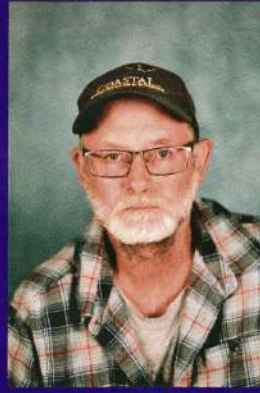

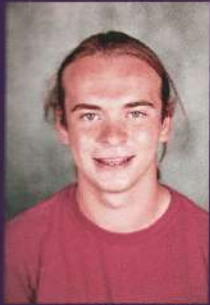

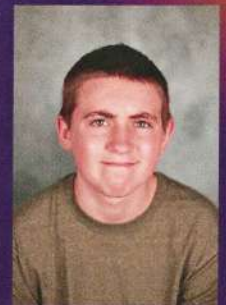
Eden Converse

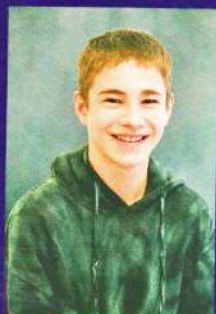
Jonah Lewis

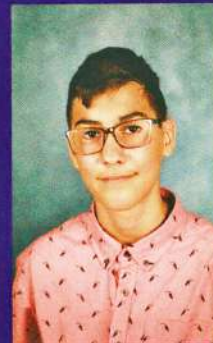
Qwentyn's favorite sports are football and track & field, and his favorite school memory was kicking off at the start of a football game. He plans to continue running and playing football.

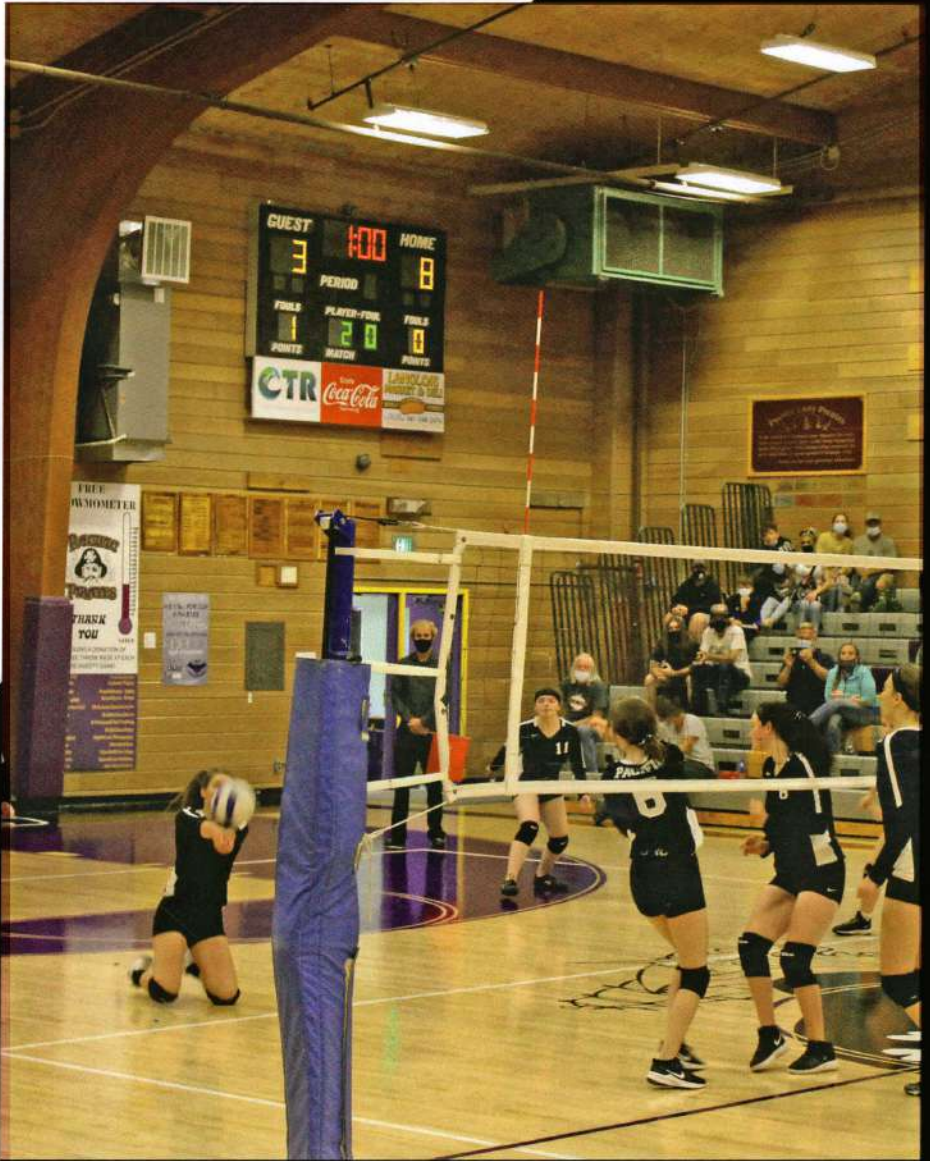

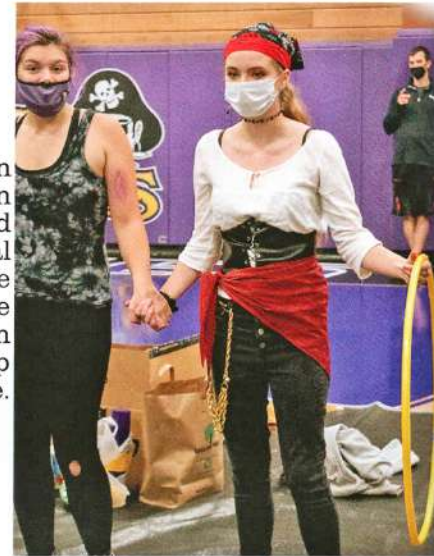

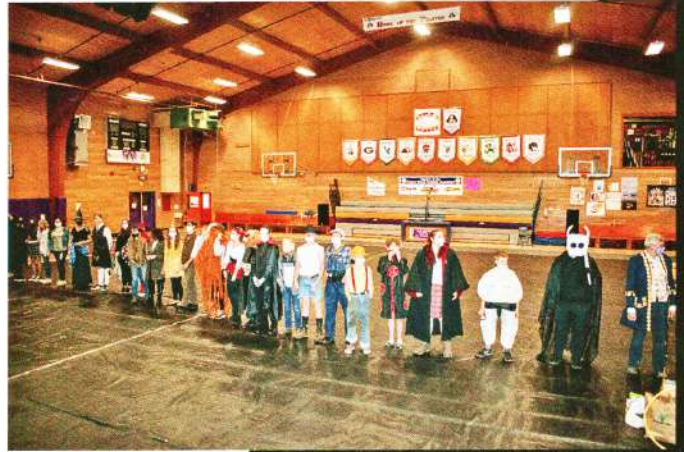

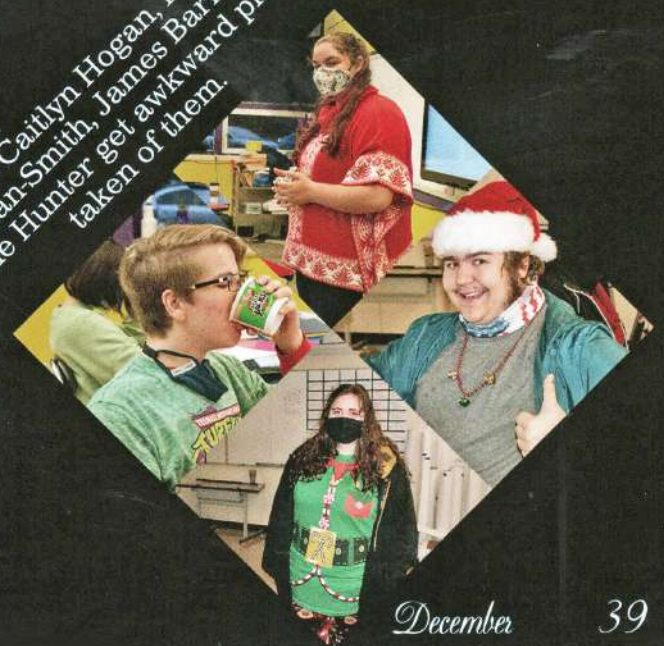

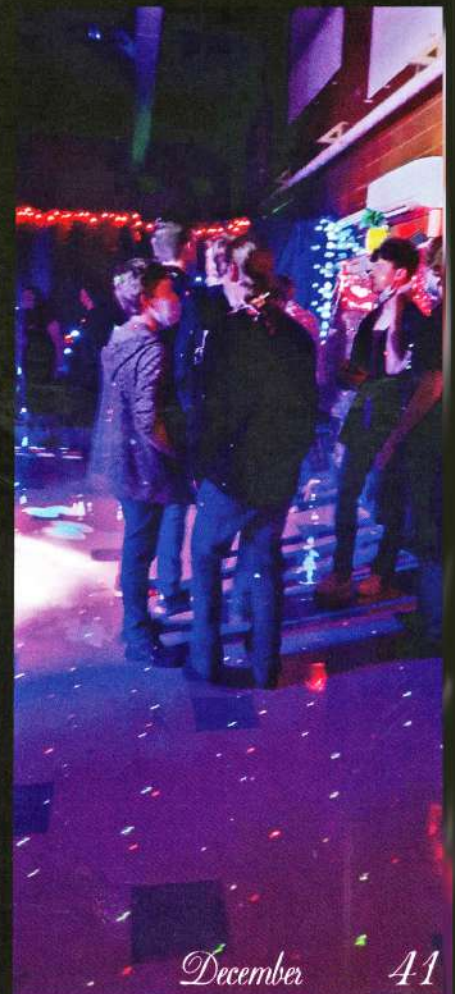

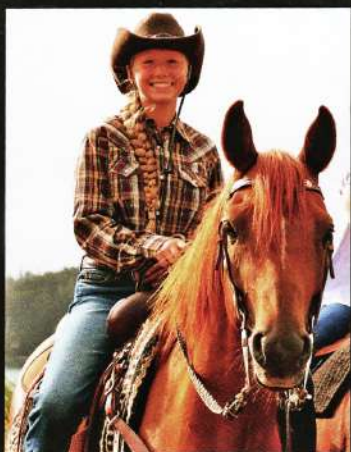
