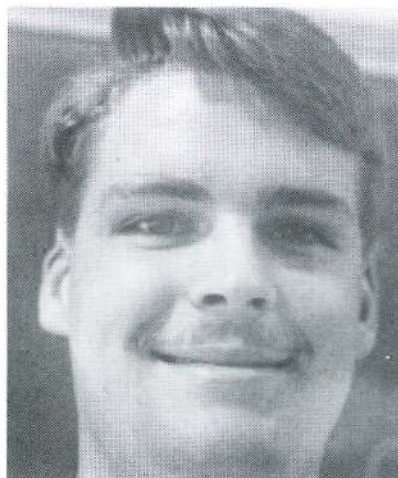

Annual Has Positive Year

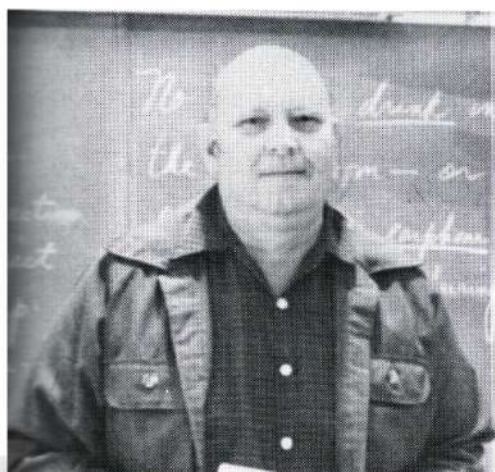

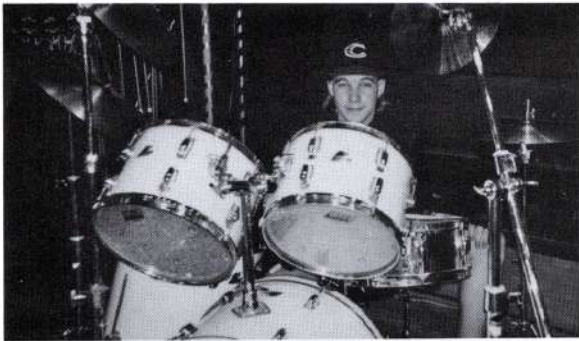

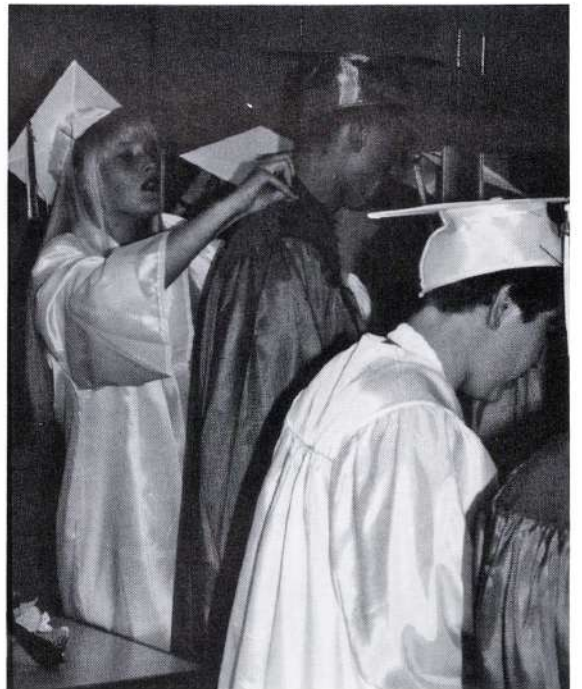
Seniors of 1993 held their commencement on Friday, June 4 in the gym.

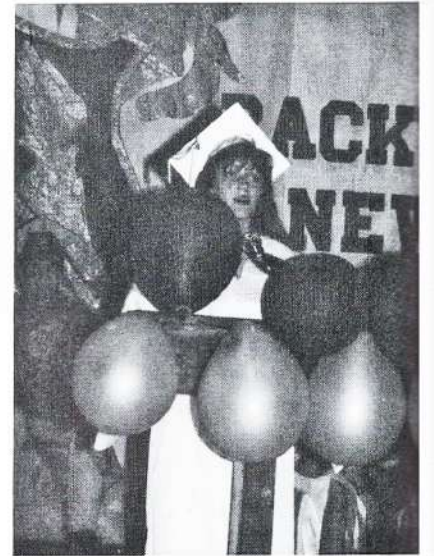
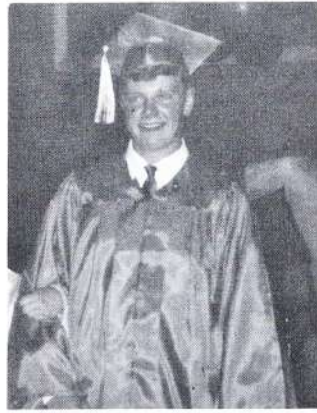
