The 2010 track season was a great success. Along the way we crowned three state champions: Jesse Culley in the shot put, Charlie Jensen in the high jump and Greg Puhl in the 200. The boys' team were district champions. At the state meet, the boys brought home the 4th place trophy. Peter Swenson placed in three events (sixth in the javelin, fifth in the triple jump and fourth in the 300 hurdles); Puhl added another thirteen points on top of his state championship, finishing second in the 400 and 4th in the 100.
