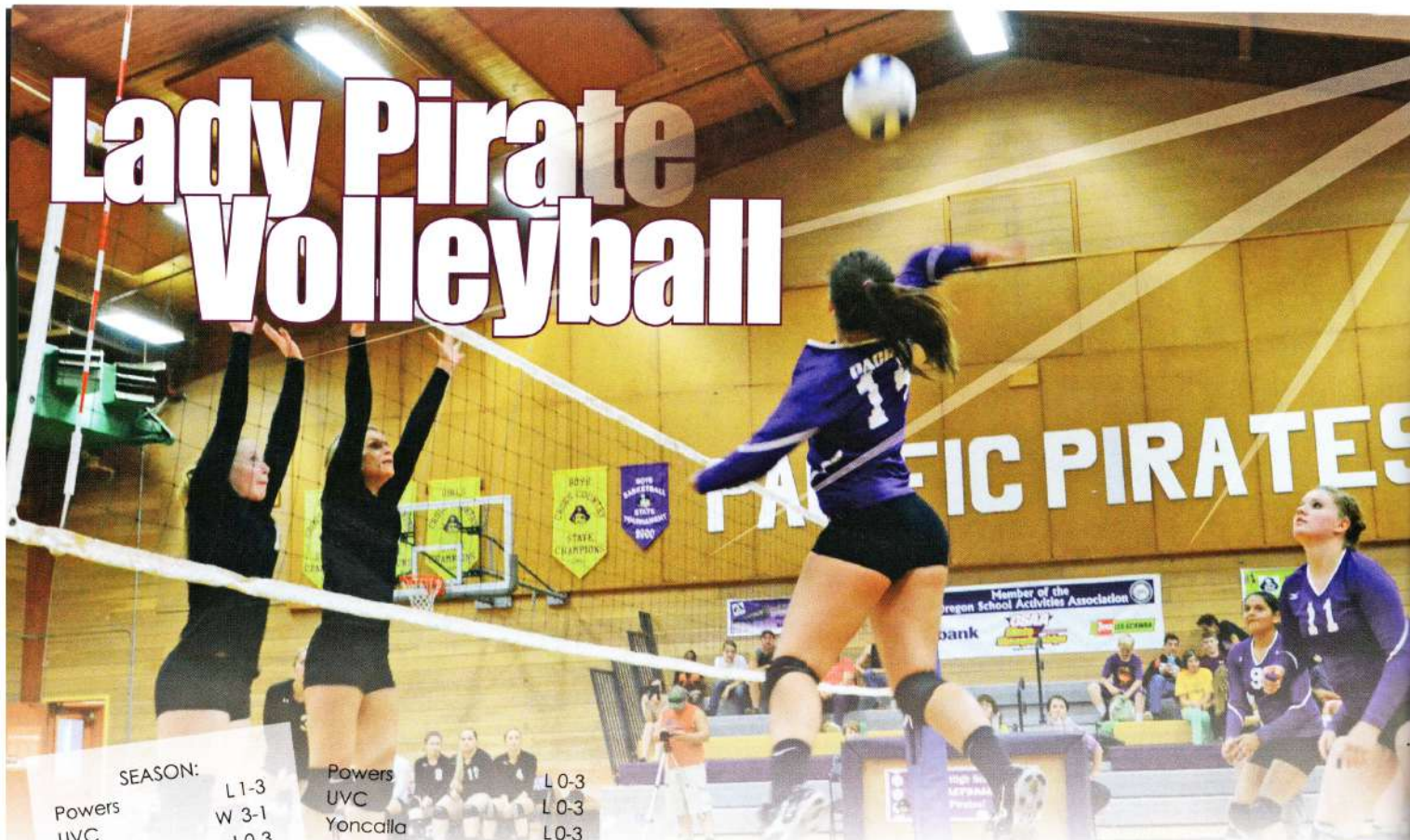
October 23rd 2014, the Pirates awoke from their cozy beds at a hotel in Eugene, Oregon, to eat breakfast and prepare for the meet ahead of them. The team boarded the bus and headed over to Lane Community College to run at the District 4 Championships. The Lady Pirates ran first; with the blow of the horn, they were off to run a vigorous 3.1 miles. Dune Fougérolles finished 18th with a time of 23.49 minutes, coming in first for the ladies. Brittany Kreutzer finished 26th coming in second, and Sarah Sax in 33rd,

taking the third place for Pacific. Before the 61 competitors lay a 3.1 mile course that would make it or break it. Pacific knew that this race was big for them, thus the Pirates had worked hard all season for the district meet. With big hopes of making it to State, the boys started the race with a bang. Without hesitation Angel Lopez, Acer Nye and Josh Engdahl made their way near the front of the pack. Throughout the first mile, the Pirates set strong paces knowing that they had to beat Crow and



Oakland. The boys gave every ounce of effort they had to knock off points. "I just tried to pass every guy in a red uniform that I could," says Cole Kreutzer to Coach Lemerande at the finish. When the boys completed the race they didn't know if they had made it to State or not—every minute that passed was another minute of nervous feelings. "It was a huge accomplishment; it is proof that hard work pays off," said Lopez.
