Valedictorian, Margret McGowan, maintained a perfect 4.00 grade point average. Daniel House has a 3.97 GPA and is this year's salutatorian.

Margret McGowan is the National Honor Society president and vice president of the senior class. She has earned a Certificate of Initial Mastery, numerous awards for academic excellence, Student-of-the-Year in English and the University of Rochester Humanities and Social Science Award. Margret lettered three years in varsity cross country, one year in basketball, and four years in Track and field where she competed in hurdles and running events. Margret participates in band and received the 2004 John Phillip Sousa Award. She has donated more than 400 community service hours during high school to such activities as Port Orford's Summer Arts and Recreation Program, North Curry Family and Children's Center theater productions, Port Orford Senior Center, Port Orford Arts Council, and the Zion Lutheran Church. She also did tech-

technical work for two local theater productions. Margret earned two President's Student Service Gold Awards. She has also been a counselor in the Curry Prevention Services Mentoring Program, and has worked as a firefighter for Coos Forest Protection Association. She plans to attend Oregon State University and study general engineering.

Daniel House's leadership roles have included Student Body president, being a member of NHS, and team captain for soccer and basketball teams. He was selected as a Wendy's High School Heisman State Finalist, a Rotary Student-of-the-Month, and earned the distinction of Scholar-Athlete in the Big Fir League four consecutive years. Daniel was awarded the President's Student Service Gold Award twice for completing 100 community service hours in a one-year period. Daniel was named to the Big Fir League's Basketball all-defensive team, as well as earning honorable mention all-league in both sports for the present school year. He has worked as a computer technician and served as a systems operator for the school's computer systems. He volunteers as a mentor for an elementary student, and runs the sound system for Langlois Community Church. Daniel has volunteered as a coach for the third- and fourth-grade soccer team for Caple Blanco Soccer Club. Daniel will attend college at Western Baptist University, majoring in business administration.

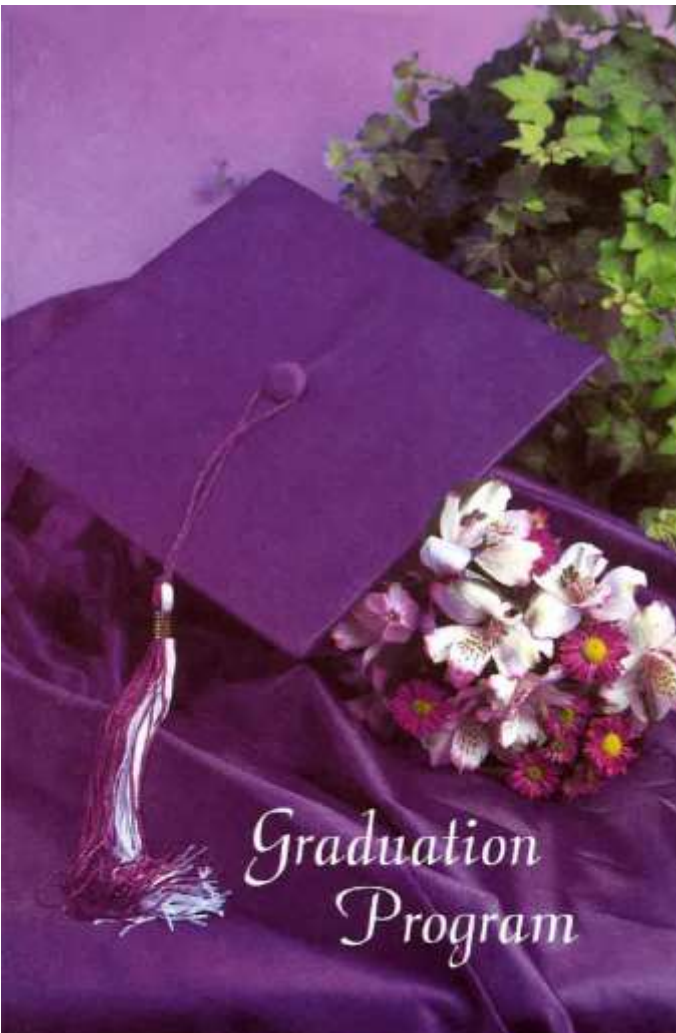

Jamboree provides chance to test skills

The Marshfield boys and girls soccer teams enjoyed their jamboree Saturday with each team capturing two wins apiece at Pete Susick Stadium and Golden Field.

In the opening match between Marshfield and Coquille's girls teams, the Pirates cruised to a 7-1 win, while the boys nabbed a 4-1 win over Pacific. In the last games of the jamboree, the Marshfield squads downed Brookings-Harbor. The girls broke out of a 1-1 halftime tie to ice a 3-1 win with two goals in the second half, while Marshfield's boys reeled out a 3-2 win over the Bruins.

Senior Camella Fosternes had the golden foot of the day, netting eight goals in the two games.

"Our defense did well and the forwards did a great job feeding Camella the ball and she worked the ball up field well," Marshfield girls coach Marc Rost said.

Stacked with 11 seniors, the Pirate boys are "much improved" from last season, said coach Pedro Casas.

"They have improved a lot from last year," Casas said. "I think we finally understand communication and did pretty good on passing. We were controlling the rhythm of

the game by changing speeds of the play."

Nick McKelvey booted three goals, while teammate Scott Woodman added two for Marshfield.

The Bruin teams each finished with one win and one loss, while the Coquille girls and Pacific boys squads were blanked with 0-2 records.

Brookings-Harbor's girls wracked up four goals against Coquille and the boys collected a 2-0 win over Pacific.

"We have graduated so many in the last two years that the seniors (Brittany Wales, Kodi Howard and Debra Hirjak) really didn't get playing time until last year, so we are pretty young and inexperienced," Bruin girls coach Jacque Thom said. "We are trying to get into positions and get the girls to understand how to play them in game situations. They have a lot of heart and they are scrappers."

All of the teams participating stressed the significance in getting actual playing time under their belts.

"We enjoyed participating and it was a good chance for us to get started," Pacific coach Tom Swenson said. "We needed to get a competitive match in before league starts Thursday."

"We played hard with a lot of heart and didn't give up even when we were having limited success with what we

were trying to do and you have to credit the kids for that."

The Coquille girls team, missing a number of players who were out of town for the holiday weekend, felt the pinch of limited numbers, playing with just 10 players at one point against Marshfield in the opener.

Swenson, junior Autumn Anderson and freshmen Lacy Weinblatt and Kelsey McKenzie are just some of the guys when they slip into their Pacific High School uniforms and step onto the soccer field.

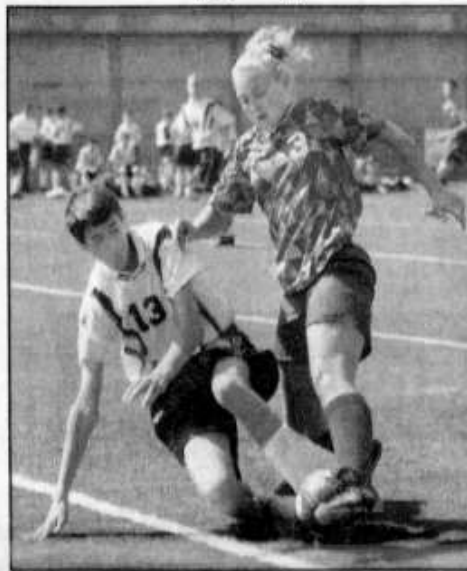
Not having enough girls interested in playing soccer has left Pacific without a girls program and coach Tom Swenson is not about to deny an avid player the opportunity to play the sport she loves.

"I have always welcomed the girls and they have always been willing to live with the difficulties (difference in size, speed and strength) of the sport and give it their best," Swenson said.

For Hannah, it is more than just being a girl playing on a boys team: It is a family affair. For the outgoing 17-year-old, who aspires for a career as an emergency medical technician, soccer is something that has been a part of her life for as long as she can remember. The earliest exposure to the sport came at the tender age of 2 by following her dad, Tom, around to the practices and games of the teams he coached. Brother Caleb Swenson is the team's assistant coach and younger brothers, Peter and John Swenson, serve as the team's ball-boys.

"Dad is fun to play for and when we come home we talk about the games and I like being able to do that," Hannah said. "They (Dad and Caleb) are always really truthful with me when they tell me the things I need to work on and I appreciate that because it helps me be a better player."

Weinblatt, who specializes in defense, agrees that playing

Girls show aggressive style while playing on team with boys

"I have to work just as hard as the guys and maybe even a little harder to show that I am as tough as they are," Weinblatt said. "Sometimes players on other teams see a girl out there and are afraid they will hurt us, but once I get in there and play physical with them they see we don't mess around."

McKenzie echoes her female teammate's sentiments.

"You can't be a wimp," she said. "If you get knocked down you have to get back up and keep going. It's really physical and I like that."

Senior Shawn Novotny, who has played all four years, says the guys on the team like having the girls as teammates and says sometimes there is a little good-spirited fun because of the unique situation.

"I think it's fun because they work just as hard as the guys do," Novotny said. "We've been known to have some of the girls be more aggressive than some of the guys. We kind of tease the guys in fun when one of the girls beats them."

He is glad to see the girls get the opportunity to play.

"I think it's good that they allow the girls to play since we don't have a girls team," Novotny said.

The boys may have the advantage when it comes to overall body size, strength and speed, but the girls provide the mental determination that binds the team together.

"Some of the guys tend to argue and they (the girls) are the ones that straightens us out and keep the team together," Novotny said.

Coach Swenson, who through the years has coached both coed teams and teams with just boys, says the girls definitely add a different dynamic to a team by raising the standard for acceptable behavior by the male members of the team.

"Sometimes having the girls there is nice because the boys are a little more careful about what they have to say and I like that," Swenson said. "The social situation changes a little bit having the girls there, but I've never seen any animosity between the players over the issue."

Other teams have a harder time adjusting to playing against girls though because of the way they have been socialized.

"Some of the guys on other teams have a hard time," Novotny said. "The girls played tougher than they thought and after the games some of the guys have said they were intimidated by how aggressive the girls really are."

Like any experienced player, Hannah has come to appreciate the finesse of the game,

having learned that it is not always about strength and speed.

"Playing against the guys teaches you to be an aggressive player that is creative in using the skills you have," she said.

Are there disadvantages of playing on a coed team? No, according to the players on Pacific's team, but some accommodations have to be made such as trying to find shower facilities for the girls and making sure everyone is geared up before getting on the bus, replacing the old practice of changing during the bus ride to away games.

"On a funny note we are not allowed to change on the bus anymore," Novotny laughed.

Hannah cites "always having to wait outside the locker room," as a challenge.

For coach Swenson it really is not an issue.

"There are things that come up but it's really not a problem," he said.

The girls agree that the biggest advantage to playing with the guys is being motivated to push themselves beyond their comfort zones.

"Not being able to physically match up with (the boys) makes it a little tougher, but it's always nice to be challenged," Hannah said.

Weinblatt added, "It gives you the drive of having to do your best to earn a spot on the team."

Novotny, who plans to attend Southwestern Oregon Community College and pursue a certificate in welding and plans to try out for the Lakers' soccer team, said that playing with the girls does take a little bit to get used to for some players.

"There really aren't any hard parts (to having girls on the team)," he said. "Sometimes they are harder to get along with, but that is normal high school stuff. It can be different if you aren't used to it, but for me, it's been like that all four years that I've played."

Coach Swenson says the competition makes all of his players better.

"It's fun sometimes when the girls are hard chargers. The guys always enjoy seeing one of the girls beat one of the guys," he said.

But, as Hannah puts it, it really just boils down to being a part of a team, not the gender of the players.

"It's about the team," she said. "You are playing for 80 minutes and there are no breaks except for a 10-minute break at half-time. There aren't timeouts and you have to play as a team."

"You are out there on the field and you think as a team. You don't have a coach calling out plays ... you have to think for yourself and work with teammates to play the game."



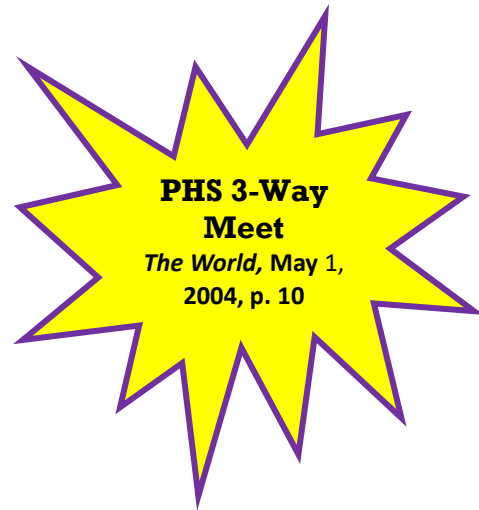
Nikki Smith of Bandon won the 100 and both hurdles races, while teammate Chelsea Pullen won both the 800 and 1,500.
