Q. Why do you feel music is important to a student's well rounded education?

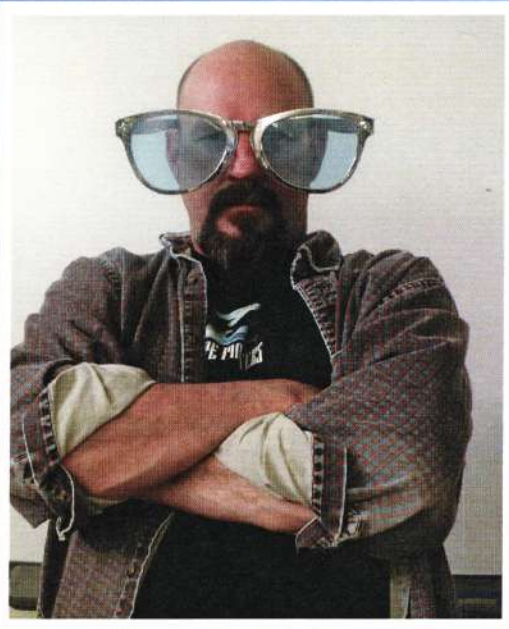
- Mozart effect! Students who have the arts do 25-30% better on standardized tests than those who don't. Music takes self discipline, self esteem, confidence, etc.

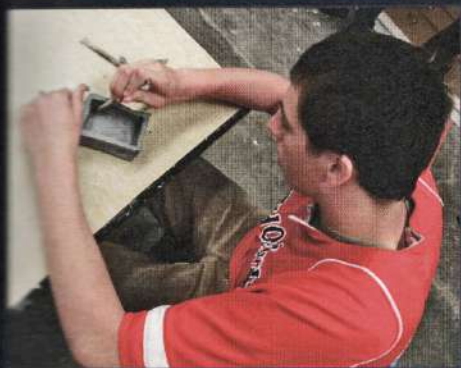
4. Why did you decide to go into teaching as a career?

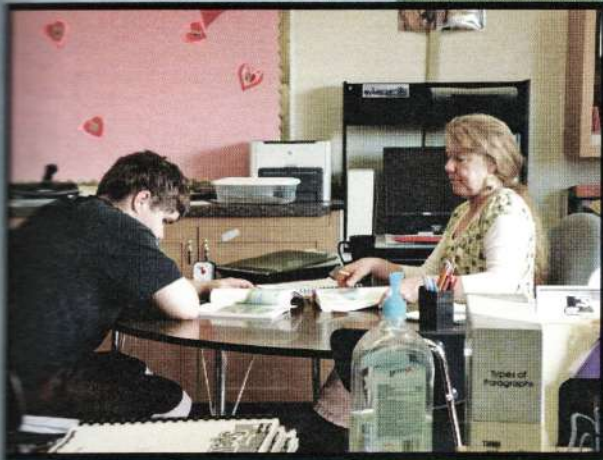
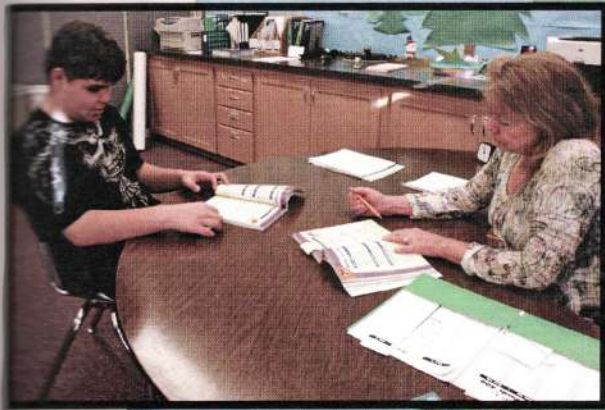
Q. What was your favorite part of this school year?

Q. Who is one of your idols/heroes/heroines?

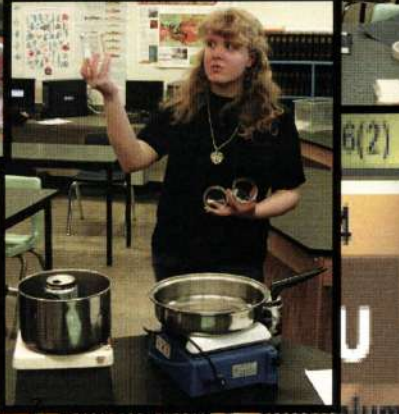

Q. Why did you decide to go into teaching as a career?

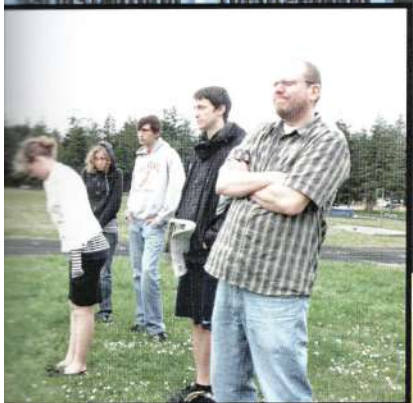

Q. If you could be any superhero, who or what would you be?

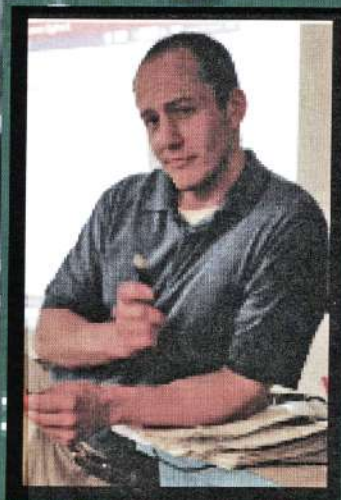

The influence you’ve had on this program will be there long into the future.

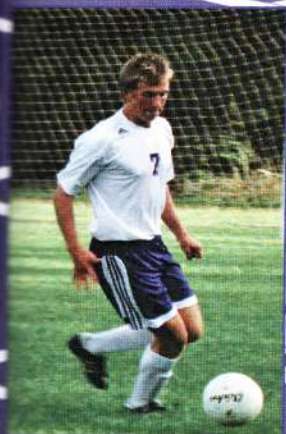
